HB 1307-S by House Committee on Judiciary (originally sponsored by Representatives Goodman, Lytton, Wylie, Jinkins, Cody, Roberts, Santos, and Moscoso)

Concerning sexual assault protection orders.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Modifies procedures governing sexual assault protection orders including permissible methods of service, the issuance and renewal of ex parte orders, and the modification or termination of orders.

Increasing the capacity of school districts to recognize and respond to troubled youth.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction to convene a temporary task force to identify best practices, model programs, and successful strategies for school districts to form partnerships with qualified health, mental health, and social services agencies in the community to coordinate and improve support for youth in need.

Modifying stalking and harassment protection order provisions.

#### (DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Establishes the stalking protection order act.

Creates a stalking protection order as a remedy for victims who do not qualify for a domestic violence order of protection.

Requires the administrative office of the courts to develop a single master petition pattern form for all antiharassment and stalking protection orders issued under the act.

Requests the state supreme court gender and justice commission to consider other potential solutions to reduce confusion about which type of protection order a petitioner should seek. -- 2013 REGULAR SESSION --

Concerning fire suppression water facilities and services provided by municipal and other water purveyors.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Determines appropriate methods of organizing public services and the authority of water purveyors with respect to critical public services.

Clarifies the authority of water purveyors to provide fire suppression water facilities and services and to recover the costs for those facilities and services.

Provides liability protections appropriate for water purveyors engaged in this vital public service.

Addresses current funding levels that limit the department of social and health services' ability to promote vulnerable adult protections in the residential services and supports program.

Requires applicants to pay a certification fee before the issuance of initial certification for the residential services and supports program.

Specifies that, when conducting an investigation of alleged abuse or neglect of a child, it is generally preferable that forensic interviews take place at children's advocacy centers when access to a center is reasonably available.

Imposes, increases, and/or changes certain fuel tax rates and fees to increase revenue for the state's transportation system.

Creates the state transportation storm water pollution and fish passage barrier account, the transportation improvement board storm water pollution account, the county road administration board storm water pollution account, the department of ecology storm water pollution

account, the maintenance, operations, and preservation account, and the connecting Washington account.

Adopts additive transportation funding and appropriates from several accounts and funds named to designated state agencies and offices for employee compensation and other expenses, for capital projects, and for other specified purposes for the period ending June 30, 2015.

Provides a contingent effective date.

HB 1956 by Representatives Clibborn, Ryu, Liias, Moscoso, and Fey

Authorizing bonds for transportation funding.

Requires the state finance committee, upon the request of the department of transportation, to supervise and provide for the issuance, sale, and retirement of 3.2 billion dollars of general obligation bonds in order to provide funds necessary for the location, design, right-of-way, and construction of selected projects or improvements that are identified as 2013 connecting Washington projects or improvements in the omnibus transportation appropriations act.

#### HB 1957 by Representatives Clibborn, Liias, Moscoso, and Fey

Concerning department of transportation project delivery.

Provides that the legislature intends the department of transportation to deliver the projects and activities listed in LEAP Transportation Document 2013-1, as developed March 2013, as funded by new transportation revenues provided in House Bill 1954.

Affirming centralized payroll services as nontaxable between affiliated companies.

Provides that business and occupation tax provisions do not apply to gross proceeds that a qualified employer of record engaged in providing paymaster services derived from amounts received from an affiliated business entity to advance or reimburse employee costs of a qualified employee.

Concerning local transportation revenue.

Declares an intent: (1) To provide diversified local revenue options that may be tailored to the needs of each jurisdiction, in addition to any increases in funding provided through already existing partnerships between the state and local communities, such as motor vehicle fuel taxes; and

(2) That local governments provide countywide transportation planning and coordinate with other municipalities, transit systems, transportation benefit districts, planning organizations, and other transportation agencies.

HB 1960 by Representative Seaquist

Establishing benefit assessment charges for metropolitan park districts.

Authorizes the governing board of a metropolitan park district to fix and impose a benefit charge on certain real property that is located within the district.

Concerning discounted discover passes for disabled veterans.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Sets the cost of a discover pass at five dollars for a person who has been provided with a lifetime veterans disability pass from the state parks and recreation commission.

Providing proof of financial responsibility for motor vehicle operation. (REVISED FOR ENGROSSED: Concerning proof of required documents for motor vehicle operation.) (AS OF SENATE 2ND READING 2/20/13)

Allows a driver to provide proof of financial security and his or her registration certificate in either paper or electronic format.

Requires a law enforcement officer, when a person uses a portable electronic device to display proof of financial security, to view only the proof of financial security and no other content on the portable electronic device.

Authorizes an insurance company to provide proof of insurance cards in either paper or electronic format.

Gives the department of commerce certain duties relating to the program.

Modifying the nonprofit tax exemption for qualifying blood, tissue, or blood and tissue banks.

Concerning electric vehicle charging stations.

Placing restrictions on construction agreements.

SB 5851 by Senators Bailey, Hill, and Baumgartner

Creating a defined contribution retirement plan option for public employees.

Establishes the public employee defined contribution retirement plan act.

Places responsibility on the department of retirement systems for the administration and management of the savings plan.

Takes effect July 1, 2014, however, the legislature retains the right to alter or abolish these benefits any time before July 1, 2014.
