### SENATE BILL 6095

AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; making appropriations and 1 2 authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; amending RCW 3 28B.10.027, 28B.20.725, and 28B.30.750; reenacting and amending RCW 43.19.501; amending 2017 3rd sp.s. c 4 ss 1017, 1040, 1059, 2001, 4 5 2003, 2006, 2009, 2014, 2017, 2019, 2026, 2035, 2036, 3046, 3072, 3120, 3148, 5021, 5026, 5027, 5028, 5031, 5032, 5040, 5071, 5072, 6 5074, 5075, 5011, 5016, and 5048 (uncodified); creating new 7 5073, 8 sections; making appropriations; and declaring an emergency.

9 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

10 Sec. 1. (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted NEW SECTION. 11 and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be 12 13 sufficient to accomplish the purposes designated, are hereby 14 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects during the period beginning July 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2019, 15 16 out of the several funds specified in this act.

17 (2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act18 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

(a) "Fiscal year 2018" or "FY 2018" means the period beginningJuly 1, 2017, and ending June 30, 2018.

(b) "Fiscal year 2019" or "FY 2019" means the period beginning
 July 1, 2018, and ending June 30, 2019.

3 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an 4 unappropriated status.

5 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent 6 only for the specified purpose.

7 (3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any 8 portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is 9 not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to 10 fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

11 (4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only 12 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior 13 14 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of 15 16 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what 17 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2019-2021 18 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not 19 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for 20 the project or program in the future.

21 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant 22 limitations 23 conditions and applicable to appropriations. shall be limited to the unexpended balances 24 Reappropriations 25 remaining on June 30, 2017, from previous biennial appropriations for 26 each project.

5 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following 6 conditions and limitations:

7 \$58,000,000 of the state taxable building construction (1)\$38,770,000 of account—state appropriation, the state building 8 construction account—state appropriation, and \$10,000,000 of 9 the 10 Washington housing trust account-state appropriation are provided 11 solely for affordable housing and preservation of affordable housing. 12 Of the amounts in this subsection:

(a) \$24,370,000 is provided solely for housing projects that provide supportive housing and case-management services to persons with chronic mental illness. The department must prioritize lowincome supportive housing unit proposals that provide services or include a partner community behavioral health treatment provider;

18 \$10,000,000 is provided solely for housing preservation (b) 19 grants or loans to be awarded competitively. The grants may be provided for major building improvements, preservation, and system 20 21 replacements, necessary for the existing housing trust fund portfolio 22 to maintain long-term viability. 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(i) The property is more than fifteen years old;

(ii) At least 50 percent of the housing units are occupied byfamilies and individuals at or below 30 percent area median income.

30 (iii) The improvements will result in reduction of operating or 31 utilities costs, or both; and

32 (iv) Other criteria that the department considers necessary to33 achieve the purpose of this program.

34 (c) \$5,000,000 is provided solely for housing projects that 35 benefit people at or below 80 percent of the area median income who 36 have been displaced by a natural disaster declared by the governor, 37 including people who have been displaced within the last two biennia.

(d) \$1,000,000 of the Washington housing trust account-state 1 2 appropriation is provided solely for the department to work with the 3 communities of concern commission to focus on creating capital assets 4 that will help reduce poverty and build stronger and more sustainable communities using the communities' cultural understanding and vision. 5 6 The funding must be used for predevelopment costs for capital projects identified by the commission and for other activities to 7 assist communities in developing capacity to create community-owned 8 9 capital assets.

10 (e) \$1,000,000 of the Washington housing trust account—state 11 appropriation is provided solely for a nonprofit, public development 12 authority, local government, or housing authority to purchase the 13 south annex properties located at 1531 Broadway, 1534 Broadway, and 14 909 Pine street owned by the state board of community and technical 15 colleges. The property must be used to provide services and housing 16 for homeless youth.

17 (f) \$21,987,000 is provided solely for the following list of 18 housing projects:

It is the intent of 29 the legislature that these grants serve projects with a total project 30 development cost per housing unit of less than \$125,000, excluding the value of land, and with a commitment by the applicant to maintain 31 the housing units for at least a twenty-five year period. Amounts 32 33 provided that are subject to this subsection must be used to plan, 34 predesign, design, provide technical assistance and financial services, purchase land for, and build innovative low-income housing 35 36 units. \$3,000,000 of the appropriation that is subject to this subsection is provided solely for innovative affordable housing in 37 38 Shelton and \$3,000,000 of the appropriation that is subject to this subsection is provided solely for innovative affordable housing for 39 40 veterans in Orting. 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services must be offered to residents of housing projects supported
 by appropriations in this subsection.

