HOUSE BILL 1679

State of Washington 65th Legislature 2017 Regular Session

By Representatives Goodman, Klippert, Pettigrew, Chapman, Hayes, Muri, Hudgins, and Robinson; by request of Department of Corrections

Read first time 01/26/17. Referred to Committee on Public Safety.

AN ACT Relating to issuing a two-year identicard for offenders released from prison facilities; amending RCW 46.20.117 and 46.20.117; adding a new section to chapter 72.09 RCW; creating new sections; providing an effective date; and providing an expiration date.

- 6 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 7 NEW SECTION. The legislature intends to create an Sec. 1. identicard program to assist incarcerated offenders to obtain a 8 9 state-issued identicard to aid and prepare offenders for release from prison and reentry into the community. The legislature finds that 10 11 each step that assists individuals being released from prisons helps incarcerated offenders avoid predictable conditions that lead to 12 future recidivism. In accordance with executive order 16-05 building 13 14 safe and strong communities through successful reentry, this act intends to ensure that offenders released from state prisons have 15 16 adequate identification in order to increase public safety and reduce 17 recidivism.
- 18 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 72.09
- 19 RCW to read as follows:

- 1 (1) The department, working in conjunction with the department of 2 licensing, shall create and implement an identicard program to 3 provide offenders released within Washington state a state-issued 4 identicard pursuant to RCW 46.20.117.
 - (2) An offender is eligible for an original, renewal, or replacement identicard pursuant to this section, provided he or she:
- 7 (a) Meets the department of licensing criteria under RCW 8 46.20.117;
- 9 (b) Is sentenced to the custody of the department, and is 10 incarcerated within a correctional facility with an earned release 11 date that is more than one year from his or her admission date;
- 12 (c) Has not been found by the United States attorney general to 13 be subject to a deportation detainer or order and does not become 14 subject to a deportation order during the period of incarceration; 15 and
- 16 (d) Is expected to be released to a location within Washington 17 state.
- 18 (3) The department may seek reimbursement for the cost of the 19 identicard issued to offenders pursuant to this section. The 20 department may deduct the cost of the identicard from either the 21 offender's mandatory savings account; or from funds that have been 22 received on the offender's behalf specifically for this purpose.
- 23 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.20.117 and 2012 c 80 s 6 are each amended to read 24 as follows:
- 25 (1) **Issuance**. The department shall issue an identicard, 26 containing a picture, if the applicant:
- 27 (a)(i) Does not hold a valid Washington driver's license;
- 28 $((\frac{b}{b}))$ (ii) Proves his or her identity as required by RCW 29 46.20.035; and
- ((\(\frac{(+e)}{c}\)) (iii) Pays the required fee. Except as provided in (b) of this subsection or subsection (5) of this section, the fee is ((\(\frac{forty-five dollars from October 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, and))\)

 fifty-four dollars ((\(\frac{after June 30, 2013}{c}\))), unless an applicant is a recipient of continuing public assistance grants under Title 74 RCW, who is referred in writing by the secretary of social and health services. For those persons the fee must be the actual cost of

- 1 (i) A valid identification card issued by the department of 2 corrections may serve as sufficient proof of identity and residency 3 for an applicant under this subsection (1)(b);
- 4 <u>(ii) An identicard issued under this subsection (1)(b) must</u>
 5 <u>expire two years from the first anniversary of the offender's</u>
 6 <u>birthdate after issuance; and</u>
- 7 (iii) The department may charge the department of corrections a 8 fee of eighteen dollars for an identicard issued under this 9 subsection (1)(b).

- 11 (a) Be distinctly designed so that it will not be confused with 12 the official driver's license; and
- 13 (b) Except as provided in subsection <u>(1)(b) or</u> (5) of this 14 section, expire on the sixth anniversary of the applicant's birthdate 15 after issuance.
- 16 (3) **Renewal**. An application for identicard renewal may be 17 submitted by means of:
 - (a) Personal appearance before the department; or
 - (b) Mail or electronic commerce, if permitted by rule of the department and if the applicant did not renew his or her identicard by mail or by electronic commerce when it last expired.
 - An identicard may not be renewed by mail or by electronic commerce unless the renewal issued by the department includes a photograph of the identicard holder.
 - (4) **Cancellation**. The department may cancel an identicard if the holder of the identicard used the card or allowed others to use the card in violation of RCW 46.20.0921.
 - (5) Alternative issuance/renewal/extension. The department may issue or renew an identicard for a period other than five years from October 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, or six years after June 30, 2013, or may extend by mail or electronic commerce an identicard that has already been issued, in order to evenly distribute, as nearly as possible, the yearly renewal rate of identicard holders. The fee for an identicard issued or renewed for a period other than five years from October 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, or six years after June 30, 2013, or that has been extended by mail or electronic commerce, is nine dollars for each year that the identicard is issued, renewed, or extended. The department may adopt any rules as are necessary to carry out this subsection.

An identicard may not be renewed by mail or by electronic commerce unless the renewal issued by the department includes a photograph of the identicard holder.

- (4) Cancellation. The department may cancel an identicard if the holder of the identicard used the card or allowed others to use the card in violation of RCW 46.20.0921.
- (5) Alternative issuance/renewal/extension. The department may 7 issue or renew an identicard for a period other than five years from 8 October 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, or six years after June 30, 2013, 9 or may extend by mail or electronic commerce an identicard that has 10 11 already been issued, in order to evenly distribute, as nearly as possible, the yearly renewal rate of identicard holders. The fee for 12 an identicard issued or renewed for a period other than five years 13 from October 1, 2012, to June 30, 2013, or six years after June 30, 14 2013, or that has been extended by mail or electronic commerce, is 15 16 nine dollars for each year that the identicard is issued, renewed, or 17 extended. The department may adopt any rules as are necessary to 18 carry out this subsection.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. The department of corrections and the department of licensing may enter into a memorandum of understanding to meet the requirements of this act, and have discretion to implement this act over a period of time not to exceed twelve months from the effective date of this section.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 6. Section 4 of this act takes effect August 30, 2017.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 7. Section 3 of this act expires August 30, 27 2017.
