- 1 AN ACT Relating to increasing the availability of sexual assault
- 2 nurse examiners; and creating a new section.
- 3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:
- NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) The office of crime victims advocacy shall develop best practices that local communities may use on a voluntary basis to create mobile sexual assault nurse examiner teams and multidisciplinary teams to serve sexual assault survivors in local communities.
- 9 (a) When developing the best practices, the office of crime 10 victims advocacy shall consult with:
- (i) The Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs;
  - (ii) The Washington association of prosecuting attorneys;
- (iii) The Washington coalition of sexual assault programs;
- 14 (iv) The Harborview center for sexual assault and traumatic 15 stress;
- 16 (v) The Washington state association of counties;
- 17 (vi) The association of Washington cities; and

18 (vii) Other organizations deemed appropriate by the office of 19 crime victims advocacy.

- 1 (b) The office of crime victims advocacy shall complete the best 2 practices no later than January 1, 2018, and publish them on its web 3 site.
- 4 (2) The office of crime victims advocacy shall develop strategies 5 to make sexual assault nurse examiner training available to nurses in 6 all regions of the state without requiring the nurses to travel 7 unreasonable distances or incur unreasonable expenses.
- 8 (a) When developing the strategies, the office of crime victims 9 advocacy shall consult with:
- 10 (i) The Harborview center for sexual assault and traumatic 11 stress;
- 12 (ii) The department of health;
- 13 (iii) The nursing care quality assurance commission;
- 14 (iv) The Washington state nurses association; and
- 15 (v) Other organizations deemed appropriate by the office of crime 16 victims advocacy.
- 17 (b) The office of crime victims advocacy shall report the 18 strategies to the governor and the appropriate committees of the 19 legislature no later than January 1, 2018.
