3 "<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 46.20 4 RCW to read as follows:

5 (1) As required in section 202 of the REAL ID Act, P.L. 109-13, 6 and 6 C.F.R. Part 37, the department must issue to a qualifying 7 applicant a driver's license or identicard that is accepted by the 8 federal government for official purposes, as defined in 6 C.F.R. Sec. 9 37.3, as such federal laws and regulations existed on the effective 10 date of this section, or such subsequent date as may be provided by 11 the department by rule, consistent with the purposes of this section.

12 (2) An applicant for a driver's license or identicard for federal13 purposes must:

14 (a) Submit to a mandatory facial image capture, even if a 15 driver's license or identicard is not issued;

(b) Sign a declaration under penalty of perjury, as proscribed under RCW 9A.72.030, that the information presented on the application is true and correct;

19 (c) Present at least one of the following documents required for 20 proof of identity:

21

(i) Valid, unexpired United States passport;

(ii) Certified copy of a birth certificate from the Washington state department of health or filed with an equivalent government agency in the individual's state of birth;

(iii) Consular report of birth abroad issued by the United States department of state, form FS-240, DS-1350, or FS-545;

(iv) Valid, unexpired permanent resident card (form I-551) issued by the United States department of homeland security or immigration and naturalization service or its successor agency;

30 (v) Unexpired employment authorization document issued by the 31 United States department of homeland security, form I-766 or form 32 I-688B;

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1 (vi) Unexpired foreign passport with a valid, unexpired United States visa affixed accompanied by the approved I-94 form documenting 2 the applicant's most recent admittance into the United States; 3

(vii) Certificate of naturalization issued by the United States 4 department of homeland security, form N-550 or form N-570; 5

б (viii) Certificate of citizenship issued by the United States department of homeland security, form N-560 or form N-561; 7

(ix) REAL ID driver's license or identification card issued in 8 compliance with federal standards; or 9

(x) Such other documents as the department of homeland security 10 11 has designated by rule as it existed on the effective date of this section, or such subsequent date as may be provided by the department 12 by rule, consistent with the purposes of this section; 13

14 (d) Present at least one document required under (c) of this subsection that establishes the applicant's date of birth; 15

(e) Except for applicants who present a foreign passport as proof 16 identity, present his or her social security administration 17 of account number card. If the card is not available, the applicant must 18 present a W-2 form, a SSA-1099 form, a non-SSA-1099 form, or a pay 19 stub with the applicant's name and social security number on it. If 20 21 the applicant is establishing identity with a foreign passport, the applicant must present a social security number or demonstrate 22 nonwork-authorized status; 23

24 (f) Present at least two documents establishing a person's Washington state residence address, as required in 6 C.F.R. Secs. 25 26 37.11(f) and 37.17(f), as each existed on the effective date of this 27 section, or such subsequent date as may be provided by the department by rule, consistent with the purposes of this section; and 28

29 (q) Present satisfactory evidence of lawful status in the United 30 States.

31 (i) The verification of an applicant's identity through the systematic alien verification for entitlements system, or equivalent 32 federally approved lawful status verification system, using one of 33 any of the documents listed in (c)(i), (ii), (iii), (iv), (vii), or 34 (viii) of this subsection satisfies proof of lawful status in the 35 36 United States.

(ii) An applicant that has provided an identity document listed 37 in (c)(v), (vi), or (ix) of this subsection must also present a 38 second document to establish lawful status in the United States. The 39 second document must be one of the documents identified in (q)(i) of 40 Code Rev/BP:tcw H-2631.1/17 1 this subsection or documentation issued by the department of homeland 2 security or other federal agencies demonstrating lawful status as 3 determined by the United States citizenship and immigration services.

4 (3) Unless provided otherwise in this section, the applicant must 5 pay the fee as provided in RCW 46.20.161 or 46.20.117, as applicable.

6 (4) Unless provided otherwise in this section, the expiration 7 date and renewal fees are provided in RCW 46.20.117 and 46.20.181, as 8 applicable.

9 (5) When issuing a driver's license or identicard under this 10 section, the department must follow the procedures and meet the 11 applicable requirements and standards in 6 C.F.R. Part 37, as it 12 existed on the effective date of this section, or such subsequent 13 date as may be provided by the department by rule, consistent with 14 the purposes of this section.