3 (viii) \$6,000,000 is provided solely for grants to the following 4 organizations using innovative methods to address homelessness: 5 \$3,000,000 for THA Arlington drive youth campus in Tacoma and 6 \$3,000,000 for a King county housing project.

7 (g) Of the amounts appropriated remaining after (a) through (f) 8 of this subsection, the department must allocate the funds as 9 follows:

10 (i) 10 percent is provided solely for housing projects that 11 benefit veterans;

12 (ii) 10 percent is provided solely for housing projects that 13 benefit homeownership;

14 (iii) 5 percent is provided solely for housing projects that 15 benefit people with developmental disabilities;

16 (iv) The remaining amount is provided solely for projects that 17 serve low-income and special needs populations in need of housing, 18 including, but not limited to, homeless families with children, 19 homeless youth, farmworkers, and seniors.

(2) In evaluating projects in this section, the department must give preference for applications based on some or all of the criteria in RCW 43.185.070(5).

(3) The department must strive to allocate all of the amounts 23 appropriated in this section within the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium in 24 25 the manner prescribed in subsection (1) of this section. However, if 26 upon review of applications the department determines there are not adequate suitable projects in a category, the department may allocate 27 funds to projects serving other low-income and special needs 28 29 populations, provided those projects are located in an area with an identified need for the type of housing proposed. 30

(2) In soliciting and evaluating proposals, awarding contracts,and monitoring projects under this section, the department must:

(a) Ensure that competitive processes, rather than sole source
contracting processes, are used to select all projects, except as
otherwise noted in this section; and

30 (b) Conduct due diligence activities associated with the use of 31 public funds including, but not limited to, oversight of the project 32 selection process, project monitoring and ensuring that all 33 applications and contracts fully comply with all applicable laws 34 including disclosure and conflict of interest statutes.

(1)(a) \$3,675,000 for fiscal year 2018 and \$3,675,000 for fiscal year 2019 is provided solely for grants to be awarded in competitive rounds to local agencies, public higher education institutions, school districts, and state agencies for operational cost savings improvements to facilities and related projects that result in energy and operational cost savings.

(b) At least twenty percent of each competitive grant round must be awarded to small cities or towns with a population of five thousand or fewer residents.

(c) In each competitive round, the higher the leverage ratio of nonstate funding sources to state grant and the higher the energy savings, the higher the project ranking.

(d) For school district applicants, priority consideration must be given to school districts that demonstrate improved health and safety through: (i) Reduced exposure to polychlorinated biphenyl; or (ii) replacing outdated heating systems that use oil or propane as fuel sources as identified by the Washington State University extension energy program. These alternatives must be both distinctly different and viable solutions 10 11 to the issue being addressed. The chosen alternative must be the most 12 reasonable and cost-effective solution. A brief description of each project alternative and why it was chosen must be included in the 13 life-cycle cost analysis section of the predesign. 14

(3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost model annually including assumptions for inflation rates, discount rates, and energy rates.

(4) Agencies shall consider architectural and engineering firms' and general contractors' experience using life-cycle costs, operating costs, and energy efficiency measures when selecting an architectural and engineering firm, or when selecting contractors using alternative contracting methods.

Such transfers may be effected only between capital appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or 12 institution of higher education and only between capital projects 13 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur 14 15 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants 16 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such 17 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes that govern the grants. 18

(2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is 19 20 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only 21 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids 22 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty 23 24 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can 25 be completed within the biennium for less than the amount appropriated in this act. 26

(3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a project in a different way.

(4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed with the legislative fiscal committees of the senate and house of representatives by the office of financial management at least thirty days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers within thirty days from the date of transfer.

1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7008. (1) It is expected that projects be ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of 2 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in 3 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more 4 5 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of б construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs 7 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate 8 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/ 9 community projects, and minor works. 10

11 (2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations 12 and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate 13 infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation 14 and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural 15 environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition 16 and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional 17 employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

18 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate 19 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and 20 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever 21 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

22 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7009. (1) Any building project that receives over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to 23 24 sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that 25 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle 26 27 performance, and occupant productivity. The following design and 28 construction attributes must be integrated into the building project:

(a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative, 29 30 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains 31 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water, 32 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other 33 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals 34 35 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Considers all stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction. 36

37 (b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the 38 size and complexity of the building and its system components in 39 order to verify performance of building components and systems and

help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan, verification of the installation and performance of systems to be commissioned, and a commissioning report.

