## HOUSE BILL 1792

State of Washington 65th Legislature 2017 Regular Session

- 1 AN ACT Relating to investigative costs for residential services
- 2 and supports programs; adding new sections to chapter 71A.12 RCW;
- 3 providing an effective date; and declaring an emergency.
- 4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- INTENT. 5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. The legislature finds that 6 Washington's system to support persons with developmental 7 intellectual disabilities in chapter 388-101 WAC of the supported living program of the residential services and supports program 8 9 should more aggressively investigate and resolve complaints of abuse or neglect for the vulnerable populations it serves. The legislature 10 intends to address current funding levels that limit the department
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- 12 of social and health services' ability to promote vulnerable adult
- 13 protections in the program. The legislature further intends that the
- 14 cost of complaint investigation should be supported by an appropriate
- 15 certification fee paid by the regulated businesses.
- 16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 2.** RESIDENTIAL SERVICES AND SUPPORTS
- 17 CERTIFICATION FEES. (1) Before the issuance of initial certification
- 18 for the residential services and supports program, the applicant
- 19 shall pay a certification fee. After initial certification, the
- 20 certified provider must also pay an annual certification fee.

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- 1 Beginning July 1, 2017, and thereafter, the initial and annual certification fees must be established in the omnibus appropriations 2 and any amendment or additions made to that act. 3 certification fees established in the omnibus appropriations act and 4 any amendment or additions made to that act may not exceed the 5 б department's costs for investigation of complaints about provider 7 practice and individuals alleged to have abused, abandoned, or exploited clients. The certification fees must include 8 all of the department's cost of paying providers for the amount of 9 the certification fee attributed to medicaid clients. 10
- 11 (2) No fee may be required of government-operated programs, the 12 portion of certified residential services and supports clients for 13 whom the program pays licensing fees under chapter 70.128 or 18.20 14 RCW, or court-appointed receivers.
- 15 Sec. 3. DEPARTMENT DUTIES. The department shall NEW SECTION. 16 use additional investigative resources to address a significant growth in the residential services and supports program complaint 17 18 workload. The department shall use the resources to intervene for 19 clients in a timelier manner when there is possible abuse or neglect. 20 "Complaints," as used in this section, include both complaints about provider practice, under this 21 chapter, and complaints individuals alleged to have abused, neglected, abandoned, 22 exploited clients, under chapter 74.34 RCW. 23
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 4. Sections 1 through 3 of this act are each added to chapter 71A.12 RCW.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 5. This act is necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes effect July 1, 2017.

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
