
SENATE BILL 6465

State of Washington 65th Legislature 2018 Regular Session

1 AN ACT Relating to requiring a regional transit authority to
2 receive additional approval from voters if the cost to complete a
3 regional transit system plan approved by voters in 2016 increases
4 beyond fifty-four billion dollars or any additions or subtractions of
5 projects or significant project scope when compared to the system
6 plan are made; adding a new section to chapter 81.112 RCW; and
7 creating new section.

8 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

9 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** It is the intent of the legislature that a
10 regional transit authority receive additional approval from voters if
11 the cost to complete a regional transit system plan approved by
12 voters in 2016 increases beyond fifty-four billion dollars or any
13 additions or subtractions of projects or significant project scope
14 when compared to the system plan are made.

15 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 81.112
16 RCW to read as follows:

17 (1) Once an authority has expended eighty percent of all the
18 funding elements identified in a regional transit system plan adopted
19 by the board of an authority in June 2016, the authority must hire an
20 independent auditor to determine if remaining unspent funding

1 elements are sufficient to complete the system plan as approved by
2 the authority's voters in 2016.

3 (2) If the auditor hired under subsection (1) of this section
4 determines remaining unspent funding elements are insufficient to
5 complete the system plan as approved by the authority's voters in
6 2016, the authority must propose a ballot proposition to be submitted
7 to the voters of the authority. The ballot proposition must seek
8 approval for an authority to expend funds beyond those in the system
9 plan as approved by the authority's voters in 2016. The ballot
10 proposition must receive a majority affirmative vote before an
11 authority may expend funds beyond those identified in the system plan
12 as approved by the authority's voters in 2016.

13 (3) If an authority proposes to make any additions or
14 subtractions of projects or significant project scope when compared
15 to the system plan as approved by the authority's voters in 2016, an
16 authority must propose a ballot proposition to be submitted to the
17 voters of the authority. The ballot proposition must identify changes
18 to the system plan as approved by the authority's voters in 2016, and
19 seek approval of these changes. The ballot proposition must receive a
20 majority affirmative vote before an authority may continue funding
21 additions or subtractions of projects or significant project scope
22 when compared to the system plan as approved by the authority's
23 voters in 2016.

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
