- 4 (1) A legislative task force on marine finfish net pen aquaculture
- 5 is established. The purpose of the task force is to gather evidence
- 6 and make recommendations regarding marine fin fish net per
- 7 aquaculture in state marine waters.
- 8 (2) The task force must consist of the following members:
- 9 (a) Two members from each of the two largest caucuses of the senate,
- 10 appointed by the leaders of each major caucus of the senate;
- 11 (b) Two members from each of the two largest caucuses of the house
- 12 of representatives, appointed by the leaders of each major caucus of
- 13 the house of representatives;
- 14 (c) A representative from the department of ecology, appointed by
- 15 the director of the department of ecology;
- 16 (d) A representative from the department of fish and wildlife,
- 17 appointed by the director of the department of fish and wildlife;
- 18 (e) A representative from the natural resources board, appointed by
- 19 a majority vote of the board;
- 20 (f) A representative from the department of agriculture, appointed
- 21 by the director of the department of agriculture
- 22 (g) One representative from a nonnative finfish net pen aquaculture
- 23 operator;
- 24 (h) One representative from a native finfish net pen aquaculture
- 25 organization or operator;
- 26 (i) Representatives of two federally recognized Indian tribes; at
- 27 least one of which must have aquaculture operations.

- 1 (j) Three representatives from the scientific community with an
- 2 emphasis on salmon run recovery, salmon biology and health, and
- 3 marine ecosystem health.
- 4 (k) One representative from the Washington Association of Fish
- 5 Growers.
- 6 (3) The first meeting of the task force must occur by June 30, 2018.
- 7 (4) Staff support for the task force must be provided by the office
- 8 of program research and senate committee services. The department of
- 9 ecology and the department of fish and wildlife shall cooperate with
- 10 the task force and provide information as the chair reasonably
- 11 requests.
- 12 (5) Within existing appropriations, the expenses of the operations
- 13 of the task force, including the expenses associated with the task
- 14 force's meetings, must be paid jointly and in equal amounts by the
- 15 senate and the house of representatives. Task force expenditures are
- 16 subject to approval by the house executive rules committee and the
- 17 senate facility and operations committee. Legislative members of the
- 18 task force are reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW
- 19 44.04.120. Nonlegislative members are not entitled to be reimbursed
- 20 for travel expenses if they are elected officials or are
- 21 participating on behalf of an employer, governmental entity, or
- 22 other organization. Any reimbursement for other nonlegislative
- 23 members is subject to chapter 43.03 RCW.
- 24 (7) The task force shall have two co-chairs. One co-chair shall be a
- 25 member of the majority caucus from the S
- 26 (8) By November 15, 2019, the joint legislative task force must make
- 27 recommendations to the legislature.
- 28 (9) The joint legislative task force expires December 31, 2019.
- 29 (10) This section expires January 1, 2020.
  - EFFECT: Makes the bill a task force with recommendations required to the legislature by November 15, 2019.
