HB 1711-S by House Committee on Government Accountability & Oversight (originally sponsored by Representatives Condotta and Hurst)

Allowing multiple liquor licenses at the same physical premises.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Allows, under certain circumstances, any number or combination of liquor licenses or approvals to be issued and approved for the same premises, overlapping premises, adjacent premises, or separate premises to the same licensee or to different licensees under common ownership.

Allows the liquor control board to hold all licensees at a premises jointly liable if, at a single premises with multiple licenses, the board does not connect certain violations to a single licensee.

Addressing the regulation of service contracts and protection product guarantees.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Modifies provisions relating to the regulation of service contracts and protection product guarantees.

HB 2136-S by House Committee on Business & Financial Services (originally sponsored by Representatives Parker, Stanford, and Kirby)

Addressing the regulation of service contracts and protection product guarantees.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Addresses service contract providers that are relying on insuring their service contracts to assure the faithful performance of their obligations to service contract holders.

HB 2475 by Representatives Overstreet, Shea, Taylor, Scott, and Buys

Making state law consistent with federal law regarding short-barreled shotguns and short-barreled rifles.

Allows a person to possess, transport, acquire, or transfer a short-barreled shotgun or short-barreled rifle that is legally registered and possessed, transported, acquired, or transferred in accordance with federal law.

HB 2476 by Representatives Overstreet, Shea, and Taylor

Establishing the Washington state incandescent light bulb freedom act.

Requires the department of labor and industries to establish by rule: (1) Standards to address the workload of employees performing commercial janitorial services; and

(2) A health and safety training program applicable to employees and supervising managers of commercial janitorial service businesses.

Provides requirements for a commercial janitorial service business in order to qualify for the exemption from retail sales taxes.

Requires the joint legislative audit and review committee to assess the performance of the exemption from retail sales taxes for commercial janitorial service businesses.

HB 2478 by Representatives Schmick, Fagan, and Kretz

Providing technical assistance to achieve voluntary compliance with water pollution control statutes.

Addresses water quality problems with regard to lands on which livestock graze or seek feed in pastures, fields, or rangeland.

Requires the department of ecology, if it determines that a water quality violation has occurred, to first attempt to achieve voluntary compliance by offering information and technical assistance to the person in violation and if that fails to remedy the problem, the department may then issue a notice of violation.

HB 2479 by Representatives Green, Holy, Stonier, Hayes, and Freeman; by request of LEOFF Plan 2 Retirement Board

Placing restrictions on retired law enforcement officers and firefighters employed in certain public positions.

Places restrictions on plan 2 retirees of the law enforcement officers' and firefighters' retirement system with regard to continuing in a law enforcement officer or firefighter career and still collecting their retirement allowance.

HB 2480 by Representatives Ross, Johnson, Pike, Chandler, and Nealey

Concerning notice against trespass.

Adds the definition of "posting in a conspicuous manner" to chapter 9A.52 RCW (burglary and trespass).

HB 2481 by Representatives Senn, Bergquist, Farrell, Riccelli, Fitzgibbon, Appleton, Walkinshaw, Sawyer, Fey, and Gregerson

Concerning food and yard waste collection space for qualifying new residential occupancies with more than two dwelling units.

Requires the state building code council to adopt rules requiring that space be provided for the collection and periodic transfer to an off-site composting facility of food and yard waste created on-site at apartment houses, assisted living facilities, dormitories, and fraternities and sororities.

HB 2482 by Representatives Klippert and Clibborn

Creating a fee exemption for the disclosure of vehicle owner information.

Provides vehicle wreckers with a fee exemption for the disclosure of vehicle owner information.

HB 2483 by Representative Moeller

Concerning standards for awarding maintenance in dissolution or legal separation proceedings.

Prohibits a court from granting a maintenance order if the court finds that it is likely the person from whom maintenance is sought would become eligible for public assistance as a result of the maintenance order.

Modifying drug offender sentencing alternatives.

HB 2485 by Representative Moeller

Addressing survivor benefits from the public employees' retirement system for survivors of members in registered domestic partnerships prior to December 2012.

Allows, under certain circumstances, survivor benefits from the public employees' retirement system for survivors of members in registered domestic partnerships.

