(3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

(4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future 25 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only 26 27 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior 28 biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for 29 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what 30 31 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2021-2023 32 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not

necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for
 the project or program in the future.

3 (5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless 4 the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant 5 conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations. 6 Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances 7 remaining on June 30, 2019, from the 2017-2019 biennial 8 appropriations for each project.

(iii) A commitment by the applicant to provide, directly or through a formal partnership, necessary treatment and supportive services to the tenants and maintain the beds or housing units for at least a forty-year period;

35 (iv) Readiness to begin structural modifications or construction 36 resulting in a fast project completion; and

37 (v) Program requirements that adhere to the key elements of 38 permanent supportive housing programs including choice in housing and

living arrangements, functional separation of housing and services,
 community integration, rights of tenancy, and voluntary recovery focused services.

35 (e) A member appointed by the secretary of transportation may not 36 be absent from more than fifty percent of the regularly scheduled 37 meetings in any one calendar year. Any member who exceeds this

1 absence limitation is deemed to have withdrawn from the office and 2 may be replaced by the secretary of transportation.

3 (f) A majority of members currently appointed constitutes a 4 quorum.

5 (g) The board must meet three times a year or as deemed necessary 6 by the department of transportation.

7 (h) Staff support to the board must be provided by the department 8 of transportation as needed.

(2) In addition to other applicable provisions of law pertaining 9 to conflicts of interest of public officials, any community aviation 10 revitalization board member, appointive or otherwise, may not 11 participate in any decision on any board contract in which the board 12 member has any interests, direct or indirect, with any firm, 13 partnership, corporation, or association that would be the recipient 14 of any aid under this section. If such participation occurs, the 15 16 board must void the transaction and the involved member is subject to 17 further sanctions as provided by law. The board must adopt a code of ethics for its members, which must be designed to protect the state 18 and its citizens from any unethical conduct by the board. 19

(3) The community aviation revitalization board may:

21 (a) Adopt bylaws for the regulation of its affairs and the 22 conduct of its business;

For purposes of this subsection, "public use airports" means 11 12 all public use airports not listed as having more than seventy-five thousand annual commercial air service passenger enplanements as 13 published by the federal aviation administration. 14

(b) An application for loan funds under this section must be made in the form and manner as the board may prescribe. When evaluating loan applications, the board must prioritize applications that provide conclusive justification that completion of the loan application project will create revenue generating opportunities. The board is not limited to, but must also use, the following expected outcome conditions when evaluating loan applications:

(i) A specific private development or expansion is ready to occurand will occur only if the aviation facility improvement is made;

(ii) The loan application project results in the creation of jobsor private sector capital investment as determined by the board;

26 (iii) The loan application project improves opportunities for the 27 successful maintenance, operation, or expansion of an airport or 28 adjacent airport business park;

The loans must not exceed 17 twenty years in duration.

(6) All receipts from moneys collected under this section must be deposited into the public use general aviation airport loan revolving account created in section 7027 of this act.

The department of commerce will oversee an interagency agreement with the department of enterprise services to fund the resource conservation managers.

10 (5) The department shall develop metrics that indicate the 11 performance of energy efficiency efforts and provide a report of the 12 metrics, including at a minimum the current energy used by the 13 building, the energy use after efficiencies are completed, and cost 14 of energy saved. ((The report must include these metrics from other 15 states.))

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Sec. 7001. RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure 3 NEW SECTION. of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond 4 5 appropriations. The estimated debt service costs for the appropriations contained in this act are forty-nine million, six 6 hundred thirteen thousand dollars for the 2019-2021 biennium, three 7 hundred six million, nine hundred ninety four thousand dollars for 8 the 2021-2023 biennium, and four hundred twenty-eight million, eight 9 10 hundred ninety thousand dollars for the 2023-2025 biennium.

