Authorizes the secretary of the department of social and health services to license resource and assessment centers to provide care for children ages birth through twelve, or for children ages thirteen through seventeen who have a sibling or siblings under thirteen years of age who are being admitted to the resource and assessment center.

Prohibits the centers from being used to address placement disruptions for children who have been removed from a foster home because of behavior or safety concerns.

Establishes a process to retain water rights when they are no longer used on state purchased lands and to make the water rights available for alternate uses by local economies rather than be permanently lost to the economy of the area through relinquishment.

Requires the department of fish and wildlife, the parks and recreation commission, and the department of natural resources to each maintain an inventory of water rights appurtenant to lands purchased by their agencies.

Becker, Dammeier, Rivers, Padden, and Roach)

Implementing the recommendations made by the Powell fatality team.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires a court that orders that a child be placed with a caregiver over the objections of the parent, to articulate, on the record, his or her reasons for ordering the placement.

Requires the department of social and health services to: (1) When a parent or sibling has been identified as a suspect in an active criminal investigation that, if the allegations are true, would impact the safety of the child, make a concerted effort to consult with the assigned law enforcement officer in the criminal case before recommending any changes in parent/child or child/sibling contact;

(2) Include in its policies and protocols concerning visitation for dependent children, consultation with the assigned law enforcement officer in the event the parent or sibling of the child is identified as a suspect in an active criminal investigation that may impact the safety of the child; and