HB 2486 by Representative Pettigrew

Addressing the implementation of inmate postsecondary education degree programs to reduce recidivism.

Offers appropriate postsecondary opportunities to inmates.

HB 2487 by Representatives Fey, Rodne, Moscoso, Klippert, Van De Wege, Lytton, Hurst, Liias, Holy, and Sells

Addressing the monthly salary and benefits paid to state patrol officers.

Requires the monthly salary and benefits paid to state patrol officers to be competitive with comparable law enforcement agencies within the boundaries of the state.

HB 2488 by Representatives Fey, Rodne, Moscoso, Van De Wege, Lytton, Hurst, Liias, and Sells

Modifying the distribution of initial and renewal vehicle license fees.

Changes the distribution of proceeds from vehicle license fees and renewal vehicle license fees.

Jan 20 First reading, referred to Transportation (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2489 by Representatives Schmick, Morrell, Short, Harris, DeBolt, and Cody

Regulating pharmacy benefit managers and pharmacy audits.

Requires a pharmacy benefit manager, in order to conduct business in the state, to register with the office of the insurance commissioner and annually renew the registration.

HB 2490 by Representative Kirby

Addressing license issuance fees imposed on former contract liquor stores and former state liquor stores.

Addresses license issuance fees for licensees who are either holders of former state liquor store operating rights or the owners of former contract liquor stores.

HB 2491 by Representatives Holy, Riccelli, Sawyer, Johnson, Santos, Shea, Vick, Moscoso, Condotta, and Takko

Authorizing online tax lien foreclosure sales.

Authorizes tax lien foreclosure sales to be made on an internet web site as the county treasurer may direct.

HB 2492 by Representatives Rodne and Jinkins

Concerning liability of health care providers responding to an emergency.

Addresses immunity from liability, professional conduct sanctions, and administrative sanctions for health care providers responding to an emergency.

HB 2493 by Representatives Wilcox, Tharinger, Buys, Lytton, Vick, Orcutt, and Reykdal

Concerning current use valuation for land primarily used for commercial horticultural purposes.

Addresses land primarily used for commercial horticultural purposes.

Clarifies and updates the definition of "farm and agricultural land" as it is used under the property tax open space program.

Jan 20 First reading, referred to Agriculture & Natural Resources (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2494 by Representatives Shea, Blake, Van De Wege, Short, DeBolt, Fagan, and Condotta

Creating a motorcycle road guard certificate.

Requires the director of the department of licensing to: (1) Create and, when appropriate, issue a motorcycle road guard certificate; and

(2) In consultation with motorcycle skills education course instructors, establish safety and equipment standards for motorcycle road guard certificate holders, including mandatory reflective safety vests.

HB 2495 by Representatives Shea, Blake, Van De Wege, Short, DeBolt, Fagan, and Condotta

Modifying references to manufacturing standards for motorcycle helmets.

Changes references to manufacturing standards for motorcycle helmets.

HB 2496 by Representative Schmick

Concerning defendants who are guilty but have a mental disability.

Addresses a plea or finding of guilty but with a mental disability.

Jan 20 First reading, referred to Judiciary (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2497 by Representatives S. Hunt, Zeiger, Goodman, Wylie, Rodne, Ross, Pike, and Moeller

Establishing new authority for courts to assess cost recovery fees for costs associated with new indigent defense standards.

Provides local courts and courts of limited jurisdiction with additional fee authority to assess costs on offenders that can be used to offset growing expenditures associated with indigent defense and public defender caseload limits.

HB 2498 by Representatives Liias, Dahlquist, Takko, Kretz, Springer, Wilcox, Clibborn, and Pike

Establishing a process for the payment of impact fees through provisions stipulated in recorded covenants.

Requires counties, cities, and towns collecting impact fees to adopt a permanent system for the collection of the fees from applicants for certain residential building permits.

HB 2499 by Representatives Wilcox, Morrell, Zeiger, and Green

Permitting school siting outside of urban growth areas.

Requires certain counties that are required or choose to plan under the growth management act to permit schools outside of urban growth areas when certain criteria are met.

HB 2500 by Representatives Reykdal, Tarleton, Sells, Ormsby, and Fitzgibbon

Requiring completion of an apprenticeship program to receive a journeyman or residential specialty electrician certificate of competency.

