29 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
30 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
31 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
32 state council of firefighters.

33 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
34 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten
35 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)
36 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate
37 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting
38 service before ten years of service have been completed, the

1 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the
2 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer
3 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,
4 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter
5 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will
6 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying
7 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates
8 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their
9 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a
10 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be
11 surrendered upon conviction.

12 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2017 c 25 s 3 and 2017 c 11 s 4 are
13 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

14 (1) The department shall:

15 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW
16 46.17.220;

17 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial
18 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and
19 collection expenses incurred by it; and

20 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state
21 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

22 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor
23 vehicle account until the department determines that the state has
24 been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license
25 plate. Upon determination by the department that the state has been
26 reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special
27 license plate fee amounts for each special license plate to the
28 following appropriate account as created in this section in the
29 custody of the state treasurer:

16 (3) Only the director or the director's designee may authorize
17 expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this
18 section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under
19 chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for
20 expenditures.

21 (4) Funds in the special license plate accounts described in
22 subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the
23 conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under
24 contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations
25 that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this
26 section.

27 (5) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit
28 organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in
29 Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status
30 under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization
31 must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

32 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.300
33 RCW to read as follows:

34 **ACADEMIC, INNOVATION, AND MENTORING GRANT ACCOUNT.** The academic,
35 innovation, and mentoring grant account is created in the state
36 treasury. All receipts from the special license plate fees in this
37 act must be deposited into the account. Moneys in the account may be
38 spent only after appropriation. Moneys in the account may only be

1 used for grants to support youth to stay in school and receive
2 mentorships.

3 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** RCW 46.18.215 (Baseball stadium license
4 plates) and 2011 c 332 s 3, 2010 c 161 s 614, 1997 c 291 s 5, 1995
5 3rd sp.s. c 1 s 102, 1994 c 194 s 2, & 1990 c 250 s 1 are each
6 repealed.

7 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 6.** This act takes effect January 1, 2019."

8 On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "plate;" strike the
9 remainder of the title and insert "reenacting and amending RCW
10 46.17.220, 46.18.200, and 46.68.420; adding a new section to chapter
11 28A.300 RCW; repealing RCW 46.18.215; and providing an effective
12 date."

EFFECT: Changes the name of the academic, mentoring, and
innovation grant account to the academic, innovation, and mentoring
grant account to align with the existing program that is administered
by the Office of the Superintendent of Public Instruction. Removes
participating in sports as an allowable grant use from the account.
