HB 1017-S2 by House Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government (originally sponsored by Representatives Morris, Fitzgibbon, Fey, Liias, McCoy, Hudgins, Farrell, Morrell, Ormsby, Upthegrove, and Pollet)

Creating new efficiency standards.

(DĬGEST OF PRÓPOSED 2ND SUBSTITUTE)

Establishes minimum energy efficiency standards for battery charger systems, battery backup, and uninterruptible power supplies.

Establishes minimum water conservation standards for water closets, urinals, showerheads, and various types of faucets.

HB 1046-S by House Committee on Environment (originally sponsored by Representatives

Fey, Upthegrove, Takko, Seaquist, Zeiger, Walsh, Blake, Kochmar, and Haigh)

Concerning uncontested rate modifications for utilities and transportation commission regulated water companies.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Allows water companies to file tariff changes adjusting its metered or flat tariff rates for water use up to three percent under certain conditions.

Requires the utilities and transportation commission to report to the legislature regarding the rate filings made by water companies.

Expires June 30, 2019.

Concerning sales for resale by retail licensees of liquor. (DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Finds that the implementation of the privatization of liquor initiative has created some unresolved issues in the marketplace. Therefore, the legislature recognizes the need for more fairness in the market for former contract liquor store owners and phased-in uniformity in the market.

Exempts sales to bars and restaurants from the retail license issuance fee.

- (2) Notify local governments when a provider is added to the list; and
- (3) Verify that offenders receiving the vouchers are using certain programs and services.

Prohibits the department of labor and industries from charging a fee to certify an affidavit of wages paid if, at the time an individual or entity files an affidavit of wages paid, the individual or entity is exempt from the requirement to pay the prevailing rate of wage.

Changes the composition and duties of the energy facility site evaluation council.

Providing initiatives to improve and expand access to computer science education.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Improves and expands access to computer science education.

Requires high school and school district boards of directors to approve AP computer science courses as equivalent to high school mathematics or science.

Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction to allocate, on a competitive basis, grants to school districts to increase the capacity of high schools to offer AP computer science courses.

Requires the workforce training and education coordinating board to convene and provide staff support for a computer science professional shortage task force to develop a strategic plan to increase the number of graduates from high schools, community and technical colleges, and four year colleges and universities who are prepared to enter the workforce or continue their education in computer science.

HB 1501-S by House Committee on Agriculture & Natural Resources (originally sponsored by Representatives Lytton, Kretz, and Ryu)

Building upon the existing wildlife interaction program to establish the mechanisms behind an uncapped funding source for implementing the provisions of the Washington wolf conservation and management plan adopted by the fish and wildlife commission in 2011 in a way that does not change the management provisions of the plan.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Authorizes the department of fish and wildlife to: (1) Pay up to fifty thousand dollars per fiscal year from the state wildlife account for claims and assessment costs for injury or loss of livestock due to wolf predation; and

(2) Accept and expend money from other sources to address losses or damage to livestock or other property.

Requires the value of livestock killed or injured by a gray wolf to be set at the market value of the lost livestock. Creates Washington's wolves special license plates.

Creates the wolf interaction conflict account.

Requires the department of fish and wildlife to transfer to the account the balance of unexpended state funds authorized to be used for livestock claims and assessment costs and appropriated for mitigation, claims, and assessment costs for injury to or loss of livestock.

Promoting a balanced financing system for state parks programs and services in order to facilitate resource stewardship, interpretative activities, cultural events, and works of art in state parks.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Facilitates resource stewardship, interpretative activities, cultural events, and works of art in state parks by promoting a balanced financing system for state parks programs and services.

Requires the office of financial management to consult with the director of the parks and recreation commission and deliver a report to the legislative fiscal committees that presents a detailed forecast of the fiscal opportunity cost incurred by the commission in complying with fee reductions and exemptions for the upcoming fiscal biennium.

Authorizes the parks and recreation commission to enter into an agreement regarding the transfer of park management responsibilities with certain entities.

Reducing scrap metal theft.

(DĬGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Expands metal theft provisions.

Prohibits a person from engaging in the business of a scrap metal processor, scrap metal recycler, or scrap metal supplier without first applying for and receiving a scrap metal license.

Authorizes the chiefs of police, the county sheriffs, and the Washington state patrol to inspect licensee's licensed premises and records.

Establishes the Washington metal theft prevention authority to determine the scope of the problem of metal theft, analyze the various methods of combating the problem, and develop and implement a plan of operation and a financial plan.

Requires the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs to implement and operate an ongoing electronic statewide no-buy list database program.

Creates the Washington metal theft prevention authority account.

Provides that certain sections of the act are null and void if appropriations are not approved.

Establishes a training program for managers of manufactured housing communities.

Requires the attorney general to: (1) Under the manufactured/mobile home dispute resolution program, administer the training program;

- (2) Develop the curriculum for the training program with input from statewide associations representing manufactured housing community tenants and owners;
- (3) Issue certificates of completion of training to persons who have successfully completed the training program; and
- (4) Maintain a list of the names of those who have completed the training which must be made available to the public.

Authorizes the attorney general to charge a fee for the training program.