Requires completion of an apprenticeship program to receive a journeyman or residential specialty electrician certificate of competency.

HB 2501 by Representatives Ormsby and Sells

Concerning registration requirements for contractors.

Curtails the operations of illegal businesses in the construction industry.

Requires a business that applies for a contractor registration under chapter 18.27 RCW to have a state industrial insurance account, a state unemployment insurance account, and a state business tax account.

Encourages an owner, officer, or partner of a contractor registration applicant to complete a preregistration contractor training class.

Charges an additional contractor registration fee for an applicant that has not completed the preregistration training class.

Requires the department of labor and industries to provide preregistration training in each of its service regions at least once each month.

Requires the department of revenue and the employment security department to assist the department of labor and industries in presenting the contractor preregistration training program.

HB 2502 by Representatives Klippert, Hayes, MacEwen, and Haler

Concerning dealer deliveries to active duty law enforcement officers.

Allows a dealer to deliver a pistol to a purchaser who produces a valid commission card issued by a state law enforcement agency that shows the purchaser is a full-time, commissioned law enforcement officer of the agency.

HB 2503 by Representatives Klippert, Hayes, and Haler

Concerning the operation of a vessel under the influence of an intoxicant.

Addresses testing of a person's breath or blood with regard to the operation of certain watercraft.

Jan 20 First reading, referred to Public Safety (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2504 by Representatives Klippert, Haler, and Overstreet

Prohibiting mandatory child support for postsecondary education of adult children.

Prohibits a court from ordering either or both parents to pay support for postsecondary education of a child over eighteen years of age.

Authorizes a party to petition for modification of an existing order to pay postsecondary child support ordered without showing a substantial change of circumstances.

Prohibits the use of the child support schedule when ordering postsecondary educational support of a child.

HB 2505 by Representatives Klippert and Haler

Requiring photo identification on electronic benefit cards.

Requires an electronic benefit card issued to or on behalf of a person receiving public assistance to contain a photo identification of the person authorized to use the card.

Requires the department of social and health services to: (1) Consider using the photographic databases of the department of licensing as a cost-saving measure;

(2) Work with the department of licensing to access and cross-share facial recognition data and resources for the purposes of identifying potential fraud; and

(3) Report any case where there is reason to believe that fraud has been committed to the attorney general, prosecutor's office, or appropriate law enforcement entity.

HB 2506 by Representatives Klippert, Fey, Haler, and Hayes

Making felony driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor, marijuana, or any drug a class B felony.

Changes the offense of felony driving under the influence of intoxicating liquor, marijuana, or any drug from a class C felony to a class B felony.

HB 2507 by Representatives Klippert, Moscoso, Haler, and Hayes

Increasing the punishment for vehicular homicide.

Changes a sentence from an additional two years to an additional ten years when a person is found guilty of vehicular homicide while under the influence of intoxicating liquor or any drug.

HB 2508 by Representatives Klippert, Haler, and Hayes

Concerning the mental health evaluation and treatment of individuals who threaten to murder a family member or other person who resides with the individual.

Revises the definition of "likelihood of serious harm," for purposes of chapter 71.05 RCW (mental illness), to include a substantial risk that physical harm will be inflicted by a person who has threatened to murder a family member or other person who resides with the person, the threat seriously alarms the family member or other person, and the threat places the family member or other person in reasonable fear the person will attempt to carry out the threat.

HB 2509 by Representatives Klippert and Haler

Authorizing municipalities to prohibit the possession of marijuana and marijuana-based products within their jurisdictional boundaries.

Establishes the local control over marijuana use and possession act.

Grants the authority to local governments to prohibit the personal use or possession of marijuana within their jurisdictional boundaries.

Jan 20 First reading, referred to Government Accountability & Oversight (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2510 by Representative Klippert

Authorizing municipalities to prohibit the operation of commercial marijuana production, processing, and retail facilities within their jurisdictional boundaries.

Establishes the local control over marijuana commerce act.

Grants the authority to local governments to prohibit the operation within their jurisdictional boundaries of any business or facility involved in the production, processing, or sale of marijuana.

Prohibits the liquor control board from issuing or renewing a commercial marijuana license for an applicant or existing licensee whose place of business is located within the jurisdictional boundaries of a local government that has enacted an ordinance prohibiting the operation of a facility or business for the production, processing, or retail sale of marijuana.

