1 AN ACT Relating to pro bono legal services for military service
2 members, veterans, and their families; and adding new sections to
3 chapter 43.10 RCW.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** (1) Subject to the availability of amounts
6 appropriated for this specific purpose, there is hereby created an
7 office of military and veteran legal assistance within the office of
8 the attorney general for the purpose of promoting and facilitating
9 civil legal assistance programs, pro bono services, and self-help
10 services for military service members, veterans, and their family
11 members domiciled or stationed in Washington state.

12 (2) For the purposes of sections 1 through 3 of this act, the
13 following definitions apply:

14 (a) The term "service member" means an active or reserve member
15 in any branch of the armed forces of the United States, including the
16 national guard, coast guard, and armed forces reserves.

17 (b) The term "veteran" has the same meaning as defined in RCW
18 41.04.005 and 41.04.007.

19 (c) The term "family member" means the spouse or domestic
20 partner, surviving spouse, surviving domestic partner, and dependent
21 minor children under twenty-one years of age of a living or deceased

1 service member or veteran for whom the service member or veteran
2 provided at least one-half of that person's support in the previous
3 one hundred eighty days before seeking assistance of the programs and
4 services authorized by this chapter.

5 (3) The attorney general may not directly provide legal
6 assistance, advice, or representation in any context, unless
7 otherwise authorized by law, and the attorney general may not provide
8 legal assistance programs, pro bono services, or self-help services
9 to a service member, veteran, or family member being criminally
10 prosecuted.

11 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** The office of military and veteran legal
12 assistance shall:

13 (1) Recruit and train volunteer attorneys and identify service
14 programs willing to perform pro bono services for service members,
15 veterans, and their family members, and create and maintain a
16 registry of the same;

17 (2) Assess and assign requests for pro bono services to volunteer
18 attorneys and service programs registered with the office; and

19 (3) Establish an advisory committee that will include, among
20 others, representatives from legal assistance offices on military
21 installations, the office of civil legal aid, the Washington state
22 bar association's legal assistance to military personnel section, the
23 Washington state veterans bar association, relevant office of
24 military service and support organizations, and organizations
25 involved in coordinating, supporting, and delivering civil legal aid
26 and pro bono legal services in Washington state. The committee shall
27 provide advice and assistance regarding program design, operation,
28 volunteer recruitment and support strategies, service delivery
29 objectives and priorities, and funding.

30 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** The attorney general may apply for and
31 receive grants, gifts, donations, bequests, or other contributions to
32 help support and to be used exclusively for the operations of the
33 office of military and veteran legal assistance.

34 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** Sections 1 through 3 of this act are each
35 added to chapter 43.10 RCW.
