1 AN ACT Relating to fire commissioner compensation; and amending 2 RCW 52.14.010.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 52.14.010 and 2012 c 174 s 1 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 The affairs of the district shall be managed by a board of fire commissioners composed initially of three registered voters residing 7 in the district except as provided in RCW 52.14.015 and 52.14.020. 8 Each member shall each receive one hundred four dollars per day or 9 10 portion thereof, not to exceed nine thousand nine hundred eighty-four 11 dollars per year, for time spent in actual attendance at official meetings of the board or in performance of other services or duties 12 on behalf of the district. 13

In addition, they shall receive necessary expenses incurred in attending meetings of the board or when otherwise engaged in district business, and shall be entitled to receive the same insurance available to all firefighters of the district: PROVIDED, That the premiums for such insurance, except liability insurance, shall be paid by the individual commissioners who elect to receive it.

20 Any commissioner may waive all or any portion of his or her 21 compensation payable under this section as to any month or months

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during his or her term of office, by a written waiver filed with the secretary as provided in this section. The waiver, to be effective, must be filed any time after the commissioner's election and prior to the date on which the compensation would otherwise be paid. The waiver shall specify the month or period of months for which it is made.

7 The board shall fix the compensation to be paid the secretary and 8 all other agents and employees of the district. The board may, by 9 resolution adopted by unanimous vote, authorize any of its members to 10 serve as volunteer firefighters without compensation. A commissioner 11 actually serving as a volunteer firefighter may enjoy the rights and 12 benefits of a volunteer firefighter.

The dollar thresholds established in this section must be 13 14 adjusted for inflation by the office of financial management every five years, beginning ((July 1, 2008)) January 1, 2019, based upon 15 16 changes in the consumer price index during that time period. 17 "Consumer price index" means, for any calendar year, that year's annual average consumer price index, for Washington state, for wage 18 19 earners and clerical workers, all items, compiled by the bureau of labor and statistics, United States department of labor. If the 20 21 bureau of labor and statistics develops more than one consumer price index for areas within the state, the index covering the greatest 22 number of people, covering areas exclusively within the boundaries of 23 the state, and including all items shall be used for the adjustments 24 25 for inflation in this section. The office of financial management 26 must calculate the new dollar threshold and transmit it to the office of the code reviser for publication in the Washington State Register 27 at least one month before the new dollar threshold is to take effect. 28

29 A person holding office as commissioner for two or more special purpose districts shall receive only that per diem compensation 30 31 authorized for one of his or her commissioner positions as 32 compensation for attending an official meeting or conducting official services or duties while representing more than one of his or her 33 districts. However, such commissioner may receive additional per diem 34 compensation if approved by resolution of all boards of the affected 35 36 commissions.

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
