House Bills

HB 1657 by Representatives Stanford, Kirby, Clibborn, Pettigrew, Blake, Hurst, Parker, Morris, Takko, Liias, Springer, Kristiansen, Kochmar, MacEwen, Chandler, and Vick

Authorizing small consumer installment loans.

Establishes the small consumer installment loan act. Authorizes licensed longer term loans with a maximum authorized interest rate of thirty-six percent per year.

Provides that if any portion of the act is vetoed by the governor, the entire act is null and void.

HB 1658 by Representatives Kirby, Blake, Hurst, Rodne, and Clibborn

Raising the cap on the total number of small loans a borrower may have in a twelve-month period.

Changes the number of loans, from eight to twelve, that a borrower is allowed to receive.

HB 1659 by Representatives Sells, Manweller, Green, Condotta, and Moeller

Clarifying the employment status of independent contractors in the news business.

HB 1660 by Representatives Hansen, Cody, Clibborn, Green, Morrell, and Riccelli

Convening a work group to develop a standardized clinical affiliation agreement for clinical placements for physicians and nurses.

Requires the department of health to convene a work group to study and recommend language for standardized clinical affiliation agreements for clinical placements associated with the education and training of physicians, osteopathic physicians and surgeons, and nurses.

Expires July 1, 2015.

HB 1661 by Representatives Fitzgibbon, Condotta, Roberts, Jinkins, Green, Upthegrove, Walsh, Moscoso, Tharinger, Cody, Kagi, Hunt, Appleton, Ryu, Lytton, Farrell, Pollet, Van De Wege, Ormsby, Liias, and Reykdal

Addressing misdemeanor marijuana offense convictions.

Authorizes a person convicted of a misdemeanor marijuana offense to apply to the sentencing court for a vacation of the applicant's record of conviction for the offense.

Requires the court to vacate the record of conviction.

HB 1662 by Representatives Appleton, Goodman, Hunt, Sawyer, Pollet, Tharinger, Farrell, Freeman, Reykdal, Fitzgibbon, Ryu, Riccelli, Roberts, Jinkins, and Moeller

Concerning the medical use of cannabis.

Modifies the medical use of cannabis act.

Provides that licensed access points, licensed producers, and licensed processors, who are in compliance with the act, are not subject to penalties.

HB 1663 by Representatives Tharinger, Nealey, Van De Wege, Johnson, Takko, Blake, Haigh, and Kretz

Extending the sales and use tax exemption for hog fuel used to produce electricity, steam, heat, or biofuel.

Delays, until June 30, 2024, the expiration of the sales and use tax exemption for hog fuel used to produce electricity, steam, heat, or biofuel.

Requires taxpayers claiming the exemption to file a complete annual survey with the department of revenue.

HB 1664 by Representatives Liias, Hope, Santos, Maxwell, Clibborn, and Green

Clarifying the authority of a nurse working in a school setting.

Reaffirms the authority of a licensed nurse working in a school setting to practice nursing without the supervision of a person who is not a licensed nurse.

Authorizes a registered nurse or an advanced registered nurse practitioner to supervise, direct, or evaluate a licensed nurse working in a school setting.

HB 1665 by Representatives Hunt, Pollet, Appleton, Sells, Moscoso, Reykdal, and Cody

Allows retirement benefits at earlier ages in plans 2 and 3 of the public employees' retirement system, the teachers' retirement system, and the school employees' retirement system.

HB 1666 by Representatives Reykdal, Appleton, Hunt,

Providing for vesting after five years of service in the defined benefit portion of the public employees' retirement system, the school employees' retirement system, and the teachers' retirement system plan 3.

Provides for vesting after five years of service in the defined benefit portion of the public employees' retirement system, the school employees' retirement system, and the teachers' retirement system plan 3.

HB 1668 by Representatives Cody, Reykdal, Hunt, Moscoso, Sells, Pollet, Wylie, Morrell, Appleton, and Dunshee

Allowing certain separated plan 2 members of the retirement systems to participate in insurance plans and contracts.

Allows participation in insurance plans and contracts by certain separated plan 2 members of the retirement systems.

HB 1669 by Representatives Pollet, Haler, Cody, Tarleton, Johnson, Seaquist, Farrell, Magendanz, and Riccelli

Concerning self-supporting, fee-based programs at fouryear institutions of higher education.

