- 1 AN ACT Relating to reimbursement for services provided pursuant
- 2 to community assistance referral and education services programs;
- 3 amending RCW 35.21.930; adding a new section to chapter 74.09 RCW;
- 4 and creating a new section.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 74.09 7 RCW to read as follows:
- 8 The authority shall adopt standards for the reimbursement of
- 9 health care services provided to eligible clients by fire departments
- 10 pursuant to a community assistance referral and education services
- 11 program under RCW 35.21.930. The standards must allow payment for
- 12 covered health care services provided to individuals whose medical
- 13 needs do not require ambulance transport to an emergency department.
- 14 **Sec. 2.** RCW 35.21.930 and 2015 c 93 s 1 are each amended to read 15 as follows:
- 16 (1) Any fire department may develop a community assistance 17 referral and education services program to provide community outreach
- referral and education services program to provide community outreach and assistance to residents of its jurisdiction in order to improve
- 19 population health and advance injury and illness prevention within
- 20 its community. The program should identify members of the community

1 who use the 911 system or emergency department for low acuity assistance calls (calls that are nonemergency or nonurgent) and 2 3 connect them to their primary care providers, other health care professionals, low-cost medication programs, and other social 4 services. The program may partner with hospitals to reduce 5 readmissions. The program may also provide nonemergency contact 6 information in order to provide an alternative resource to the 911 7 The program may hire or contract with health care 8 professionals as needed to provide these services, 9 10 emergency medical technicians certified under chapter 18.73 RCW and advanced emergency medical technicians and paramedics certified under 11 12 chapter 18.71 RCW. The services provided by emergency medical technicians, advanced emergency medical technicians, and paramedics 13 14 must be under the responsible supervision and direction of approved medical program director. Nothing in this section authorizes 15 16 emergency medical technician, advanced emergency 17 technician, or paramedic to perform medical procedures they are not 18 trained and certified to perform.

(2) ((A participating fire department may seek grant opportunities and private gifts)) In order to support its community assistance referral and education services program, a participating fire department may seek grant opportunities and private gifts, and, by resolution or ordinance, establish and collect reasonable charges for these services.

- (3) In developing a community assistance referral and education services program, a fire department may consult with the health workforce council to identify health care professionals capable of working in a nontraditional setting and providing assistance, referral, and education services.
- (4) Community assistance referral and education services programs implemented under this section must, at least annually, measure any reduction of repeated use of the 911 emergency system and any reduction in avoidable emergency room trips attributable to implementation of the program. Results of findings under this subsection must be reportable to the legislature or other local governments upon request. Findings should include estimated amounts of medicaid dollars that would have been spent on emergency room visits had the program not been in existence.
- (5) For purposes of this section, "fire department" includes city and town fire departments, fire protection districts organized under

- 1 Title 52 RCW, regional fire protection service authorities organized
- 2 under chapter 52.26 RCW, providers of emergency medical services
- 3 ((that)) eligible to levy a tax under RCW 84.52.069, and federally
- 4 recognized Indian tribes.
- 5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 3.** If specific funding for the purposes of
- 6 this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not
- 7 provided by June 30, 2017, in the omnibus appropriations act, this
- 8 act is null and void.
