

**SHB 1917** - H AMD TO H AMD (H-2247.1) **396**

1 On page 4, line 27 of the striking amendment, after "(g)" insert  
2 "Jurisdictions that have entered into a court enforceable consent  
3 decree involving oversight by a court approved monitor or that have  
4 reached an agreement with the United States department of justice  
5 due to violations of constitutional rights relating to the use of  
6 force by a local police department are not eligible for the  
7 protections afforded by this act regarding:

8 (i) Court costs and fees awarded to prevailing parties pursuant  
9 to (b) of this subsection;

10 (ii) The derivative suppression of evidence pursuant to section  
11 5 of this act; and

12 (iii) Charging requesters, regardless of identity, for  
13 redacting, altering, distorting, pixilating, suppressing, or  
14 otherwise obscuring any portion of video or sound recordings  
15 pursuant to (f) of this subsection when the recordings are made in  
16 public places where there is no reasonable expectation of privacy.

19 Renumber the remaining subsections consecutively and correct any  
20 internal references accordingly.

22 On page 8, line 3 of the striking amendment, after "(7)" insert  
23 "The task force shall confer with any jurisdiction attempting to  
24 develop improved or lower cost methods to identify and reproduce  
25 body worn camera recordings with redaction of any portion of the  
26 recording that is exempt from disclosure. All jurisdictions using  
27 body worn cameras are encouraged to collaborate with the task force

1 and any other jurisdiction in attempting to develop improved or  
2 lower cost methods to identify and reproduce body worn camera  
3 recordings with redaction of any portion of the recording that is  
4 exempt from disclosure.

7 Renumber the remaining subsections consecutively and correct any  
8 internal references accordingly.

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10 On page 8, line 7 of the striking amendment, after "data,"  
11 insert "improved or lower cost methods to identify and reproduce  
12 body camera recordings with redaction of any portion of the  
13 recording that is exempt from disclosure,

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EFFECT: Provides that jurisdictions that have entered into a court enforceable consent decree involving oversight by a court approved monitor or that have reached an agreement with the United States Department of Justice due to violations of constitutional rights relating to the use of force by a local police department are not eligible for certain protections afforded by the Act.

Requires the task force to confer with any jurisdiction attempting to develop new low cost methods to identify and reproduce body worn camera recordings with redaction of any portion of the recording that is exempt from disclosure. All jurisdictions using body worn cameras are encouraged to collaborate with the task force and any other jurisdiction to develop such methods.

Requires the task force to report its findings and recommendations regarding improved or lower cost methods to identify and reproduce body camera recordings with redaction of any portion of the recording that is exempt from disclosure.

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
