- AN ACT Relating to providing funding for the hunter education training program operated by the department of fish and wildlife through the issuance of national rifle association special license plates; amending RCW 77.15.425; reenacting and amending RCW 46.18.200, 46.17.220, and 46.68.425; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW; and providing an effective date.
- 7 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- 8 **Sec. 1.** RCW 46.18.200 and 2016 c 36 s 1, 2016 c 30 s 1, 2016 c 9 16 s 1, and 2016 c 15 s 1 are each reenacted and amended to read as 10 follows:
- 11 (1) Special license plate series reviewed and approved by the 12 department:
- 13 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized 14 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license 15 plates unless otherwise specified;
- 16 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the 17 department;
- 18 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter 19 46.87 RCW; and
- 20 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

- (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington state council of firefighters.
- (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b) have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting service before ten years of service have been completed, the volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the

1 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer 2 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves, the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter 3 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will 4 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying 5 6 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates 7 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a 8 9 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be surrendered upon conviction. 10

- **Sec. 2.** RCW 46.17.220 and 2016 c 36 s 2, 2016 c 31 s 2, 2016 c 30 s 3, 2016 c 16 s 2, and 2016 c 15 s 2 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
- (1) In addition to all fees and taxes required to be paid upon application for a vehicle registration in chapter 46.16A RCW, the holder of a special license plate shall pay the appropriate special license plate fee as listed in this section.

- 6 (2) After deducting administration and collection expenses for 7 the sale of baseball stadium license plates, the remaining proceeds must be distributed to a county for the purpose of paying the 8 principal and interest payments on bonds issued by the county to 9 10 construct a baseball stadium, as defined in RCW 82.14.0485, including 11 reasonably necessary preconstruction costs, while the taxes are being 12 collected under RCW 82.14.360. After this date, the state treasurer 13 shall credit the funds to the state general fund.
- 14 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.68.425 and 2016 c 31 s 3 and 2016 c 30 s 4 are 15 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:
 - (1) The department shall:

- 17 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW 18 46.17.220;
- 19 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial 20 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and 21 collection expenses incurred by it; and
- 22 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state 23 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.
- 24 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor 25 vehicle fund until the department determines that the state has been 26 reimbursed for the cost of implementing the special license plate. 27 Upon determination by the department that the state has been 28 reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the remaining special 29 license plate fees to the following accounts by special license plate 30 type:

11 Sec. 4. RCW 77.15.425 and 2016 c 2 s 6 (Initiative Measure No. 12 1401) are each amended to read as follows:

The fish and wildlife enforcement reward account is created in the custody of the state treasurer. Deposits to the account include: Receipts from fish and shellfish overages as a result of a department enforcement action; fees for hunter education deferral applications; fees for master hunter applications and master hunter certification renewals; fees for national rifle association license plates as provided in RCW 46.68.425; all receipts from criminal wildlife penalty assessments under this chapter; all receipts of court-ordered restitution or donations associated with any fish, shellfish, wildlife enforcement action; and proceeds from forfeitures evidence pursuant to RCW 77.15.070 and 77.15.100. The department may accept money or personal property from persons under conditions requiring the property or money to be used consistent with the intent expenditures from the fish and wildlife enforcement reward Expenditures from the account. account may be used only for investigation and prosecution of fish and wildlife offenses, provide rewards to persons informing the department about violations this title and rules adopted under this title, to offset department-approved costs incurred to administer the hunter education deferral program and the master hunter permit program, enhanced support of firearm safety and education as part of the hunter education training program under RCW 77.32.155, and for other valid enforcement uses as determined by the commission. Only the director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from the account. The account is subject to allotment procedures under