Requires the governing boards of the state and regional universities and The Evergreen State College, when a decision is made to establish a new self-supporting, fee-based degree program or change a degree program that is supported by state funding to a program that is supporting and fee-based, to notify enrolled and prospective students and undergraduate and graduate student government associations at least six months before implementation with an estimate of tuition and fees.

HB 1670 by Representatives Farrell and Pollet

Clarifying the use of automated traffic safety cameras at intersections with two or more arterial highways.

Allows the use of automated traffic safety cameras at certain intersections of only two or more arterials.

Concerning child care reform.

Establishes an early achievers program for supporting and rewarding child care providers for providing highquality child care.

Requires the department of early learning to provide a ten percent increase in the working connections child care subsidy rate to those providers who accept children eligible for the subsidy.

Requires the department of early learning and the department of social and health services to convene a parent and provider oversight board.

Establishes a legislative task force on child care improvements for the future.

Allows all licensed and certified child care programs to enroll in the early achievers program.

HB 1672 by Representative Condotta

Addressing determinations of prevailing wage rates on public works projects.

Requires the department of labor and industries and the industrial statistician to provide improved transparency so that determinations regarding the correct prevailing wage for specific types of construction work are made available to employers and their employees.

HB 1673 by Representatives Liias, Sells, Appleton, Maxwell, Morrell, Lytton, Pollet, Hunt, McCoy, Seaguist, and Santos

Enhancing the basic education allocation formula to adopt the staffing resources recommended by the quality education council.

Declares an intent to: (1) Establish a vision for what defines a fully implemented prototypical school model for the 2018-2019 school year; and

(2) Achieve this vision through annual incremental improvements in staffing levels, with a priority on staffing schools with a high level of poverty students first.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Education.

HB 1674 by Representatives Santos and Morris

Increasing the regulatory oversight and accountability of the office of minority and women's business enterprises.

Addresses prohibited activities, penalties, compliance, and remedies with regard to the office of minority and women's business enterprises.

Establishes an investigation unit within the office of minority and women's business enterprises for the purpose of detecting and investigating fraud and violations.

Directs certain civil penalties to be deposited in the minority and women's business enterprises account.

HB 1675 by Representatives Roberts, Orwall, Goodman, Kirby, Jinkins, Pedersen, Farrell, Kagi, and

Freeman

Improving the adoption process.

Revises the definition of "individual approved by the court" and "qualified salaried court employee" for purposes of chapter 26.33 RCW (adoption).

Changes requirements of the preplacement and postplacement reports to include an investigation of disciplinary and punishment philosophies and practices of the person requesting the report.

Requires the secretary of the department of social and health services to establish procedures and requirements for identifying, tracking, and reporting adoption disruption and dissolution, including requiring regular reports from childplacing agencies relating to children placed for adoption.

HB 1676 by Representatives Kagi, Jinkins, Cody, Pedersen, Roberts, Freeman, Fitzgibbon, Hunt, Orwall, and Appleton

Encouraging safe storage of firearms.

Includes in the crime of reckless endangerment, a person who stores or leaves a loaded firearm in a location where a child is likely to gain access, and the child obtains possession of the loaded firearm.

Requires a dealer, when selling a firearm, to offer to sell or give the purchaser a locked box, a lock, or a device that prevents the firearm from discharging.

Requires certain stores, shops, and sales outlets where firearms are sold, to post a warning sign to inform patrons of the requirements on storing and securing loaded firearms.

HB 1677 by Representatives Klippert, Morrell, Hope, Cody, Nealey, Walsh, and Fagan

Concerning operators of multiple adult family homes.

Requires the department of social and health services to accept applications for licensure of additional adult family homes when less than twelve months have passed since the previous adult family home license.

HB 1678 by Representatives Klippert, Blake, Hayes, Takko, Holy, Hope, and Ross

Concerning peace officer liability.

Provides immunity from liability for certain peace officers with regard to the use of a less lethal weapon.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Judiciary.

HB 1679 by Representatives Cody and Jinkins

Regarding the disclosure of health care information.

Addresses the disclosure of health care information relating to mental health, sexually transmitted diseases, and sexually transmitted infections.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Health Care & Wellness.

HB 1680 by Representative Santos

Implementing strategies to close the educational opportunity gap, based on the recommendations of the educational opportunity gap oversight and accountability committee.

