State of Washington 65th Legislature 2018 Regular Session

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AN ACT Relating to the need for substitutes in schools; amending RCW 41.32.068; adding a new section to chapter 41.35 RCW; creating a new section; and repealing 2016 c 233 s 19 (uncodified).

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. School employees who retire using early 6 retirement factors known as the 2008 ERFs are essentially prohibited 7 from working in any capacity for employers that are part of the state 2016, the legislature created a narrow 8 retirement system. In 9 exception that allowed retirees in the teachers' retirement system who retired under the 2008 ERFs to work only as substitute teachers 10 11 for a limited number of hours per year. This exception was created in 12 response to the teacher shortages seen across the state, which have 13 severely depleted the numbers of available substitutes. School 14 districts face challenges in other areas too, such as finding substitute bus drivers, counselors, and paraprofessionals. Retired 15 16 school employees have the experience that allows them to step in and 17 the best educational services for maintain our students when are needed. Therefore, is the 18 substitutes it intent of the 19 legislature to allow a narrow exception to the 2008 early retirement structure to allow those retirees to serve as substitutes in roles 20 21 that directly serve students.

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Sec. 2. RCW 41.32.068 and 2016 c 233 s 7 are each amended to 1 2 read as follows:

In addition to the postretirement employment options available in 3 RCW 41.32.802 or 41.32.862((, and only until August 1, 2020)), a 4 ((teacher)) retiree in plan 2 or plan 3 who has retired under the 5 6 alternate early retirement provisions of RCW 41.32.765(3)(b) or 7 41.32.875(3)(b) may be employed with an employer for up to eight hundred sixty-seven hours per calendar year without suspension of his 8 9 or her benefit, provided that: (1) The retired ((teacher)) educator reenters employment more than one calendar month after his or her 10 11 accrual date and after June 9, 2016; and (2) (([the retired 12 teacher])) the retired educator is employed ((exclusively as either a substitute teacher as defined in RCW 41.32.010(48)(a) in an 13 14 instructional capacity, as opposed to other capacities identified in RCW 41.32.010(49); and (3) the employing school district compensates 15 16 the district's substitute teachers at a rate that is at least eighty-17 five percent of the full daily amount allocated by the state to the district for substitute teacher compensation)) in a nonadministrative 18 position. 19

20 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. A new section is added to chapter 41.35 RCW to read as follows: 21

In addition to the postretirement employment options available in 22 23 RCW 41.35.060, a retiree in the school employees retirement system 24 plan 2 or plan 3 who has retired under the alternate early retirement 25 provisions of RCW 41.35.420(3)(b) or 41.35.680(3)(b) may be employed 26 with an employer for up to eight hundred sixty-seven hours per 27 calendar year without suspension of his or her benefit, provided that: (1) The retired educator reenters employment more than one 28 calendar month after his or her accrual date; and (2) the retired 29 30 educator is employed in a nonadministrative position.

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<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. 2016 c 233 s 19 (uncodified) is repealed.

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
