HB 1620-S2 by House Committee on Transportation (originally sponsored by Representatives Stanford, Zeiger, Takko, Haler, Blake, Liias, Clibborn, Jinkins, Wilcox, Ryu, Ormsby, Sells, Appleton, Pedersen, Upthegrove, Magendanz, Pollet, Orcutt, Johnson, Angel, Condotta, Carlyle, Kristiansen, Moeller, Fitzgibbon, Moscoso, Morrell, and Santos)

Concerning passenger-carrying vehicles for railroad employees.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 2ND SUBSTITUTE)

Requires the utilities and transportation commission to: (1) Regulate charter party carriers providing railroad crew transportation and every contract crew hauling vehicle with respect to the safety of equipment, driver qualifications, insurance levels, and safety of operations;

(2) Inspect contract crew hauling vehicles;

(3) Investigate safety complaints related to employee transportation and take appropriate enforcement action as warranted; and

(4) Study accidents involving vehicles regulated under chapter 81.61 RCW (railroads--passenger-carrying vehicles for employees).

HB 1651-S2 by House Committee on Appropriations Subcommittee on General Government & Information Technology (originally sponsored by Representatives Kagi, Walsh, Freeman, Roberts, Farrell, Zeiger, Goodman, Pollet, Sawyer, Appleton, Bergquist, S. Hunt, Moscoso, Jinkins, Ryu, and Morrell)

Concerning access to juvenile records.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 2ND SUBSTITUTE)

Addresses the confidentiality of certain juvenile court records.

Prohibits certain confidential juvenile offense records from being published, distributed, or sold.

Takes effect on the date that the administrative office of the courts fully implements a court data system that allows juvenile records to be categorized as confidential.

HB 2059-S by House Committee on Technology & Economic Development (originally sponsored by Representative Morris)

Concerning the voluntary purchase of eligible renewable resources by customers of electric utilities.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires an investor-owned utility, at the request of a nonresidential electric customer, to create a tariff that includes a standard contract to allow the customer and other interested nonresidential customers to purchase voluntarily renewable resources in one megawatt-hour units.

Requires the governing board of a consumer-owned utility, upon request of an electric customer of a consumerowned utility, to create a tariff schedule or contract that allows the customer to purchase voluntarily renewable resources in one megawatt-hour units.

Requires a customer requesting to purchase voluntarily renewable resources to make a deposit with the utility to cover the cost of work hours at the electric utility to develop the tariff.

Concerning department of labor and industries appeal bonds.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Modifies the costs of filing certain appeals with the department of labor and industries.

Concerning leased energy systems.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Authorizes an electric utility to offer a leased energy program that must offer to customers across all rate classes the opportunity to lease from the electric utility a renewable energy system that will be installed on the customer's property.

Requires the department of ecology to conduct an assessment of the environmental consequences, throughout the product lifecycle, associated with leased energy systems and energy storage systems installed in this state containing hazardous materials, rare earth minerals, and other commercially valuable materials.

Requires the utilities and transportation commission to publish a list of financing models being offered by investorowned utilities or third-party vendors registered as competitive electrical companies.

Requires investor-owned utilities and third-party vendors offering leased energy systems, upon request of the utilities and transportation commission, to provide information on the financial terms of leased energy systems currently under contract.

Concerning the expansion of natural gas infrastructure in rural or underserved areas.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires the utilities and transportation commission to: (1) Conduct a process that allows customers and utilities to bring forth innovative proposals for the financing and building of natural gas infrastructure; and (2) Adopt rules that promote incremental investments in natural gas infrastructure expansions that by December 1, 2025: (a) Result in the residential conversion from wood or oil-fired boilers for space heating to natural gas and the conversion from hog fuel and bunker fuel used in industrial processes to natural gas; (b) produce two hundred fifty million dollars in pipeline expansion over a ten-year period; and (c) result in fifty thousand residential natural gas conversions that currently use wood or oil-fired boilers for space heating over a ten-year period.