15 (6) The department may adjust fees for limited-term drivers' 16 licenses and identicards issued to persons who have temporary lawful 17 status in the United States as defined in 6 C.F.R. Sec. 37.3, as it 18 existed on the effective date of this section, or such subsequent 19 date as may be provided by the department by rule, consistent with 20 the purposes of this section.

21 (7) The department must provide a security marking for drivers' licenses and identicards issued under this section to distinguish the 22 documents from other types of drivers' licenses or identicards issued 23 by the department, as required under 6 C.F.R. Secs. 37.17 and 37.27, 24 25 as each existed on the effective date of this section, or such 26 subsequent date as may be provided by the department by rule, consistent with the purposes of this section. Drivers' licenses and 27 identicards issued under RCW 46.20.091 and 46.20.117, respectively, 28 29 must include a statement on the front of the document that states it is not for federal purposes. 30

31 (8) The requirements of this section are in addition to the 32 requirements otherwise imposed on applicants for a driver's license 33 or identicard. The department may adopt rules to implement this 34 section.

35 **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.20.091 and 2000 c 115 s 4 are each amended to 36 read as follows:

37 (1) Application. In order to apply for a driver's license or
38 instruction permit, the applicant must provide his or her:

(a) Name of record, as established by documentation required
 under RCW 46.20.035;

3 (b) Date of birth, as established by satisfactory evidence of 4 age;

5 (c) Sex;

6 (d) Washington residence address;

7 (e) Description;

8 (f) Driving licensing history, including:

9 (i) Whether the applicant has ever been licensed as a driver or 10 chauffeur and, if so, (A) when and by what state or country; (B) 11 whether the license has ever been suspended or revoked; and (C) the 12 date of and reason for the suspension or revocation; or

(ii) Whether the applicant's application to another state or country for a driver's license has ever been refused and, if so, the date of and reason for the refusal; and

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(g) Any additional information required by the department.

17 (2) Sworn statement. An application for an instruction permit or for an original driver's license must be made upon a form provided by 18 the department. The form must include a section for the applicant to 19 indicate whether he or she has received driver training and, if so, 20 where. The identifying documentation verifying the name of record 21 must be accompanied by the applicant's written statement that it is 22 valid. The information provided on the form must be sworn to and 23 signed by the applicant before a person authorized to administer 24 25 oaths. An applicant who makes a false statement on an application for 26 a driver's license or instruction permit is guilty of false swearing, a gross misdemeanor, under RCW 9A.72.040. 27

(3) Driving records from other jurisdictions. If a person previously licensed in another jurisdiction applies for a Washington driver's license, the department shall request a copy of the applicant's driver's record from the other jurisdiction. The driving record from the other jurisdiction becomes a part of the driver's record in this state.

Driving records to other jurisdictions. If another 34 (4) jurisdiction requests a copy of a person's Washington driver's 35 record, the department shall provide a copy of the record. The 36 department shall forward the record without charge if the other 37 jurisdiction extends the same privilege to the state of Washington. 38 39 Otherwise the department shall charge a reasonable fee for 40 transmittal of the record.

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1 (5) Federal purposes. Any driver's license or instruction permit 2 issued under this section must include a statement on the front of

3 the document that states it is not for federal purposes.

4 Sec. 3. RCW 46.20.117 and 2012 c 80 s 6 are each amended to read 5 as follows:

6 (1) **Issuance**. The department shall issue an identicard, 7 containing a picture, if the applicant:

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(a) Does not hold a valid Washington driver's license;

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(b) Proves his or her identity as required by RCW 46.20.035; and

10 (c) Pays the required fee. 34 (5) Alternative issuance/renewal/extension. The department may 35 issue or renew an identicard for a period other than five years from 36 October 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, or six years after June 30, 2013, 37 or may extend by mail or electronic commerce an identicard that has 38 already been issued, in order to evenly distribute, as nearly as 39 possible, the yearly renewal rate of identicard holders. The fee for an identicard issued or renewed for a period other than five years from October 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, or six years after June 30, 2013, or that has been extended by mail or electronic commerce, is nine dollars for each year that the identicard is issued, renewed, or extended. (5) Alternative issuance/renewal/extension. The department may 4 issue or renew an identicard for a period other than five years from 5 б October 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, or six years after June 30, 2013, 7 or may extend by mail or electronic commerce an identicard that has already been issued, in order to evenly distribute, as nearly as 8 possible, the yearly renewal rate of identicard holders. The fee for 9 an identicard issued or renewed for a period other than five years 10 from October 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, or six years after June 30, 11 2013, or that has been extended by mail or electronic commerce, is 12 nine dollars for each year that the identicard is issued, renewed, or 13 extended. 19 Sec. 5. RCW 46.01.130 and 2013 c 336 s 1 and 2013 c 224 s 1 are 20 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