6 (c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building 7 performance target that takes into account the intended use, 8 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design 9 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major 10 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy 11 use index. For major renovations, reduce the energy use by fifty 12 percent below prerenovations baseline.

(d) On-site renewable energy: Meet at least thirty percent of the hot water demand through the installation of solar hot water heaters, when life-cycle cost effective. Implement renewable energy generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-cycle cost effective.

18 (e) Measurement and verification: Install building level 19 electricity meters in new major construction and renovation projects 20 to track and continuously optimize performance. Include equivalent 21 meters for natural gas and steam, where natural gas and steam are 22 used. Install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize 23 occupants on energy use.

(f) Benchmarking: Compare actual performance data from the first year of operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool for laboratory buildings. Web-based data collection and dashboards must also be provided.

30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7010. State agencies, including institutions 31 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent 32 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting 33 for operating expenditures.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7011. Executive Order No. 05-05, archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November 10, 2005. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in this executive order.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7012. FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK
 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this
 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided
 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

5 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act 6 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work 7 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for 8 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

9 (3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act 10 for original construction of any public building by a state agency 11 identified in RCW 43.17.020 is provided solely for the purposes of 12 RCW 43.17.200.

13 (4) At least eighty-five percent of the moneys spent by the Washington state arts commission during the 2017-2019 biennium for 14 the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be 15 expended solely for direct acquisition of works of art. 26 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7014.** To carry out the provisions of this 27 act, the governor may assign responsibility for predesign, design, 28 construction, and other related activities to any appropriate agency.

(b) If, after using the interfund transfer authority granted in 10 this section, the department of ecology determines that further 11 reductions are needed to maintain positive account balances in the 12 13 state toxics control account, the local toxics control account, and 14 the environmental legacy stewardship account, the department is authorized to delay the start of any projects based on acuity of 15 need, readiness to proceed, cost-efficiency, purposes of increasing 16 17 affordable housing, or need to ensure geographic distribution. If the department uses this authority, the department must submit a 18 19 prioritized list of projects that may be delayed to the office of financial management and the appropriate fiscal committees of the 20 21 legislature.

(2) As directed by the pollution liability insurance agency in consultation with the office of financial management, the state treasurer shall transfer from the pollution liability insurance program trust account to the underground storage tank revolving account the lesser of \$20,000,000 or the balance of the fund exceeding \$7,500,000 after excluding the reserves during the 2017-2019 fiscal biennium.

29 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7023. To the extent that any appropriation authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building 30 construction account, or from any other capital project account in 31 state treasury, for a capital project or program that 32 the is 33 specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or 34 35 program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum 36 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation. 37

1 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7024. The energy efficiency account is hereby created in the state treasury. (2) The task force shall review the following issues:

(a) Improvements to state financial assistance for K-12 school
 construction to be implemented over several fiscal biennia;

(b) Utilization of school spaces for multiple purposes;

13 (c) School design and construction approaches that support 14 effective teaching and learning by delivering education through 15 innovative, sustainable, cost-effective, and enduring design and 16 construction methods; and

17 (d) Recent reports on school construction, including but not 18 limited to the school construction cost study from the educational 19 service district 112 and the efforts of collecting inventory and 20 condition of schools data by the Washington state university 21 extension energy office.

(3) In consideration of the findings pursuant to subsection (2)
of this section, the task force must recommend a state school
construction financial assistance program that:

(a) Supports the construction and preservation of schools; and

(b) Balances the state and local share of school construction and preservation costs considering local school districts' financial capacity, based on measures of relative wealth recommended pursuant to subsection (4)(b) of this section, and the state's limited bond capacity and common school trust land revenue.

31 (4) In making recommendations pursuant to subsection (3) of this 32 section, the task force must, at a minimum, also recommend:

(a) A methodology to project needs for state financial assistancefor school construction and preservation over a ten-year period;

35 (b) Measures of relative wealth of a school district, including 36 but not limited to assessed land value per student, eligible free and 37 reduced price meal enrollments, income per capita per school 38 district, and costs of construction; (c) Education specifications recognized by the state for the
 purpose of providing guidance to school districts when designing
 school construction projects;

4 (d) A capital asset model for K-12 school construction that 5 considers space and usage needs to calculate construction assistance 6 for:

(i) New schools to accommodate enrollment growth;

(ii) Major modernization projects to address aging facilities;

9 (iii) Replacement and renewal of major building systems based on 10 achieving lowest life-cycle building costs, provided that standards 11 of routine maintenance are achieved by local districts; and

17 (5)(a) Staff support for the task force must be provided by the 18 senate committee services and the house of representatives office of 19 program research.

