1 AN ACT Relating to modifying the months in which the state 2 economic and revenue forecast is submitted; reenacting and amending 3 RCW 82.33.020; providing an effective date; and declaring an 4 emergency.

5 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

Sec. 1. RCW 82.33.020 and 2015 c 3 s 14, 2012 1st sp.s. c 8 s 3, and 2012 c 182 s 1 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows: (1) Four times each year the supervisor must prepare, subject to the approval of the economic and revenue forecast council under RCW 82.33.010:

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(a) An official state economic and revenue forecast;

(b) An unofficial state economic and revenue forecast based onoptimistic economic and revenue projections; and

14 (c) An unofficial state economic and revenue forecast based on15 pessimistic economic and revenue projections.

16 (2) The supervisor must submit forecasts prepared under this 17 section, along with any unofficial forecasts provided under RCW 18 82.33.010, to the governor and the members of the committees on ways 19 and means and the chairs of the committees on transportation of the 20 senate and house of representatives, including one copy to the staff 21 of each of the committees, on or before November 20th, February 20th

in the even-numbered years, March 20th in the odd-numbered years, 1 ((June)) July 27th, and September 27th. In fiscal year 2015, the 2 March 20th forecast ((shall)) <u>must</u> be submitted on or before February 3 20, 2015. All forecasts must include both estimated receipts and 4 estimated revenues in conformance with generally accepted accounting 5 б principles as provided by RCW 43.88.037. In odd-numbered years, the 7 period covered by forecasts for the state general fund and related funds must cover the current fiscal biennium and the next ensuing 8 fiscal biennium. In even-numbered years, the period covered by the 9 forecasts for the state general fund and related funds ((shall)) must 10 11 be current fiscal and the next two ensuing fiscal biennia.

12 (3) All agencies of state government must provide to the 13 supervisor immediate access to all information relating to economic 14 and revenue forecasts. Revenue collection information must be 15 available to the supervisor the first business day following the 16 conclusion of each collection period.

17 (4) The economic and revenue forecast supervisor and staff must 18 colocate and share information, data, and files with the tax research 19 section of the department of revenue but may not duplicate the duties 20 and functions of one another.

(5) As part of its forecasts under subsection (1) of this section, the supervisor must provide estimated revenue from tuition fees as defined in RCW 28B.15.020.

The economic and revenue forecast council must, 24 (6) in 25 consultation with the economic and revenue forecast work group 26 created in RCW 82.33.040, review the existing economic and revenue forecast council revenue model, data, and methodologies and in light 27 of recent economic changes, engage outside experts if necessary, and 28 29 recommend changes to the economic and revenue forecast council revenue forecasting process to increase confidence and promote 30 31 accuracy in the revenue forecast. The recommendations are due by 32 September 30, 2012, and every five years thereafter.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. This act is necessary for the immediate 34 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 35 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 36 effect June 1, 2017.
