1 On page 4, after line 14 of the amendment, insert the following:

2 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.300  
3 RCW to read as follows:

4 (1)(a) Effective July 1, 2018, responsibility for administering  
5 the Washington history day program is transferred from the Washington  
6 state historical society to the office of the superintendent of  
7 public instruction. In accordance with this subsection (1)(a), and  
8 subject to funds appropriated for this specific purpose, the office  
9 of the superintendent of public instruction is responsible for the  
10 administration and coordination of the Washington history day  
11 program, a program affiliated with the national history day  
12 organization, including providing necessary staff support.

13 (b) Subject to the requirements and limits of (a) of this  
14 subsection, the Washington history day program must be operated as a  
15 partnership between the office of the superintendent of public  
16 instruction, the Washington state historical society, and private  
17 parties interested in providing funding and in-kind support for the  
18 program. The Washington state historical society must, in  
19 coordination with the office of the superintendent of public  
20 instruction, promote the program and provide access and support for  
21 students who are conducting primary and secondary research of  
22 historical Washington state documents and commentary.

23 (2) The Washington history day account is created in the custody  
24 of the state treasurer. In collaboration with private and  
25 philanthropic partners, private matching funds will be procured to  
26 support Washington history day. All receipts from gifts, grants, or  
27 endowments from public or private sources must be deposited into the  
28 account. Expenditures from the account may be used only for the  
29 Washington history day program. Only the superintendent of public  
30 instruction or the superintendent's designee may authorize  
31 expenditures from the account. The account is subject to allotment

1 procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not  
2 required for expenditures.

3 **Sec. 6.** RCW 43.79A.040 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 5 s 89 are each  
4 amended to read as follows:

5 (1) Money in the treasurer's trust fund may be deposited,  
6 invested, and reinvested by the state treasurer in accordance with  
7 RCW 43.84.080 in the same manner and to the same extent as if the  
8 money were in the state treasury, and may be commingled with moneys  
9 in the state treasury for cash management and cash balance purposes.

10 (2) All income received from investment of the treasurer's trust  
11 fund must be set aside in an account in the treasury trust fund to be  
12 known as the investment income account.

13 (3) The investment income account may be utilized for the payment  
14 of purchased banking services on behalf of treasurer's trust funds  
15 including, but not limited to, depository, safekeeping, and  
16 disbursement functions for the state treasurer or affected state  
17 agencies. The investment income account is subject in all respects to  
18 chapter 43.88 RCW, but no appropriation is required for payments to  
19 financial institutions. Payments must occur prior to distribution of  
20 earnings set forth in subsection (4) of this section.

21 (4)(a) Monthly, the state treasurer must distribute the earnings  
22 credited to the investment income account to the state general fund  
23 except under (b), (c), and (d) of this subsection.

24 (b) The following accounts and funds must receive their  
25 proportionate share of earnings based upon each account's or fund's  
26 average daily balance for the period: The 24/7 sobriety account, the  
27 Washington promise scholarship account, the Gina Grant Bull memorial  
28 legislative page scholarship account, the Washington advanced college  
29 tuition payment program account, the Washington college savings  
30 program account, the accessible communities account, the Washington  
31 achieving a better life experience program account, the community and  
32 technical college innovation account, the agricultural local fund,  
33 the American Indian scholarship endowment fund, the foster care  
34 scholarship endowment fund, the foster care endowed scholarship trust  
35 fund, the contract harvesting revolving account, the Washington state  
36 combined fund drive account, the commemorative works account, the  
37 county enhanced 911 excise tax account, the toll collection account,  
38 the developmental disabilities endowment trust fund, the energy  
39 account, the fair fund, the family and medical leave insurance

1 account, the food animal veterinarian conditional scholarship  
2 account, the forest health revolving account, the fruit and vegetable  
3 inspection account, the future teachers conditional scholarship  
4 account, the game farm alternative account, the GET ready for math  
5 and science scholarship account, the Washington global health  
6 technologies and product development account, the grain inspection  
7 revolving fund, the Washington history day account, the industrial  
8 insurance rainy day fund, the juvenile accountability incentive  
9 account, the law enforcement officers' and firefighters' plan 2  
10 expense fund, the local tourism promotion account, the low-income  
11 home rehabilitation revolving loan program account, the multiagency  
12 permitting team account, the northeast Washington wolf-livestock  
13 management account, the pilotage account, the produce railcar pool  
14 account, the regional transportation investment district account, the  
15 rural rehabilitation account, the Washington sexual assault kit  
16 account, the stadium and exhibition center account, the youth  
17 athletic facility account, the self-insurance revolving fund, the  
18 children's trust fund, the Washington horse racing commission  
19 Washington bred owners' bonus fund and breeder awards account, the  
20 Washington horse racing commission class C purse fund account, the  
21 individual development account program account, the Washington horse  
22 racing commission operating account, the life sciences discovery  
23 fund, the Washington state heritage center account, the reduced  
24 cigarette ignition propensity account, the center for childhood  
25 deafness and hearing loss account, the school for the blind account,  
26 the Millersylvania park trust fund, the public employees' and  
27 retirees' insurance reserve fund, and the radiation perpetual  
28 maintenance fund.

29 (c) The following accounts and funds must receive eighty percent  
30 of their proportionate share of earnings based upon each account's or  
31 fund's average daily balance for the period: The advanced right-of-  
32 way revolving fund, the advanced environmental mitigation revolving  
33 account, the federal narcotics asset forfeitures account, the high  
34 occupancy vehicle account, the local rail service assistance account,  
35 and the miscellaneous transportation programs account.

36 (d) Any state agency that has independent authority over accounts  
37 or funds not statutorily required to be held in the custody of the  
38 state treasurer that deposits funds into a fund or account in the  
39 custody of the state treasurer pursuant to an agreement with the  
40 office of the state treasurer shall receive its proportionate share

1 of earnings based upon each account's or fund's average daily balance  
2 for the period.

3 (5) In conformance with Article II, section 37 of the state  
4 Constitution, no trust accounts or funds shall be allocated earnings  
5 without the specific affirmative directive of this section."

6 Renumber the remaining section consecutively and correct any  
7 internal references accordingly.

8 On page 4, line 18 of the title amendment, after "insert" insert  
9 "amending RCW 43.79A.040;" and beginning on line 19 after "28A.415  
10 RCW;" strike "adding a new section" and insert "adding new sections"

EFFECT: (1) Transfers administration and coordination of the  
Washington History Day Program (Program) from the Washington State  
Historical Society (WSHS) to the Office of the Superintendent of  
Public Instruction (OSPI), effective July 1, 2018.

(2) Specifies that the Program must be operated as a partnership  
between WSHS, OSPI, and private parties interested in providing  
funding and in kind support.

(3) Creates a new nonappropriated Washington History Day Account  
in the custody of the Washington state treasurer.

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
