HB 2069 by Representatives Hunter and Sullivan

Concerning continuation of safety net benefits for persons with a physical or mental disability which makes them eligible for certain social services programs.

(SUBSTITUTED FOR - SEE 1ST SUB)

Addresses eligibility for referral for essential needs and housing support and the responsibility for determining the eligibility.

Provides a contingent effective date based on when medicaid expansion coverage under the federal patient protection and affordable care act of 2010 is available in this state.

Requires the state health care authority to provide notice of the effective date to certain parties.

HB 2069-S by House Committee on Appropriations (originally sponsored by Representatives Hunter and Sullivan)

Concerning continuation of safety net benefits for persons with a physical or mental disability which makes them eligible for certain social services programs.

(AS OF HOUSE 2ND READING 6/06/13)

Addresses eligibility for referral for essential needs and housing support and the responsibility for determining the eligibility.

Provides a contingent effective date based on when medicaid expansion coverage under the federal patient protection and affordable care act of 2010 is available in this state.

HB 2070 by Representatives O'Ban, Clibborn, and Zeiger

Concerning Washington state department of transportation projects.

Creates an expedited environmental review and approval process for transportation projects that require preparation of an environmental impact statement under the national environmental policy act and requires the department of transportation to use the process.

Requires certain state and local agencies to provide technical assistance to the department of transportation on accomplishing the project review and coordination activities.

Requires the department of transportation to: (1) Streamline the permitting process;

(2) Continue its efforts to improve training and compliance;

(3) Deliver the projects and activities listed in LEAP Transportation Document 2013-4 in a manner that exemplifies the stewardship goal in RCW 47.07.280;

(4) Convene three expert review panels to provide independent financial and technical review for the development of a finance plan and project implementation plan for the Columbia river crossing project, the state route number 520 bridge replacement and HOV project, and the Alaskan Way viaduct replacement project;

(5) Use available technologies to minimize permit delays for, inform and interact with interested parties regarding, and optimize the effectiveness of proposed compensatory mitigation projects; and

(6) Consult with the department of fish and wildlife, appropriate local government, and interested tribes to identify the existing fish passage barriers that, upon removal, will result in the greatest habitat benefit.

Requires the department of ecology to: (1) Update certain rules for integrating use of national environmental policy act documents in decisions under the state environmental policy act;

(2) Update certain rule-based categorical exemptions for transportation maintenance activities; and

 $(\bar{3})$ Convene a work group to identify procedures to more effectively achieve certain objectives with regard to harmonizing local land use reviews with maintenance and improvement of state transportation facilities.

Authorizing expedited permitting and contracting for Washington state bridges deemed structurally deficient.

Provides for expedited permitting and contracting for state bridges identified as structurally deficient by the department of transportation.

HB 2072 by Representative Manweller

Concerning collected compostable waste.

Requires a county or city that mandates compostable waste separation or collection as part of the level of service for customers of curbside or alley residential solid waste services to provide for the storage and processing of at least fifty percent of all collected compostable waste in the county where the materials are collected or pursuant to a contractual agreement that specifically provides for the storage and processing of compostable waste in a different county if performance of the contract has begun before the effective date of the act.

Allows a county legislative authority to authorize, fix, and impose a sales and use tax in accordance with chapter 82.14 RCW (local retail sales and use tax) to be used solely for regional human services needed to improve the social determinants of equity outcomes through an integrated and accountable health and human services system.

SB 5242-S by Senate Committee on Early Learning & K-12 Education (originally sponsored by

Senators Litzow, Dammeier, Tom, Hobbs, Hatfield, Delvin, Hewitt, Padden, and Schoesler)

Requiring policies regarding assignment of certificated instructional staff. (REVISED FOR ENGROSSED: Regarding assignment of certificated instructional staff.)

(AS OF SENATE 2ND READING 6/09/13)

Requires the state board of education to use the Washington achievement index to identify all the school districts that, during the previous two school years, did not make progress in closing the opportunity gaps in any of the individual subgroups of students or did not make progress in closing the overall opportunity gap within the district and provide the list of school districts to the office of the superintendent of public instruction.

Allows a nonprovisional certificated instructional staff member to be assigned to a particular school only with the agreement of the principal and the staff member being assigned.

Allows the superintendent, if an assignment cannot be found, to assign the displaced staff member to a temporary position, however, if a displaced staff member is not assigned to a nontemporary position by May 15th of the school year following the displacement, the school district shall place the displaced staff member on unpaid leave until such time as the displaced staff member is able to secure an assignment.

Provides for submission of the act to a vote of the people.

SB 5895-S by Senate Committee on Ways & Means (originally sponsored by Senators Hill and Hargrove)

Funding education.

(AS OF SENATE 2ND READING 6/09/13)

Modifies the state expenditure limit to ensure a limit is placed on the remainder of state government expenditures that will enable the state to commit an increasing proportion of state tax dollars and the state budget to the education of our citizens in fulfillment of the state's paramount duty.

Provides for submission of the act to a vote of the people.

SB 5945 by Senators Litzow and Tom

Concerning principal empowerment.

Requires each school district board of directors to adopt a policy on assignment of certificated instructional staff consistent with the provisions of the act.

Allows a nonprovisional certificated instructional staff member to be assigned to a particular school only with the agreement of the principal and the staff member being assigned. Allows a superintendent, if an assignment cannot be found, to assign the staff member to a temporary position, however, if a displaced staff member is not assigned to a nontemporary position by May 15th of the school year following the displacement, the superintendent may initiate nonrenewal of contract.

SB 5946 by Senator Dammeier

Strengthening student educational outcomes.

Places responsibility on the office of the superintendent of public instruction with regard to reading and early literacy.

Requires the learning assistance program to be evidence-based.

Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction to: (1) Convene a discipline task force to develop standard definitions for causes of student disciplinary actions taken at the discretion of the school district; and

(2) Develop and annually implement a professional development program for first-time school directors and school district superintendents and for on-going development of school directors and superintendents.

Establishes the educator support program to provide professional development and mentor support for beginning educators and educators on probation.