20 (b) The office of the superintendent of public instruction and 21 the office of financial management shall cooperate with the task 22 force and maintain liaison representatives, who are nonvoting 23 members.

(c) The task force, where appropriate, may consult with individuals from public schools or related organizations or ask the individuals to establish a committee for technical advice and assistance. Members of such an advisory committee are not entitled to expense reimbursement.

(6) Legislative members of the task force are reimbursed for travel expenses in accordance with RCW 44.04.120. Nonlegislative members are not entitled to be reimbursed for travel expenses if they are elected officials or are participating on behalf of an employer, governmental entity, or other organization. Any reimbursement for other nonlegislative members is subject to chapter 43.03 RCW.

35 (7) The expenses of the task force must be paid jointly by the 36 senate and the house of representatives. Task force expenditures and 37 meetings are subject to approval by the senate facilities and 38 operations committee and the house of representatives executive rules 39 committee, or their successor committees. 1 (8) The task force must report its preliminary findings and 2 recommendations to the appropriate committees of the legislature by 3 December 1, 2017. 26 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7028. The public use general aviation airport loan revolving account is created in the custody of the state 27 treasurer. All receipts from moneys collected under this chapter must 28 29 be deposited into the account. Expenditures from the account may be 30 used only for the purposes described in section 4002 of this act. Only the community aviation revitalization board or the board's 31 designee may authorize expenditures from the account. The account is 32 subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an 33 34 appropriation is not required for expenditures.

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7029. The Washington state parks and 36 recreation commission, with guidance and instruction from the office 37 of financial management, must create a reporting structure to track

1 the success and progress of addressing the maintenance backlog of state parks facilities. The reporting structure must provide a 2 forecast of new project proposals, the status of current funded 3 projects and a list of completed projects. The report must also 4 include a facilities condition index that illustrates changes to the 5 б overall quality of facilities of state parks. The legislature intends to receive future biennia capital budget requests that address 7 facility maintenance backlog from the commission in the form of this 8 new report structure as additional information to the current format 9 for agency budget submittal requests. 10

# 11 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7030. FOR THE OFFICE OF FINANCIAL MANAGEMENT-12 WATER RESOURCES PROJECT ACCOUNT

The appropriation in this section is subject to the following 13 conditions and limitations: The appropriation in this section is 14 15 provided solely for expenditure into the water resources project 16 account created in chapter . . ., Laws of 2018 (water availability). 17 Moneys in the account are provided solely for water infrastructure projects, or projects designed to measure or improve stream flow. If 18 the section of chapter . . ., Laws of 2018, creating the water 19 resources project account does not become law by . . ., the amounts 20 21 provided in this section shall lapse.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7031. (1) Due to enactment of 2017-2019 27 omnibus capital appropriations after the beginning of the fiscal 28 biennium, in addition to any authority provided by law, for any 29 project or program authorized in this act that a state agency will 30 31 administer through a grant or loan, the administering state agency is authorized to reimburse the recipient of the grant or loan for 32 33 expenses incurred on or after July 1, 2017, by the recipient with nonstate moneys, not to exceed the amount authorized for that project 34 35 or program in this act.

36 (2) If necessary to reimburse expenses incurred from July 1,
 37 2017, to the effective date of this act, this authorization

1 supersedes agency rules regarding timing and deadlines for grant or loan applications and rules limiting reimbursement to only those 2 expenses incurred after execution of a grant or loan agreement, 3 subject to the approval of the office of financial management. 4 Reimbursement for expenses must comply with all other conditions and 5 б limitations that apply to the grant or loan project or program. 7 Section 7023 of this act applies to the reimbursements authorized in this section. 8

9 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7032. Due to enactment of 2017-2019 omnibus 10 capital appropriations after the beginning of the fiscal biennium, in 11 addition to any authority provided by law, state agencies that receive appropriations in this act are authorized to reimburse the 12 13 cost of capital expenditures that: Were incurred between July 1, 2017, and the effective date of this act; are for the capital 14 15 projects or programs authorized in this act; and were paid from 16 omnibus operating budget appropriations or other permitted operating 17 accounts. Section 7023 of this act applies to the reimbursements 18 authorized in this section.

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7033. If any provision of this act or its 20 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 21 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 22 persons or circumstances is not affected.

23 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> **Sec. 7034.** This act is necessary for the immediate 24 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 25 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 26 effect immediately.
