House Bills

HB 2194 by Representatives Hunter, Hansen, Carlyle, Johnson, Walkinshaw, Ryu, and Santos

Creating a funding stream and program for cancer research, prevention, and care.

Addresses cancer research, prevention, and care.

Expands the duties and changes the composition of the life sciences discovery fund authority.

Establishes an independent expert scientific review and advisory committee.

Increases the tax on cigarettes and the tax on tobacco products.

Creates the fund to fight cancer and the fight cancer treasury fund.

Mar 18 First reading, referred to Technology & Economic Development (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

HB 2195 by Representatives Lytton, Walkinshaw, Orwall, Chandler, and Fagan

Modifying certain auditor's fees.

Increases the surcharge that county auditors and recording officers are required to collect for recording instruments.

Mar 19 First reading, referred to Appropriations (Not Officially read and referred until adoption of Introduction report).

(originally sponsored by Senators Braun and Mullet)

Concerning spirits retailers when selling for resale.

(DIGEST OF PROPOSED 1ST SUBSTITUTE)

Addresses spirits retailers when selling for resale.

-- 2015 REGULAR SESSION --

Mar 19 WM - Majority; 1st substitute bill be substituted, do pass.

Minority; do not pass.

Minority; without recommendation.

Passed to Rules Committee for second reading.

SB 6082 by Senator Roach

Banning powdered alcohol.

Prohibits the use, purchase, sale, or possession of powdered alcohol.

Mar 18 First reading, referred to Commerce & Labor.