Adopts policies and programs to implement recommendations of the educational opportunity gap oversight and accountability committee relating to: (1) Disproportionality in student discipline;

- (2) Educator cultural competence;
- (3) Instructing English language learners;
- (4) English language learner accountability;
- (5) Disaggregated student data; and
- (6) Recruitment and retention of educators.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Education.

HB 1681 by Representatives Taylor, Shea, Overstreet, and Short

Concerning criminal trespass on private property.

Eliminates special immunities from prosecution for trespass, whether those immunities have been legislatively granted to the government or to private persons or entities.

Declares that it is not the intent of the legislature to change the elements of the crime of trespass, but only to make all persons subject to the same law with exceptions from uniform application of that law only for the kinds of entries onto property by law enforcement officers that are lawful as of the effective date of the act and those entries onto property by government personnel that are specified in the act.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Government Operations & Elections.

HB 1682 by Representative Fitzgibbon

Incentivizing up-front environmental planning, review, and infrastructure construction actions of local governments.

Authorizes a local government to: (1) Recover its reasonable expenses of preparation of a nonproject environmental impact statement, prepared under RCW 43.21C.229 regarding infill development and under RCW 43.21C.440 regarding planned actions, through access to financial assistance, with funding from private sources, and by the assessment of certain fees; and

(2) Assess a fee upon subsequent development.

Addresses requirements for contracts with owners of real estate for water or sewer facilities and reimbursement of costs by subsequent users.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Local Government.

HB 1683 by Representatives Reykdal and Haler

Authorizing recognition of institutions of postsecondary study in order to retain federal financial aid eligibility.

Recognizes that recent federal changes in federal regulations require the adjustment of definitions of certain postsecondary institutions to ensure that those schools that currently meet the requirements are eligible for student financial aid programs provided by the federal government.

Recognizes schools as institutions of postsecondary study.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Higher Education.

HB 1684 by Representatives Reykdal, Manweller, and Sells

Defining suitable work to include a minimum age requirement.

Revises the definition of "suitable work," for purposes of chapter 50.20 RCW (unemployment compensation-benefits and claims), to include a minimum age requirement.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Labor & Workforce Development.

HB 1685 by Representatives Wilcox, Blake, and Chandler

Utilizing a portion of public utility tax collected for water distribution to fund the health programs of the departments of ecology and health.

Requires ten percent of the public utility taxes collected from water distribution businesses to be deposited into the water rights processing account and ten percent to be deposited into the safe drinking water account.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Appropriations.

HB 1686 by Representatives Seaquist, Haler, Roberts, Zeiger, Reykdal, Springer, Pettigrew, Pollet, Dahlquist, McCoy, Maxwell, and Fagan; by request of State Board for Community and Technical Colleges

Concerning high school equivalency certificates.

Replaces general equivalency degrees and general educational development tests with high school equivalency certificates and tests.

Establishes a high school equivalency certificate which is a certificate issued jointly by the state board for community and technical colleges and the office of the superintendent of public instruction that indicates that the holder has attained standard scores at or above the minimum proficiency level prescribed by the state board on a high school equivalency test.

HB 1687 by Representatives Ormsby, Haler, Sullivan, Parker, Pettigrew, and Liias

Concerning the taxing authority of public facilities districts.

Changes the time in which the sales and use tax for regional centers expires.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Finance.

HB 1688 by Representatives Stonier, Pike, Santos, Hayes, Orwall, Bergquist, and McCoy

Establishing a requirement and system for reporting incidents of student restraint and isolation in public schools.

Requires public school personnel to report incidents of student restraint and isolation and establishes a system for making and maintaining the reports.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Education.

HB 1689 by Representatives Appleton and Cody

Creating a silver alert system.

Requires the Washington state patrol to develop and implement a plan, commonly known as a silver alert plan, to enhance the public's ability to assist in recovering senior citizens with a diagnosis of Alzheimer's disease, dementia, or other mental disability.

HB 1690 by Representative Orcutt

Permitting entities to qualify for cost recovery incentives from solar energy systems located on real property of the entity's controlling owner.

Ållows entities to qualify for cost recovery incentives from certain solar energy systems.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Finance.

HB 1691 by Representatives Haigh and Maxwell

Authorizing the educational service district board or local school board to fill vacancies on the board of directors in second-class school districts with an at-large appointment if after one hundred twenty days a candidate from the director district cannot be recruited.

