- 1 On page 2, after line 5, insert the following:
- "NEW SECTION. Sec. 2. (1) The department of commerce shall convene a work group to develop recommendations related to retail loss prevention and enforcement.
- 5 (2) (a) The work group must include members representing the following interests and entities:
 - (i) Large-scale and small-scale grocers and retail establishments;
 - (ii) Labor unions representing grocery and retail employees;
- 10 (iii) Loss prevention professionals and persons who provide 11 training for loss prevention professionals;
 - (iv) Retail security experts;
- 13 (v) Law enforcement;

- 14 (vi) Organizations representing historically marginalized 15 communities;
- 16 (vii) The office of the attorney general; and
- 17 (viii) The human rights commission.
- 18 (b) The work group must also include four legislative members, 19 including one member from each of the two largest caucuses of the 20 senate appointed by the president of the senate, and one member from 21 each of the two largest caucuses of the house of representatives 22 appointed by the speaker of the house.
 - (3) The work group must:
- 24 (a) Examine and make recommendations related to loss prevention 25 protocols and strategies for engagement with persons suspected of 26 theft or attempted theft in retail establishments, including 27 recommending best practices for: Engaging in appropriate and 28 equitable contacts with customers and persons suspected of retail 29 theft; engaging in varying degrees of intervention according to the conduct that is being addressed; employing conflict mitigation 30 31 strategies; and utilizing trespassing and other processes as an alternative to pursuing arrest and prosecution; 32

- (b) Examine and recommend best practices for training of loss prevention professionals including, but not limited to, increasing implicit bias training and training related to appropriate and equitable engagement with customers and persons suspected of retail theft; and
- 6 (c) Review existing data related to retail theft offenses and 7 identify data gaps that should be addressed through further data collection. The review must include, but is not limited to, an 8 assessment of available data related to the extent to which retail 9 theft arrests and prosecutions involve individual actors versus 10 organized retail theft operations, and data related to the underlying 11 12 factors that lead persons to engage in retail theft. The work group may request assistance from the administrative office of the courts, 13 the Washington association of sheriffs and police chiefs, and other 14 entities that may have access to relevant data. 15
- 16 (4) The department of commerce shall administer and provide staff 17 support for the work group.
- 18 (5) The work group must report its findings and recommendations 19 to the appropriate committees of the legislature by December 1, 20 2020."
