- AN ACT Relating to providing support for foster youth 1
- 2 obtaining drivers' licenses and automobile liability insurance;
- adding a new section to chapter 74.13 3 RCW; and
- 4 appropriation.
- BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON: 5
- 6 Sec. 1. A new section is added to chapter 74.13 7 RCW to read as follows:
- (1) Subject to the availability of funds appropriated for this 8 specific purpose, the department shall contract with a private 9 nonprofit organization that agrees to work collaboratively with 10 11 independent living providers and the department and is selected after 12 a competitive application process to provide driver's license support for foster youth, including youth receiving extended foster care
- 13
- 14 services.
- (2) The nonprofit organization selected pursuant to subsection 15
- 16 (1) of this section shall provide support for foster youth ages
- 17 fifteen through twenty-one, including youth receiving extended foster
- care services, in navigating the driver's licensing process. This 18
- support must include: 19
- 20 (a) Reimbursement of fees necessary for a foster youth to obtain
- 21 a driver's instruction permit, an intermediate license, and a

- (b) Reimbursement of fees required for a foster youth to complete a driver training education course, if the foster youth is under the age of eighteen, as outlined in chapter 46.82 or 28A.220 RCW;
- (c) Reimbursement of the increase in motor vehicle liability insurance costs incurred by foster parents, relative placements, or other foster placements adding a foster youth to his or her motor vehicle liability insurance policy.
- (3) By December 1, 2019, the nonprofit organization selected 10 11 pursuant to subsection (1) of this section shall submit a report to 12 the department and the appropriate committees of the legislature, including the transportation committees of the 13 legislature, documenting the number of foster youth served by the program, the 14 average cost per youth served, and recommendations for future policy 15 16 or statutory or funding changes necessary to more effectively allow foster youth to obtain drivers' licenses and motor vehicle liability 17 18 insurance.
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. The sum of eight hundred thousand dollars, or as much thereof as may be necessary, is appropriated for the fiscal biennium ending June 30, 2019, from the highway safety fund to the department of social and health services for the purposes of this act.