HB 2214-S by House Committee on Local Government (originally sponsored by Representatives Takko and Springer)

Concerning the training of code enforcement officials. (DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Provides assurance to the construction industry and local communities by giving code officials access to current training on the most recent code updates.

Imposes a fee of two dollars on each building permit issued by a county or a city.

Creates the code officials apprenticeship and training account.

Requires the department of labor and industries to: (1) Review the code officials apprenticeship and training program and the use of funds collected in accordance with the building permit fee; and

(2) In conducting the review, request information from and consult with appropriate stakeholders, including the Washington association of building officials, the association of Washington cities, the Washington state association of counties, the state board for community and technical colleges, the state workforce training and education coordinating board, the Washington association of realtors, and the department of commerce.

HB 2255-S by House Committee on Transportation (originally sponsored by Representative Van De Wege)

Concerning ambulance seat belt notification, air bags, and driver training.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires an ambulance to have in the cab of the ambulance: (1) A seat belt notification that includes a lighted message alarm; and

(2) Air bags that meet federal regulations.

Requires the Washington state patrol, in partnership with the Washington fire chiefs, to study the need and feasibility of regional accident prevention programs for ambulance and medic unit operators, including the use of driver simulators.

Changing the definition of capital projects to include technology infrastructure.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Revises the definition of "capital projects," for purposes of RCW 82.46.010 (tax on sale of real property authorizedproceeds dedicated to local capital projects), to include technology infrastructure that is integral to the capital project and technology infrastructure that specifically fosters or supports the transfer of real properties.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires a city, town, or code city, for each annexation by the city or town, to provide notification by certified mail or electronic means that includes a list of annexed parcel numbers and the street address to the light and power businesses and the gas distribution businesses. Requires the light and power businesses and the gas distribution businesses to remit to the city or town only those utility taxes collected sixty days or more after receipt of the notification.

Concerning food and yard waste collection space for qualifying new residential occupancies with more than two dwelling units.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Requires the state building code council, during the 2015 code adoption period, to adopt rules requiring that space be provided for the collection and periodic transfer to an off-site composting facility of food and yard waste created on-site at apartment houses, assisted living facilities, boarding houses, congregate living facilities, dormitories, and fraternities and sororities.

Concerning registration requirements for contractors. (DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Curtails the operations of illegal businesses in the construction industry.

Requires a business that applies for a contractor registration under chapter 18.27 RCW to have a state industrial insurance account, a state unemployment insurance account, and a state business tax account.

Encourages an owner, officer, or partner of a contractor registration applicant to complete a contractor preregistration training program.

Charges an additional contractor registration fee for a first-time applicant that has not completed the preregistration training program.

Requires the department of labor and industries to provide the preregistration program in each of its service delivery regions at least once each month. Requires the department of revenue and the employment security department to assist the department of labor and industries in presenting the contractor preregistration training program.

(2) The loss, destruction, and duplication of a warrant issued by a local government officer or agency.

Requires the office of the superintendent of public instruction to: (1) Report to the governor and the legislature certain data for homeless students;

(2) In collaboration with experts from community organizations on homelessness and homeless education policy, develop or acquire a short video that provides information on how to identify signs that indicate a student may be homeless, how to provide services and support to homeless students, and why this identification and support is critical to student success; and (3) Adopt and distribute to each school district, best practices for choosing and training school district-designated homeless student liaisons.

Requires school districts to: (1) Encourage all school staff to annually review the video;

(2) Encourage every district-designated homeless student liaison to attend trainings provided by the state to ensure that homeless children and youth are identified and served; and

(3) Include information about services and support for homeless children in existing materials that are shared with students at the beginning of the school year or at enrollment.

Requires school districts to report annually to the superintendent of public instruction, dropout rates for student populations in each of the grades seven through twelve by identified homeless status.