HB 2511 by Representatives Klippert and Haler

Requiring qualifying patients or designated providers to obtain permits to grow or provide medical marijuana.

Requires a qualifying patient or designated provider, who grows or provides cannabis or cannabis products for the medical use of marijuana, to obtain a permit from the city, town, or county in order to grow or provide medical marijuana in the city, town, or county.

HB 2512 by Representative Kirby

Concerning cosmetology, hair design, barbering, esthetics, and manicuring.

Modifies provisions relating to cosmetology, barbering, esthetics, and manicuring under chapter 18.16 RCW and adds "hair design" to those provisions.

Changes the name of the cosmetology, barbering, esthetics, and manicuring advisory board to the cosmetology, hair design, barbering, esthetics, and manicuring advisory board.

HB 2513 by Representatives S. Hunt, Takko, Tharinger, and Revkdal

Modifying collection dates for property taxes paid through escrow.

Changes the due date for property tax payments from October 31st to July 31st if the property taxes are held in an escrow account by a financial institution.

Jan 20 First reading, referred to Finance (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2514 by Representatives Christian, S. Hunt, Kretz, and Bergquist; by request of Office of Financial Management

Eliminating the human resources director. Eliminates the human resources director.

Jan 20 First reading, referred to Government Operations & Elections (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2515 by Representatives Christian, S. Hunt, Kretz, and Bergquist; by request of Office of Financial Management

Concerning the treatment of population enumeration data, including exempting it from public inspection and copying.

Requires the office of financial management to destroy enumeration data after it is used to produce the required population estimates.

Excludes enumeration data from public inspection and copying under the public records act.

Jan 20 First reading, referred to Government Operations & Elections (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2516 by Representatives Christian, S. Hunt, Kretz, and Bergquist; by request of Office of Financial Management

Regarding assessments for lands occupied, used, or under the jurisdiction of a state agency.

Addresses the duties of the chief administrative officer of a state agency and the director of the office of financial management with regard to assessments for lands occupied, used, or under the jurisdiction of a state agency.

-- 2014 REGULAR SESSION --

Jan 20 First reading, referred to Government Operations & Elections (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2517 by Representatives Blake and Kretz

Concerning wildlife conflict funding to encourage proactive measures.

Addresses expenditures from the state wildlife account and the general fund for: (1) Damage to commercial crops caused by wild deer or elk; and

(2) Injury or loss of livestock caused by large carnivores. Creates the wildlife conflict account and requires the state treasurer to transfer any unexpended money, from the expenditures mentioned above, to the wildlife conflict account.

HB 2518 by Representatives Habib, Walsh, Goodman, and Haigh

Creating the pilot identicard program.

Requires the department of licensing, working in conjunction with the department of corrections, to create and implement a two-year pilot identicard program within the Monroe correctional complex to provide incarcerated offenders with a state issued identicard to assist and prepare each offender for release from prison and reentry into the community.

HB 2519 by Representatives Senn, Walsh, and Kagi

Concerning early education for children involved in the child welfare system.

Requires a family assessment response worker to assess for child safety and child well-being when collaborating with a family to determine the need for child protective services child care or early learning services.

Requires the department of social and health services to collaborate with the department of early learning to complete two reports that examine child care and early learning services provided during family assessment response cases.

Makes a child who received family assessment response services eligible for the working connections child care program for a twelve-month enrollment period.

HB 2520 by Representatives Senn, Seaquist, Stonier, Clibborn, Nealey, and Harris; by request of Governor Inslee

Providing greater small business assistance by modifying the filing threshold for business and occupation tax purposes.

Changes the filing threshold for business and occupation tax purposes to provide greater small business assistance.

-- 2014 REGULAR SESSION --

Jan 20 First reading, referred to Finance (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2521 by Representatives Kirby, Orcutt, and Sullivan

Concerning the first mortgage interest business and occupation tax deduction.

Finds that: (1) The implementation of tax policy is often complicated by mandatory accounting rules;

(2) Such accounting rules should not dictate the application of tax policy adopted by the legislature; and

(3) The department of revenue is often unable to fully implement the will of the legislature due to unanticipated accounting rules or changes to established rules.