7002. 11 NEW SECTION. Sec. ACQUISITION OF PROPERTIES AND FACILITIES THROUGH FINANCIAL CONTRACTS. (1) The following agencies 12 may enter into financial contracts, paid from any funds of an agency, 13 14 appropriated or nonappropriated, for the purposes indicated and in 15 more than the principal amounts indicated, plus not financing 16 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW. When 17 securing properties under this section, agencies shall use the most economical financial contract option available, including long-term 18 19 leases, lease-purchase agreements, lease-development with option to purchase agreements or financial contracts using certificates of 20 21 participation. 7 (5) Department of natural resources: Enter into a financing 8 contract for up to \$1,800,000 plus financing expenses and required 9 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to remodel spaces within 10 agency-owned commercial buildings that will benefit the common school 11 trust.

12 (6) Department of social and health services: Enter into a 13 financing contract for up to \$3,600,000 plus financing expenses and 14 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase the King 15 county secure community transition center.

16 (7) Office of the secretary of state: Enter into a financing 17 contract for up to \$103,143,000 plus financing expenses and required 18 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct the library-19 archives building. The financial contract is provided solely for 20 implementation of Substitute House Bill No. 2015 (library-archives 21 building). If the bill is not enacted by June 30, 2019, the amounts 22 provided in this subsection shall lapse.

(8) Washington state patrol: Enter into a financing contract for
 up to \$7,450,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves
 pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a replacement for the fire
 training academy burn building.

(9) Community and technical colleges:

(a) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Columbia Basin
 Community College for up to \$27,000,000 plus financing expenses and
 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a
 student recreation center.

32 (b) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Pierce College 33 Puyallup for up to \$2,831,000 plus financing expenses and required 34 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase land and construct 35 parking.

36 (c) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Walla Walla 37 Community College for up to \$1,500,000 plus financing expenses and 38 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a student 39 activity center on the Clarkston campus.

1 (d) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Walla Walla 2 Community College for up to \$6,500,000 plus financing expenses and 3 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build a student 4 recreation center.

5 (e) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Wenatchee Valley 6 College for up to \$4,500,000 plus financing expenses and required 7 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW for the Wells Hall replacement 8 project.

9 (f) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Yakima Valley 10 Community College for up to \$22,700,000 plus financing expenses and 11 required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to build additional 12 instructional and lab classroom space.

(g) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Everett Community College for up to \$10,000,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase one or more properties adjacent to the campus.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7003. (1) To ensure that major construction projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive intent, agencies must complete a predesign for state construction projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$5,000,000, or \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions. "Total anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the predesign, design, and construction phases of the project.

(2) Appropriations for design may not be expended or encumbered
 until the office of financial management has reviewed and approved
 the agency's predesign.

27 The predesign must explore at least three project (3) 28 alternatives. These alternatives must be both distinctly different and viable solutions to the issue being addressed. The chosen 29 30 alternative should be the most reasonable and cost-effective solution. The predesign document must include, but not be limited to, 31 program, site, and cost analysis, and an analysis of the life-cycle 32 costs of the alternatives explored, in accordance with the predesign 33 manual adopted by the office of financial management. 34

35 (4) The office of financial management may make an exception to 36 the predesign requirements in this section after notifying the 37 legislative fiscal committees and waiting ten days for comment by the 38 legislature regarding the proposed exception.

1 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7004. Agencies administering construction projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$5,000,000, or 2 3 \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions, must submit progress reports to the office of financial management and to the fiscal 4 committees of the house of representatives and senate. "Total 5 6 anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the predesign, design, and construction phases of the project. Reports 7 must be submitted on July 1st and December 31st of each year in a 8 format determined by the office of financial management. After the 9 project is completed, agencies must also submit a closeout report 10 11 that identifies the total project cost and any unspent 12 appropriations.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7005. (1) Allotments for appropriations in this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section and RCW 43.88.110.

20 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget21 notes or in the governor's budget document.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7006. (1) The office of financial management 22 23 may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the 24 completion of such project to another capital project for which the 25 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand 26 27 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital 28 29 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or 30 institution of higher education and only between capital projects that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur 31 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants 32 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such 33 transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes 34 35 that govern the grants.

