- On page 7, beginning on line 1, strike all of section 6 and insert the following:
- 3 "NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. A new section is added to RCW 28A.630 RCW to 4 read as follows:
- 5 (1) Subject to the availability of amounts appropriated for this 6 specific purpose, the office of the superintendent of public instruction 7 shall establish a competitive application process to designate two 8 educational service districts in which to pilot one lead staff person
- 9 for children's mental health.
- 10 (2) The office must select two educational service districts as 11 pilot sites by October 1, 2017. When selecting the pilot sites, the 12 office must endeavor to achieve a balanced geographic distribution of 13 sites east of the crest of the cascade mountains and west of the crest 14 of the cascade mountains.
- 15 (3) The lead staff person for each pilot site must have the primary 16 responsibility for:
- 17 (a) Coordinating medicaid billing for schools and school districts
 18 in the educational service district;
- 19 (b) Facilitating partnerships with community mental health 20 agencies and other providers;
- 21 (c) Sharing service models;
- 22 (d) Seeking public and private grant funding;
- (e) Ensuring the adequacy of other system level supports for
- 24 students with mental health needs; and
- 25 (f) Collaborating with the other selected project and with the 26 office of the superintendent of public instruction.

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- 1 (4) The office of the superintendent of public instruction must 2 report on the results of the two pilot projects to the governor and the 3 appropriate committees of the legislature in accordance with RCW 4 43.01.036 by December 1, 2019. The report must also include:
- 5 (a) A case study of an educational service district that is 6 successfully delivering and coordinating children's mental health 7 activities and services. Activities and services may include but are 8 not limited to medicaid billing, facilitating partnerships with 9 community mental health agencies, and seeking and securing public and 10 private funding; and
- 11 (b) Recommendations regarding whether to continue or make permanent 12 the pilot projects and how the projects might be replicated in other 13 educational service districts.
- 14 (5) This section expires January 1, 2020."

EFFECT:

- Requires, subject to the availability of appropriated funds, the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction to:
 - o designate two educational service districts (ESD) in which to pilot a lead staff person for children's mental health;
 - o select pilot projects by October 1, 2017; and
 - o report on the results of the pilot, provide a case study of an ESD that is successfully delivering and coordinating children's mental health services, and provide recommendations to the Governor and Legislature by December 1, 2019.
- Provides an expiration date for this section of January 1, 2020.

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
