1            AN ACT Relating to issuance of search warrants by district and  
2 municipal court judges; and amending RCW 2.20.030.

3 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

4            **Sec. 1.** RCW 2.20.030 and 2014 c 93 s 2 are each amended to read  
5 as follows:

6            Any district or municipal court judge, in the county in which the  
7 offense is alleged to have occurred, may issue a search warrant for  
8 any person or evidence located anywhere within the state. If the  
9 jurisdiction of a district or municipal court encompasses all or part  
10 of more than one county, a judge for that district or municipal court  
11 may issue a search warrant for any person or evidence located  
12 anywhere within the state as long as the county in which the offense  
13 is alleged to have occurred is one of the counties encompassed within  
14 that court's jurisdiction.
