
SUBSTITUTE HOUSE BILL 1967

1 AN ACT Relating to creating flexibility in health care coverage
2 by seeking federal waivers; and creating new sections.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) The legislature finds that the
5 affordable care act encourages states to develop innovative
6 approaches to covering their residents by authorizing states to apply
7 for waivers from the requirements of federal law. States that are
8 granted innovation waivers may receive federal assistance to operate
9 their reform programs in an amount that is equivalent to the
10 aggregate amount of tax credits and cost-sharing subsidies that the
11 federal government would have paid for individuals enrolled in state
12 health insurance exchanges. In addition, section 1115 of the social
13 security act authorizes the secretary of health and human services to
14 approve experimental, pilot, or demonstration projects that promote
15 the objectives of the medicaid and CHIP programs while giving states
16 additional flexibility to design and improve their programs.

17 (2) The legislature further finds that Washington has a history
18 of innovation in encouraging state residents to obtain health care
19 coverage. With an opportunity to waive certain provisions of federal
20 law, the state may be able to create more effective solutions for
21 providing affordable health coverage to Washington residents.

1 (3) The legislature therefore intends to direct the health care
2 authority to apply for a waiver to permit the state to innovatively
3 expand health care coverage and reduce health care costs.

4 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** (1)(a) By January 1, 2016, the health care
5 authority shall apply to the federal government for a waiver to:

6 (i) Permit employers in this state to integrate employer health
7 care arrangements, such as health reimbursement arrangements and
8 employer payment plans, with individual market policies; and

9 (ii) Authorize alternative structures for enrollee eligibility,
10 provider payment, and plan design for those participating in medical
11 assistance to tailor the program to the needs of Washington
12 residents.

13 (b) In preparing the application, the health care authority shall
14 provide a process for public notice and comment.

15 (2) Upon receipt of the waiver, the health care authority shall
16 promptly notify in writing the governor and the appropriate
17 committees of the legislature.

18 (3) The health care authority shall provide status reports to the
19 joint select committee on health care oversight, as requested by the
20 committee.

21 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** If specific funding for the purposes of
22 this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not
23 provided by June 30, 2015, in the omnibus appropriations act, this
24 act is null and void.

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