21 The director:

(1) Shall supervise and control the issuing of vehicle certificates of title, vehicle registrations, and vehicle license plates, and has the full power to do all things necessary and proper to carry out the provisions of the law relating to the registration of vehicles;

(2) May appoint and employ deputies, assistants, representatives,and clerks;

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(3) May establish branch offices in different parts of the state;

30 (4) May appoint county auditors in Washington state or, in the 31 absence of a county auditor, the department or an official of county 32 government as agents for applications for and the issuance of vehicle 33 certificates of title and vehicle registrations; and

(5)(a) Shall investigate the conviction records and pending
 charges of any current employee of or prospective employee being
 considered for any position with the department who has or will have:

37 (i)(A) The ability to create or modify records of applicants for 38 enhanced drivers' licenses and identicards issued under RCW 39 46.20.202; and

(B) The ability to issue enhanced drivers' licenses and

13 (iv) The ability to create or modify records of applicants for a 14 federally compliant driver's license under section 1 of this act; or

15 (v) The ability to issue a federally compliant driver's license

17 The investigation consists of a background check (b) as authorized under RCW 10.97.050, 43.43.833, and 43.43.834, and the 18 19 federal bureau of investigation. The background check must be conducted through the Washington state patrol criminal identification 20 21 section and may include a national check from the federal bureau of investigation, which is through the submission of fingerprints. The 22 director shall use the information solely to determine the character, 23 24 suitability, and competence of current or prospective employees 25 subject to this section.

(c) The director shall investigate the conviction records andpending charges of an employee subject to:

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(i) Subsection (5)(a)(i) of this section every five years; and

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Correct the title.

<u>EFFECT:</u> Makes the following changes to department of licensing (DOL)-issued drivers' licenses and identicards and to the driver's license and identicard application and issuance process:

(1) Requires DOL to issue drivers' licenses and identicards that qualify as REAL ID-compliant;

(2) Mandates that DOL meet applicable REAL ID federal requirements and standards when issuing a REAL ID-compliant driver's license or identicard;

(3) Requires REAL ID-compliant driver's license and identicard applicants to submit to a mandatory facial image capture, sign a declaration that the information presented on the application is accurate, present specified forms of identification to establish United States citizenship or lawful presence in the United States and date of birth, and present two documents that establish Washington state residency;

(4) Establishes that the verification of an applicant's identity through the Systematic Alien Verification for Entitlements (SAVE) system, or an equivalent federally approved lawful status verification system, using a specified form of identification satisfies proof of the lawful presence requirement;

(5) Mandates that DOL provide a security marking for REAL IDcompliant drivers' licenses and identicards to distinguish them from other types of drivers' licenses and identicards, as required by federal regulation;

(6) Sets REAL ID-compliant driver's license and identicard application and renewal fees equal to standard driver's license and identicard application and renewal fees, and grants DOL the authority to adjust fees for limited-term, REAL ID-compliant drivers' licenses and identicards;

(7) Eliminates the reduction in the fee for a full-term enhanced driver's license and enhanced identicard from 108 dollars to 66 dollars;

(8) Grants DOL the authority to establish rules related to the issuance of REAL ID-compliant drivers' licenses and identicards;

(9) Removes the mandate that DOL adopt rules for marking standard drivers' licenses and identicards in accordance with federal REAL ID act regulations to indicate they are not acceptable for federal identification purposes; and

(10) Preserves the restriction on the Department of Licensing from issuing REAL ID-compliant drivers' licenses or identicards or from storing or including data about state residents to meet the requirements of the REAL ID Act until it provides certification that its driver's license, identicard, database, records facility, computer system, and personnel screening and training procedures:

(a) Include all reasonable security measures to protect the privacy of state residents;

(b) Include all reasonable safeguards to protect against the unauthorized disclosure of data; and

(c) Do not place unreasonable costs or recordkeeping burdens on a driver's license or identicard applicant.

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
