- 1 AN ACT Relating to pro bono legal services for military service
- 2 members, veterans, and their families; adding new sections to chapter
- 3 43.10 RCW; and creating a new section.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) There is hereby created an office of
- 6 military and veteran legal assistance within the office of the
- 7 attorney general for the purpose of promoting and facilitating civil
- 8 legal assistance programs, pro bono services, and self-help services
- 9 for military service members, veterans, and their family members
- 10 domiciled or stationed in Washington state.
- 11 (2) For the purposes of this section and section 2 of this act,
- 12 the following definitions apply:
- 13 (a) The term "service member" means an active or reserve member
- 14 in any branch of the armed forces of the United States, including the
- 15 national guard, coast guard, and armed forces reserves.
- 16 (b) The term "veteran" has the same meaning as defined in RCW
- 17 41.04.005 and 41.04.007.
- 18 (c) The term "family member" means the spouse or domestic partner
- 19 and dependent minor children of a service member or veteran.
- 20 (3) The attorney general may not provide legal assistance
- 21 programs, pro bono services, or self-help services to a service

- 1 member, veteran, or family member with regard to a criminal
- 2 prosecution.
- 3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** The office of military and veteran legal 4 assistance shall:
- 5 (1) Recruit and train volunteer attorneys, identify service 6 programs available to perform pro bono services for service members, 7 veterans, and their family members, and create and maintain a 8 registry of the same;
- 9 (2) Assess and assign requests for pro bono services to volunteer 10 attorneys and service programs registered with the office of military 11 and veteran legal assistance; and
- (3) Establish an advisory committee to include, among others, 12 13 representatives from legal assistance offices on military installations in the state, the office of civil legal aid, the 14 15 Washington state bar association's legal assistance to military 16 personnel section, the Washington state veterans bar association, the 17 Washington department of veterans affairs, the Washington military department, veteran service organizations, military 18 organizations, and organizations involved in coordinating, 19 20 supporting, and delivering civil legal aid and pro bono legal services in Washington state. The committee shall provide advice and 21 assistance to the attorney general regarding program design, 22 23 operation, volunteer recruitment and support strategies, service 24 delivery objectives and priorities, and funding.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. The attorney general may apply for and receive grants, gifts, donations, bequests, or other contributions to help support and to be used exclusively for the operations of the office of military and veteran legal assistance.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. Sections 1 through 3 of this act are each added to chapter 43.10 RCW.
- NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** If specific funding for the purposes of this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not provided by June 30, 2017, in the omnibus appropriations act, this act is null and void.
