EFFECT: Creates a cause of action by a person adversely affected by the filing of a petition for review before the Growth 2023-S AMH TAYL HATF 090 Official Print - 1 Management Hearings Board (Board) against the person who filed the petition for review before the Board, to recover attorneys' fees, court costs, and other damages relating to an affected project that were reasonably incurred as a result of any delay caused by the Board's review of the petition. A person commencing a cause of action under this section may also seek exemplary damages of up to \$50,000 from the petitioner if a court determines that the petitioner's primary motivation in filing the petition for review before the Board can reasonably be identified as creating a delay in the underlying project, increasing the expenses for the underlying project, or improving the petitioner's position in future negotiations regarding mitigation or other protective measures.
