- AN ACT Relating to dental professions; amending RCW 18.32.0351
- 2 and 18.260.090; and reenacting and amending RCW 18.32.040.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 4 **Sec. 1.** RCW 18.32.0351 and 2007 c 269 s 16 are each amended to read as follows:

Washington state dental quality assurance commission

- 7 established, consisting of ((sixteen)) seventeen members each 8 appointed by the governor to a four-year term. No member may serve 9 more than two consecutive full terms. In appointing the initial 10 members of the commission, it is the intent of the legislature that,
- 11 to the extent possible, members of the previous boards and committees
- 12 regulating these professions be appointed to the commission. Members
- 13 of the commission hold office until their successors are appointed.
- 14 The governor may appoint members of the initial commission to
- 15 staggered terms of from one to four years. Thereafter, all members
- 16 shall be appointed to full four-year terms. Twelve members of the
- 17 commission must be dentists, two members must be expanded function
- 18 dental auxiliaries licensed under chapter 18.260 RCW, and ((two))
- 19 <u>three</u> members must be public members.

- 1 **Sec. 2.** RCW 18.260.090 and 2007 c 269 s 8 are each amended to 2 read as follows:
- (1) The commission shall issue an initial credential or renewal credential to an applicant who has met the requirements for a credential or deny an initial credential or renewal credential based upon failure to meet the requirements for a credential or unprofessional conduct or impairment governed by chapter 18.130 RCW.
- 8 (2) The commission may adopt rules for renewal requirements for a
 9 credential, including continuing education requirements for expanded
 10 function dental auxiliary licenses.
- 11 **Sec. 3.** RCW 18.32.040 and 2005 c 454 s 2 and 2005 c 274 s 222 12 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- The commission shall require that every applicant for a license to practice dentistry shall:
- 15 (1) Present satisfactory evidence of graduation from a dental 16 college, school, or dental department of an institution approved by 17 the commission; and
- 18 (2) ((Submit, for the files of the commission, a recent picture 19 duly identified and attested; and
- 20 (3))(a) Pass an examination prepared or approved by and administered under the direction of the commission. The dentistry 21 licensing examination shall consist of practical and written tests 22 upon such subjects and of such scope as the commission determines. 23 24 The commission shall set the standards for passing the examination. 25 The secretary shall keep on file the examination papers and records of examination for at least one year. This file shall be open for 26 27 inspection by the applicant or the applicant's agent unless the 28 disclosure will compromise the examination process as determined by the commission or is exempted from disclosure under chapter 42.56 29 30 RCW.
- 31 (b) The commission may accept, in lieu of all or part of the 32 written examination required in (a) of this subsection, a certificate 33 granted by a national or regional testing organization approved by 34 the commission.
- 35 The commission shall accept, in lieu of the practical examination required in (a) of this subsection, proof that 36 satisfactorily completed 37 applicant has a postdoctoral dental 38 residency accredited the commission program by dental 39 accreditation of the American dental association and approved by the

1 commission, of one to three year's duration, in a community health clinic that serves predominantly low-income patients or is located in 2 a dental care health professional shortage area in this state, and 3 that includes an outcome assessment evaluation, other than the 4 western regional examining board's clinical examination, assessing 5 6 the resident's competence to practice dentistry. The commission shall develop criteria, consistent with the standards of the commission on 7 dental accreditation of the American dental association, for 8 community clinics to use when sponsoring students in a residency 9 program under this subsection, including guidelines for the proper 10 supervision of the resident and measuring the resident's competence 11 12 to practice dentistry.
