## ADOPTED 03/03/2016

- 1 Strike everything after the enacting clause and insert the 2 following:
- 3 "Sec. 1. RCW 47.01.071 and 2007 c 516 s 4 are each amended to 4 read as follows:
- 5 The transportation commission shall have the following functions, 6 powers, and duties:
- 7 (1) To propose policies to be adopted by the governor and the 8 legislature designed to assure the development and maintenance of a 9 comprehensive and balanced statewide transportation system which will 10 meet the needs of the people of this state for safe and efficient 11 transportation services. Wherever appropriate, the policies shall 12 provide for the use of integrated, intermodal transportation systems. 13 The policies must be aligned with the goals established in RCW
- 14 47.04.280. To this end the commission shall:
  15 (a) Develop transportation policies which are based on the

policies, goals, and objectives expressed and inherent in existing

- 18 (b) Inventory the adopted policies, goals, and objectives of the local and area-wide governmental bodies of the state and define the role of the state, regional, and local governments in determining transportation policies, in transportation planning, and in implementing the state transportation plan;
- (c) Establish a procedure for review and revision of the state transportation policy and for submission of proposed changes to the governor and the legislature; and
- (d) Integrate the statewide transportation plan with the needs of the elderly and persons with disabilities, and coordinate federal and state programs directed at assisting local governments to answer such needs;
- 30 (2) To provide for the effective coordination of state 31 transportation planning with national transportation policy, state

and local land use policies, and local and regional transportation plans and programs;

- (3) In conjunction with the provisions under RCW 47.01.075, to provide for public involvement in transportation designed to elicit the public's views both with respect to adequate transportation services and appropriate means of minimizing adverse social, economic, environmental, and energy impact of transportation programs;
- 9 (4) By December 2010, to prepare a comprehensive and balanced 10 statewide transportation plan consistent with the state's growth 11 management goals and based on the transportation policy goals provided under RCW 47.04.280 and applicable state and federal laws. 12 The plan must reflect the priorities of government developed by the 13 office of financial management and address regional needs, including 14 15 multimodal transportation planning. The plan must, at a minimum: (a) 16 Establish a vision for the development of the system; (b) identify significant 17 transportation statewide 18 transportation policy issues; and (c) recommend statewide transportation policies and strategies to the legislature to fulfill 19 the requirements of subsection (1) of this section. The plan must be 20 21 the product of an ongoing process that involves representatives of significant transportation interests and the general public from 22 across the state. Every four years, the plan shall be reviewed and 23 revised, and submitted to the 24 governor and the of 25 representatives and senate standing committees on transportation.

The plan shall take into account federal law and regulations relating to the planning, construction, and operation of transportation facilities;

(5) ((By December 2007, the office of financial management shall submit a baseline report on the progress toward attaining the policy goals under RCW 47.04.280 in the 2005-2007 fiscal biennium. By October 1, 2008, beginning with the development of the 2009-2011 biennial transportation budget, and by October 1st biennially thereafter, the office of financial management shall submit to the legislature and the governor a report on the progress toward the attainment by state transportation agencies of the state transportation policy goals and objectives prescribed by statute, appropriation, and governor directive. The report must, at a minimum, include the degree to which state transportation programs have progressed toward the attainment of the policy goals established

under RCW 47.04.280, as measured by the objectives and performance measures established by the office of financial management under RCW 47.04.280;

