"Prior 26 27 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for 28 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of 29 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what 30 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2017-2019 31 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not 32 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for the project or program in the future. 33

1 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant 2 conditions and limitations applicable to 3 appropriations. The department shall calculate such lump sum 28 29 payments using professional appraisal standards. These lease payments may not exceed the fee simple purchase price based on current fair 30 31 market value and must be deposited by the department to the common school construction account in the same manner as lease revenues from 32 other common school trust lands. No deduction may be made for the 33 34 resource management cost account under RCW 79.64.040. No later than September 30, 2015, the department must transfer to the common school 35 construction account the portion of the appropriation in this section 36 that is attributable to receipts from lease payments. 37

38 (4) All reasonable costs incurred by the department to implement39 this section are authorized to be paid out of the appropriations.

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Authorized costs include the actual cost of appraisals, staff time,
 environmental reviews, surveys, and other similar costs and may not

(7) The department and receiving agencies shall work in good faith to carry out the intent of this section. However, the department or receiving agencies may remove a property from the transfer list based on new, substantive information, if it is determined that transfer of the property is not in the statewide interest of either the common school trust or the receiving agency.

(8) \$26,422,000 of the appropriation must be deposited in the 27 common school construction account by September 30, 2015. 28 The 29 department shall execute trust land transfers so that after the deduction of reasonable costs as provided in subsection (4) of this 30 31 section on an aggregate basis eighty percent or more of the total 32 appropriation value is timber value or lease payments and is deposited in the common school construction account. To achieve the 33 eighty percent requirement, the department may choose to lease 34 properties originally intended as transfers or transfer properties 35 36 originally intended as leases.

The estimated debt service costs for the appropriations contained in this act are thirty-six million nine 6 hundred sixty-four thousand dollars for the 2015-2017 biennium, two 7 hundred thirty-one million four hundred thirty-nine thousand dollars 8 for the 2017-2019 biennium, and three hundred twenty-four million six 9 10 hundred three thousand dollars for the 2019-2021 biennium.

11 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7002. ACOUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND 12 FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency, 13 14 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in 15 more than the principal amounts indicated, plus not financing 16 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When 17 securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most 18 economical financial contract option available, including long-term 19 leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates 20 of participation. 8 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7008. (1) Any building project that receives 9 funding from the capital budget must be built to sustainable 10 standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that integrates 11 and optimizes all major high-performance building attributes, 12 including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle performance, and 13 occupant productivity. The following design and construction 14 attributes must be integrated into the building project:

15 (a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative, 16 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains 17 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water, 18 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other 19 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals 20 21 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Considers all stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction. 22

(b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the 23 24 size and complexity of the building and its system components in 25 order to verify performance of building components and systems and help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an 26 27 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan, 28 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be 29 30 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

(c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building performance target that takes into account the intended use, occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy use index. For major renovations, reduce the energy use by fifty percent below pre-renovations baseline.

(d) On-site renewable energy: Meet at least thirty percent of thehot water demand through the installation of solar hot water heaters,

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1 when life-cycle cost effective. Implement renewable energy generation 2 projects on agency property for agency use, when life-cycle cost 3 effective.

4 (e) Measurement and verification: Install building level 5 electricity meters in new major construction and renovation projects 6 to track and continuously optimize performance. Include equivalent 7 meters for natural gas and steam, where natural gas and steam are 8 used. Install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize 9 occupants on energy use.

10 (f) Benchmarking: Compare actual performance data from the first 11 year of operation with the energy design target. Verify that the 12 building performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other 13 building and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool for 14 laboratory buildings. Web-based data collection and dashboards must 15 also be provided.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7009. State agencies, including institutions 17 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent 18 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting 19 for operating expenditures.

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7010. Executive Order No. 05-05, 21 archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November 22 10, 2005. Agencies and higher education institutions shall comply 23 with the requirements set forth in this executive order.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7011. PUGET SOUND PROTECTION AND RESTORATION. 24 Consistent with RCW 90.71.340, when expending appropriations under 25 this act that contribute to Puget Sound protection and recovery, 26 agencies shall consult with the Puget Sound partnership to ensure 27 28 that projects and expenditures are either in, or consistent with the 29 2020 action agenda. These consultations shall include the exchange of information on specific actions, projects, associated funding, 30 performance measures, and other information necessary to track 31 project implementation and ensure alignment with the action agenda. 32 33 In situations where the Puget Sound partnership finds that a project is not in, or is not consistent with the action agenda, Puget Sound 34 partnership shall document this finding and report back to the 35 36 governor and legislative fiscal committees.

