SENATE RESOLUTION

8629

1 WHEREAS, A group of Yakima business and farm leaders wishing to 2 showcase the wide variety of fruits, vegetables, grains, and other 3 farm products gained Legislative approval to have Yakima be the site 4 of the Central Washington State Fair in February of 1892; and

5 WHEREAS, In 1893 the Washington State Legislature appropriated 6 \$10,000 to purchase the land where the present State Fair park is 7 located; and

8 WHEREAS, In 1908 a street car line was built to the grounds so 9 that people from all over the Northwest could come to Yakima by 10 train, then by street car, to enjoy the sights and sounds of the 11 Washington State Fair; and

12 WHEREAS, In those days, the Fair attracted visitors for the horse 13 races, the grandstand performances, the Fair food, abundant displays 14 of the Yakima Valley harvest, and the Indian encampment and the 15 tribal stick games held each evening; and

16 WHEREAS, During the Depression it was difficult for the State 17 of Washington to fund the Fair and in 1936 decided to discontinue the 18 Fair until better times, the people of Central Washington determined 19 to operate the Central Washington State Fair; and

20 WHEREAS, Since that year, the Fair has been held each September 21 excluding the years between 1942 and 1946 when Kenworth moved into 22 the grounds to build trucks for the war effort; and 1 WHEREAS, During those same years there were training exercises 2 for the armed forces on the Fair grounds and the Fair buildings 3 turned into barracks for our troops; and

WHEREAS, The Fair has given hundreds of thousands of dollars over 4 the years in premiums for entries in various categories including 5 6 foods, flower arranging, quilts, fine arts, and animal husbandry; and 7 WHEREAS, The Fair has encouraged our 4-H and FFA youth in displaying their skills of raising and showing their animals, their 8 9 parliamentary skills, their culinary skills, other and accomplishments; and 10

11 WHEREAS, Hundreds of our Yakima Valley youth have been helped by 12 their Fair experience and Fair premiums; and

WHEREAS, The State Fair Park has also sponsored great names in entertainment for attendees from all over the State of Washington; and

16 WHEREAS, The original State Fair of Washington is celebrating its 17 125th year of becoming a Fair and has stayed faithful to its 18 agricultural roots and mission;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, That the Washington State Senate honor the 125th anniversary of the State Fair in Central Washington and recognize its cultural and economic impacts on the State of Washington.