Modifies provisions relating to filling vacancies on the board of directors of second-class school districts.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Education.

HB 1692 by Representatives Sullivan, Pettigrew, and Maxwell

Implementing career and college ready graduation requirements.

Authorizes, and provides sufficient resources for, implementation of the opportunity for: (1) Students to complete twenty-four credits for graduation through a comprehensive approach that includes increased instructional hours;

- (2) Expansion of the learning assistance program and transitional bilingual instructional programs; and
- (3) Resources to support additional family engagement and counseling.

HB 1693 by Representatives Habib, Magendanz, Morris, and Tarleton

Providing tax relief for new businesses in high growth business sectors.

Authorizes certain new businesses to deduct up to two million dollars of business and occupation taxes in each calendar year.

Senate Bills

SB 5589 by Senators Mullet, Kline, Eide, McAuliffe, Kohl-Welles, Frockt, Keiser, Shin, and Chase

Providing for a simple majority of voters voting to authorize school district bonds.

Allows a simple majority of voters voting to authorize school district bonds.

Takes effect if the proposed amendment to Article VII, section 2 and Article VIII, section 6 of the state Constitution, relating to providing for a simple majority of voters voting to authorize school district bonds, is approved by the voters at the next general election and certified by the secretary of state.

SB 5590 by Senators Eide, King, and Shin; by request of Department of Licensing

Modifying requirements for the operation of commercial motor vehicles in compliance with federal regulations.

Changes certain requirements for the operation of commercial motor vehicles in order to comply with federal regulations.

SB 5591 by Senators Eide, King, and Shin; by request of Department of Licensing

Concerning confidential license plates, drivers' licenses, identicards, and vessel registrations.

Addresses the department of licensing's processes for issuing and allowing access to information about confidential license plates, drivers' licenses, identicards, and vessel registrations.

SB 5592 by Senators Schlicher, King, Rolfes, Hobbs, and Fide

Modifying the use of certain toll bridge revenue.

Modifies certain toll bridge revenue use requirements.

SB 5593 by Senators Smith and Parlette

Concerning filing requirements for property tax exemption claims for certain improvements to benefit fish and wildlife habitat, water quality, or water quantity.

Revises the filing requirements for property tax exemption claims for certain improvements to benefit fish and wildlife habitat, water quality, and water quantity.

SB 5594 by Senators Harper, Conway, Keiser, Nelson, Kohl-Welles, Hasegawa, Kline, Frockt, Shin, and Chase

Provides minimum requirements for sick and safe leave from employment.

SB 5597 by Senators Conway, Hasegawa, King, and Holmquist Newbry

Concerning locksmith services.

Implements regulations for individuals engaged in locksmith services and how they represent themselves in local telephone directories.

Feb 5 First reading, referred to Commerce & Labor.

SB 5598 by Senators Mullet, Litzow, McAuliffe, Fain, Kohl-Welles, Shin, Nelson, Chase, and Frockt; by request of Washington State Housing Finance Commission

Concerning the disposition of surplus property for the development of affordable housing.

Authorizes port commissions, regional transit authorities, the department of social and health services, the department of corrections, the department of enterprise services, the parks and recreation commission, the department of natural resources, and the department of transportation to sell, lease, or exchange real property for less than fair market value to certain eligible organizations, or create beneficial sales terms, if the affordable housing to be developed on the property is to be occupied primarily by extremely low-income, very low-income, federally qualified low-income, or low-income households.

Authorizes local governments to sell surplus property at a discount for affordable housing if the affordable housing complies with certain guidelines.

SB 5600 by Senators Hargrove, Darneille, Kohl-Welles, Hasegawa, Kline, McAuliffe, Frockt, Harper, Billig, and Shin

Revises the definition of "work activity" for purposes of the WorkFirst program.

SB 5601 by Senators Becker, Cleveland, Dammeier, and

Schlicher

Concerning interpretation of state law regarding rebating practices by health care entities.

Adds language to chapter 19.68 RCW (rebating by practitioners of healing professions) to ensure that it is interpreted in a manner consistent with the federal antikickback statute, except with respect to arrangements involving an entity which principally operates as a clinical laboratory.

SB 5602 by Senators Bailey, Keiser, Kohl-Welles, Schlicher, and Kline

Creating a silver alert system.