The list shall include a description of each project, the amount of 17 recommended state funding, and documentation of nonstate funds to be 18 used for the project. The total amount of recommended state funding 19 for projects on a biennial project list shall not exceed ten million 20 21 dollars. The prioritized list shall be developed through open and public meetings and the amount of state funding shall not exceed 22 thirty-three and thirty-three one hundredths percent of the total 23 cost of the project. The nonstate portion of the total project cost 24 25 may include cash, the value of real property when acquired solely for the purpose of the project, and in-kind contributions. Any project list revisions 21 must be approved by the office of financial management before funds 22 may be expended from the minor works appropriation. 23

24 (2)(a) Minor works project lists are single line appropriations 25 that include multiple projects of a similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000 each, with the exception of 26 27 higher education minor works projects that may be valued up to \$2,000,000. All projects must meet the criteria included in this 28 subsection (2)(a). These projects should be completed within two 29 30 years of the appropriation with the funding provided. Agencies are prohibited from including projects on their minor works lists that 31 are a phase of a larger project, and that if combined over a 32 continuous period of time, would exceed \$1,000,000, or \$2,000,000 for 33 higher education minor works projects. Improvements for accessibility 34 in compliance with the Americans with disabilities act may be 35 included in any of the minor works categories. 36

37 (b) Minor works appropriations may not be used for the following:
38 Studies, except for technical or engineering reviews or designs that
39 lead directly to and support a project on the same minor works list;

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1 planning; design outside the scope of work on a minor works list; 2 moveable, temporary, and traditionally funded operating equipment not in compliance with the equipment criteria established by the office 3 of financial management; software not dedicated to control of a 4 specialized system; moving expenses; land or facility acquisition; 5 6 rolling stock; computers; or to supplement funding for projects with 7 shortfalls unless expressly authorized. The office funding of financial management may make an exception to the 8 limitations described in this subsection (2)(b) for exigent circumstances after 9 notifying the legislative fiscal committees and waiting ten days for 10 11 comments by the legislature regarding the proposed exception.

12 (c) Minor works preservation projects may include program 13 improvements of no more than twenty-five percent of the individual 14 minor works preservation project cost.

15 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7036. FOR THE STATE TREASURER-TRANSFERS Public works assistance account—state: For transfer 16 17 to the water pollution control revolving account, \$6,000,000 for fiscal year 2016 and \$6,000,000 for 18 19 20 Public works assistance account-state: For transfer to the drinking water assistance account, \$4,400,000 21 for fiscal year 2016 and \$4,400,000 for fiscal 22 23 

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7037. To the extent that any appropriation authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building 25 26 construction account, or from any other capital project account in the state treasury, for a capital project or program that 27 is 28 specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the 29 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or 30 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum 31 32 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7038. The office of financial management, in 34 accordance with RCW 28B.77.070 and 43.88D.010, shall include the 35 following in the scoring process: 1 (1) The office of financial management shall develop a single 2 prioritized list that includes all projects requesting funding, with 3 the exception of minor works and predesign requests. Predesigns must 4 be on a separate prioritized list.

5 (2) The office of financial management shall weight the 6 reasonableness of cost criteria based on the following criteria in 7 the following order: (a) Expected maximum allowable construction 8 costs per square foot; and (b) life-cycle cost analysis using the 9 office of financial management's life-cycle cost tool.

10 (3) Prior legislative commitment to the project funding of 11 predesign or design must be included in the scoring criteria.

12 (4) Projects must be scored only once unless the office of 13 financial management, or the requesting school, find that the project 14 scope or budget has significantly changed.

22 RCW 28B.20.744, as now existing or hereafter amended, is 23 repealed, effective June 30, ((<del>2016</del>)) <u>2018</u>.

24 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7041. This act is necessary for the immediate 25 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 26 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 27 effect immediately."

28 Correct the title.

EFFECT: The striking amendment includes the 2015-17 Capital Budget and the 2015 Supplemental Capital Budget. The striking amendment makes new appropriations for 2015-17 totaling \$3.77 billion, of which \$2.17 billion is financed from state general obligation bonds and \$1.6 billion is financed from other funds. Included are authorizations for state agencies to enter into alternative financing contracts totaling \$313 million. PSHB 1115 also authorizes reappropriations totaling \$2.9 billion for uncompleted

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projects approved in prior biennia.

In addition, the striking amendment makes adjustments to the 2013-15 Capital Budget, including appropriation increases of \$16.7 million and appropriation decreases of \$130.3 million, for a net decrease to the 2013-15 Capital Budget of \$113.6 million. Reappropriations are also decreased by a net of \$3.5 million.