- (6))) To propose to the governor and the legislature prior to the convening of each regular session held in an odd-numbered year a recommended budget for the operations of the commission as required by RCW 47.01.061;
- 8  $((\frac{(7)}{)})$  (6) To adopt such rules as may be necessary to carry out 9 reasonably and properly those functions expressly vested in the 10 commission by statute;
- 11 ((<del>\ (8) \)</del>) (7) To contract with the office of financial management 12 or other appropriate state agencies for administrative support, 13 accounting services, computer services, and other support services 14 necessary to carry out its other statutory duties;
- 15 ((<del>(9)</del>)) <u>(8)</u> To conduct transportation-related studies and policy 16 analysis to the extent directed by the legislature or governor in the 17 biennial transportation budget act, or as otherwise provided in law, 18 and subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this 19 specific purpose; and
- (((10))) (9) To exercise such other specific powers and duties as may be vested in the transportation commission by this or any other provision of law.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 47.04 RCW to read as follows:
- 25 By October 1, 2016, and by October 1st biennially thereafter, the office of financial management shall review and comment prior to the 26 27 department of transportation submitting to the legislature and the governor a report on the progress toward the attainment by state 28 transportation agencies of the state transportation policy goals and 29 30 objectives prescribed by statute, appropriation, and directive. The report must, at a minimum, include the degree to which 31 state transportation programs have progressed toward the attainment 32 of the policy goals established under RCW 47.04.280, as measured by 33 34 the objectives and performance measures established under RCW 35 47.04.280.
- 36 **Sec. 3.** RCW 47.04.280 and 2015 3rd sp.s. c 16 s 1 and 2015 3rd sp.s. c 1 s 304 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

(1) It is the intent of the legislature to establish policy goals for the planning, operation, performance of, and investment in, the state's transportation system. The policy goals established under this section are deemed consistent with the benchmark categories adopted by the state's blue ribbon commission on transportation on November 30, 2000. Public investments in transportation should support achievement of these policy goals:

- (a) Economic vitality: To promote and develop transportation systems that stimulate, support, and enhance the movement of people and goods to ensure a prosperous economy;
- (b) Preservation: To maintain, preserve, and extend the life and utility of prior investments in transportation systems and services;
- (c) Safety: To provide for and improve the safety and security of transportation customers and the transportation system;
- (d) Mobility: To improve the predictable movement of goods and people throughout Washington state, including congestion relief and improved freight mobility;
- (e) Environment: To enhance Washington's quality of life through transportation investments that promote energy conservation, enhance healthy communities, and protect the environment; and
- 21 (f) Stewardship: To continuously improve the quality, 22 effectiveness, and efficiency of the transportation system.
  - (2) The powers, duties, and functions of state transportation agencies must be performed in a manner consistent with the policy goals set forth in subsection (1) of this section.
  - (3) These policy goals are intended to be the basis for establishing detailed and measurable objectives and related performance measures.
  - (4) It is the intent of the legislature that the ((department of transportation establish)) office of financial management, in consultation with the transportation commission, establish objectives and performance measures for the department and other state agencies with transportation-related responsibilities to ensure transportation system performance at local, regional, and state government levels progresses toward the attainment of the policy goals set forth in subsection (1) of this section. The ((department of transportation)) office of financial management shall submit objectives and performance measures to the legislature for its review and shall provide copies of the same to the commission during each regular session of the legislature during an even-numbered year thereafter.

- 1 (5) A local or regional agency engaging in transportation planning may voluntarily establish objectives and performance 2 measures to demonstrate progress toward the attainment of the policy 3 goals set forth in subsection (1) of this section or any other 4 transportation policy goals established by the local or regional 5 6 agency. A local or regional agency engaging in transportation planning is encouraged to provide local and regional objectives and 7 performance measures to be included with the objectives and 8 9 performance measures submitted to the legislature pursuant to subsection (4) of this section. 10
- 11 (6) This section does not create a private right of action.
- Sec. 4. RCW 47.64.360 and 2015 3rd sp.s. c 1 s 306 are each 12 13 amended to read as follows:
  - (1) The department of transportation shall complete a government management and accountability performance report that provides a baseline assessment of current performance on the performance measures identified in RCW 47.64.355 using final 2009-2011 data. This report must be presented to the legislature by November 1, 2011, through the attainment report required in ((RCW 47.01.071(5)))section 2 of this act and RCW 47.04.280.
- (2) By December 31, 2012, and each year thereafter, the 21 department of transportation shall complete a performance report for 22 the prior fiscal year. This report must be reviewed by the office of 23 24 financial management, which must provide comment on the report, and the joint transportation committee, prior to submitting the report to 26 the legislature and governor.
- 27 (3) Management shall lead implementation of the performance measures in RCW 47.64.355." 28
- 29 Correct the title.
