- AN ACT Relating to preventing unfunded mandates involving on-site sewage systems from affecting local governments and property owners; adding a new section to chapter 36.70A RCW; adding a new section to chapter 70.118A RCW; and adding a new section to chapter 70.05 RCW.
- 5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 36.70A 7 RCW to read as follows:
- This chapter, including but not limited to RCW 36.70A.070 (1) and 8 9 (5), does not preclude certain counties from authorizing inspections on-site systems be conducted, in 10 sewage to appropriate 11 circumstances, by a homeowner, a homeowner's family member, or a homeowner's tenant that has completed certification requirements 12 13 specified by the county. If a county, the department of ecology, or a 14 local health jurisdiction has identified a water quality problem that is linked to poorly functioning on-site sewage systems, a county 15 16 ordinance that authorizes the self-inspection of an on-site sewage 17 system may only do so consistent with the following conditions:
- 18 (1) The on-site sewage system is not in an area that has been 19 designated pursuant to RCW 70.118A.040;

1 (2) The on-site sewage system treats sewage only from a 2 residential source that is either a single-family residence or a 3 duplex;

- (3) The on-site sewage system uses a gravity flow subsurface absorption system that does not rely on electrical components in order to function;
- (4) The on-site sewage system is not being operated pursuant to a permit issued, consistent with WAC 246-272A-0280 as it existed as of the effective date of this section, to a system that has previously failed;
- 11 (5) The person performing the inspection of the on-site sewage 12 system is the owner of the property, a family member of the owner of 13 the property, or a resident of the property; and
- 14 (6) The local health jurisdiction makes available educational 15 materials, training opportunities, and reasonable levels of technical 16 assistance in support of property owners choosing to self-inspect 17 their residential on-site sewage systems.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. A new section is added to chapter 70.118A RCW to read as follows:
- Nothing in this chapter prohibits a county from relying on selfinspection of on-site sewage systems consistent with section 1 of this act for the purposes of protecting the quality or quantity of surface or groundwater resources under chapter 36.70A RCW.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 70.05 RCW to read as follows:
- Nothing in this chapter prohibits a county from relying on selfinspection of on-site sewage systems consistent with section 1 of this act for the purposes of protecting the quality or quantity of surface or groundwater resources under chapter 36.70A RCW.