36 (2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is
 37 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only
 38 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is

The office of 16 financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers 17 within thirty days from the date of transfer.

Sec. 7007. (1) It is expected that projects be 18 NEW SECTION. ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of 19 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in 20 21 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more 22 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of infrastructure grant or loan programs 23 construction, or large 24 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to 25 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/ 26 27 community projects, and minor works.

(2) Agencies shall expedite the expenditure of reappropriations and appropriations in this act in order to: (a) Rehabilitate infrastructure resources; (b) accelerate environmental rehabilitation and restoration projects for the improvement of the state's natural environment; (c) reduce additional costs associated with acquisition and construction inflationary pressures; and (d) provide additional employment opportunities associated with capital expenditures.

35 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate 36 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and 37 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever 38 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7008. (1) Any building project that receives over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle performance, and occupant productivity. The following design and construction attributes must be integrated into the building project:

(a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative, 8 integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains 9 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and 10 11 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water, 12 materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals 13 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all 14 stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction. 15

16 (b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the 17 size and complexity of the building and its system components in order to verify performance of building components and systems and 18 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an 19 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning 20 21 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan, 22 verification of the installation and performance of systems to be 23 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

(c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building performance target that takes into account the intended use, occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by fifty percent below prerenovations baseline.

(d) On-site renewable energy: Meet at least thirty percent of the hot water demand through the installation of solar hot water heaters, when life-cycle cost effective. Implement renewable energy generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-cycle cost effective.

36 (e) Measurement and verification: Where appropriate, install 37 building level electricity meters in new major construction and 38 renovation projects to track and continuously optimize performance. 39 Include equivalent meters for natural gas and steam, where natural

gas and steam are used. Where appropriate, install dashboards inside 1 buildings to display and incentivize occupants on energy use. 2

(f) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of 3 operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building 4 performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building 5 6 and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7009. State agencies, including institutions 7 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent 8 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting 9 10 for operating expenditures.

(7) \$2,209,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided 22 23 solely for the Fairchild air force base protection and community empowerment project, including the purchase of twenty acres of land 24 25 by Spokane county or the city of Airway Heights for development of affordable housing and the purchase of mobile home parks by Spokane 26 county or the city of Airway Heights in order to reduce the use of 27 28 the accident potential zone for residential purposes. There shall be no limitations on the sequence of the purchase of mobile home parks. 29 If Spokane county or the city of Airway Heights subsequently rezones, 30 31 develops, and leases the mobile home park property for commercial or industrial uses contrary to the allowed uses in the accident 32 potential zone, Spokane county or the city of Airway Heights must 33 repay to the state the amount spent on the purchase of mobile home 34 parks in its entirety within ten years. The twenty acres of land purchased under this subsection for development as affordable 2 housing may be sold, in whole or in part, by the recipient, provided 3 the property sold is used for affordable housing as required in the 4 Fairchild air force base protection and community empowerment 5 6 project. Recipients of funds provided under this subsection are not required to demonstrate that the project site is under their control 7 for a minimum of ten years but they must demonstrate that the project 8 site is under their control through ownership or long-term lease. 9 Projects funded under this subsection are not required to meet the 10 provisions of RCW 43.63A.125(6) and subsection (5) of this section. 11

12 (8) \$850,000 of the appropriation in this section is provided solely for the White River restoration project. Design solutions for 13 flooding reductions in the lower White River must include a 14 floodplain habitat design that both reduces flood risks and restores 15 16 salmon habitat by reconnecting the river with its floodplain and a 17 sustainable riparian corridor. Project designs and plans must also 18 identify lands for acquisition needed for floodplain reconnection 19 where pending or existing development eliminates the potential for riparian and aquatic habitat restoration. 7 The public use general aviation airport loan revolving account is created in the custody of the state treasurer.
