1 AN ACT Relating to professional educator standards board 2 membership; and amending RCW 28A.410.200.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4 Sec. 1. RCW 28A.410.200 and 2009 c 531 s 2 are each amended to 5 read as follows:

6 (1)(a) The Washington professional educator standards board is 7 created, consisting of twelve members to be appointed by the governor 8 to four-year terms and the superintendent of public instruction <u>or</u> 9 <u>the superintendent's designee</u>. On August 1, 2009, the board shall be 10 reduced to twelve members.

(b) Vacancies on the board shall be filled by appointment orreappointment by the governor to terms of four years.

13 (c) No person may serve as a member of the board for more than 14 two consecutive full four-year terms.

(d) The governor shall biennially appoint the chair of the board.
No board member may serve as chair for more than four consecutive
years.

18 (2) A majority of the members of the board shall be active 19 practitioners with the majority being classroom based. Membership on 20 the board shall include individuals having one or more of the 21 following: (a) Experience in one or more of the education roles for which
 state preparation program approval is required and certificates
 issued;

4 (b) Experience providing or leading a state-approved teacher or 5 educator preparation program;

6 (c) Experience providing mentoring and coaching to education 7 professionals or others; and

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(d) Education-related community experience.

9 (3) In appointing board members, the governor shall consider the 10 individual's commitment to quality education and the ongoing 11 improvement of instruction, experiences in the public schools or 12 private schools, involvement in developing quality teaching 13 preparation and support programs, and vision for the most effective 14 yet practical system of assuring teaching quality. The governor shall 15 also consider the diversity of the population of the state.

16 (4) All appointments to the board made by the governor are 17 subject to confirmation by the senate.

18 (5) Each member of the board shall be compensated in accordance 19 with RCW 43.03.240 and shall be reimbursed for travel expenses 20 incurred in carrying out the duties of the board in accordance with 21 RCW 43.03.050 and 43.03.060.

(6) The governor may remove a member of the board for neglect of 22 duty, misconduct, malfeasance or misfeasance in office, or for 23 incompetency or unprofessional conduct as defined in chapter 18.130 24 25 RCW. In such a case, the governor shall file with the secretary of state a statement of the causes for and the order of removal from 26 office, and the secretary of state shall send a certified copy of the 27 statement of causes and order of removal to the last known post 28 office address of the member. 29

30 (7) Members of the board shall hire an executive director and an 31 administrative assistant to reside in the office of the 32 superintendent of public instruction for administrative purposes 33 only.

34 (8) Members of the board may create informal advisory groups as35 needed to inform the board's work.

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
