## (DIGEST AS ENACTED)

Provides that, acknowledging the recommendations in the higher education ten-year roadmap, the legislature is encouraged by the student achievement council's efforts to meet the following goals in order to meet the societal and economic needs of the future: (1) All adults in Washington, ages twenty-five to forty-four, will have a high school diploma or equivalent by 2023; and

(2) At least seventy percent of adults in Washington, ages twenty-five to forty-four, will have a postsecondary credential by 2023.

VETO MESSAGE ON ESHB 2626

April 3, 2014

To the Honorable Speaker and Members, The House of Representatives of the State of Washington Ladies and Gentlemen:

I am returning herewith, without my approval as to Section 1, Engrossed Substitute House Bill No. 2626 entitled:

"AN ACT Relating to establishing statewide educational attainment goals."

With this legislation we are taking the important step of adopting post-secondary attainment goals for all Washingtonians.

Section 1 is an intent section that discusses the labor market and attainment statistics and is not necessary to interpret or implement the substantive provisions of the bill.

For these reasons I have vetoed Section 1 of Engrossed Substitute House Bill No. 2626.

With the exception of Section 1, Engrossed Substitute House Bill No. 2626 is approved.
