3 "NEW SECTION. **Sec. 1.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.320
4 RCW to read as follows:

5 (1) A school district superintendent, a designee of the
6 superintendent, or a principal of a school who receives information
7 pursuant to RCW 28A.225.330, 9A.44.138, 13.04.155, 13.40.215, or
8 72.09.730 shall comply with the notification provisions described in
9 this section.

10 (2) Upon receipt of information described in subsection (1) of
11 this section, a school district superintendent or a designee of the
12 superintendent must provide the received information to the principal
13 of the school where the student is enrolled or will enroll, or if not
14 known, where the student was most recently enrolled.

15 (3) (a) Upon receipt of information about a sex offense as defined
16 in RCW 9.94A.030, the principal must comply with the notification
17 requirements in RCW 9A.44.138.

18 (b) Upon receipt of information about a violent offense as
19 defined in RCW 9.94A.030, any crime under chapter 9.41 RCW, unlawful
20 possession or delivery, or both, of a controlled substance in
21 violation of chapter 69.50 RCW, or a school disciplinary action, the
22 principal, subject to requirements of subsection (4) of this section,
23 has discretion to share the information with a school district staff
24 member if, in the principal's judgment, the information is necessary
25 for:

26 (i) The staff member to supervise the student;

27 (ii) The staff member to provide or refer the student to
28 therapeutic or behavioral health services; or

29 (iii) Security purposes.

30 (4) (a) Upon receipt of information about an adjudication in
31 juvenile court for an unlawful possession of a controlled substance
32 in violation of chapter 69.50 RCW, the principal must notify the

1 student and the parent or legal guardian at least five days before
2 sharing the information with a school district staff member.

3 (b) If either the student or the student's parent or legal
4 guardian objects to the proposed sharing of the information, the
5 student, the student's parent or legal guardian, or both, may, within
6 five business days of receiving notice from the principal, appeal the
7 decision to share the information with staff to the superintendent of
8 the school district in accordance with procedures adopted by the
9 district.

10 (c) The superintendent shall have five business days after
11 receiving an appeal under (b) of this subsection to make a written
12 determination on the matter. Determinations by superintendents under
13 this subsection are final and not subject to further appeal.

14 (d) A principal may not share adjudication information under this
15 subsection with a school district staff member while an appeal is
16 pending.

17 (5) Any information received by school district staff under this
18 section is exempt from disclosure under chapter 42.56 RCW and may not
19 be further disseminated except as provided in RCW 28A.225.330, other
20 statutes or case law, and the family and educational and privacy
21 rights act of 1994 (20 U.S.C. Sec. 1232g et seq.).

22 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 2.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.195
23 RCW to read as follows:

24 The administrator of a private school approved under this chapter
25 must comply with the notification provisions of section 1 of this act
26 that apply to superintendents, designees of superintendents, and
27 principals.

28 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 3.** A new section is added to chapter 28A.710
29 RCW to read as follows:

30 The administrator of a charter public school governed by this
31 chapter must comply with the notification provisions of section 1 of
32 this act that apply to superintendents, designees of superintendents,
33 and principals.

34 **Sec. 4.** RCW 28A.320.128 and 2002 c 206 s 1 are each amended to
35 read as follows:

36 (1) By September 1, (~~2003~~) 2020, each school district board of
37 directors shall adopt a policy that addresses the following issues:

1 (a) Procedures for providing notice of threats of violence or
2 harm to the student or school employee who is the subject of the
3 threat. The policy shall define "threats of violence or harm"; and

4 (b) Procedures for ~~((disclosing information that is provided to~~
5 ~~the school administrators about a student's conduct, including but~~
6 ~~not limited to the student's prior disciplinary records, official~~
7 ~~juvenile court records, and history of violence, to classroom~~
8 ~~teachers, school staff, and school security who, in the judgment of~~
9 ~~the principal, should be notified ; and~~

10 ~~(c) Procedures for determining whether or not any threats or~~
11 ~~conduct established in the policy may be grounds for suspension or~~
12 ~~expulsion of the student)) complying with the notification provisions
13 in section 1 of this act.~~

14 (2) The ~~((superintendent of public instruction))~~ Washington state
15 school directors' association, in consultation with educators and
16 representatives of law enforcement, classified staff, ~~((and))~~
17 organizations with expertise in violence prevention and intervention,
18 and organizations that provide free legal services for youth, shall
19 adopt, and revise as necessary, a model policy that includes the
20 issues listed in subsection (1) of this section ~~((by January 1,~~
21 ~~2003))~~. The model policy shall be ~~((posted on the superintendent of~~
22 ~~public instruction's))~~ disseminated by the Washington state school
23 directors' association and made available to the public on its web
24 site. ((The)) Each school district ~~((s, in drafting their own~~
25 ~~policies,))~~ shall ~~((review))~~ adopt the model policy required by this
26 subsection unless it has a compelling reason to develop and adopt a
27 different policy that also addresses the issues identified in
28 subsection (1) of this section.

29 (3) School districts, school district boards of directors, school
30 officials, and school employees providing notice in good faith as
31 required and consistent with the board's policies adopted under this
32 section are immune from any liability arising out of such
33 notification.

34 (4) A person who intentionally and in bad faith or maliciously,
35 knowingly makes a false notification of a threat under this section
36 is guilty of a misdemeanor punishable under RCW 9A.20.021.

1 (1) Upon receiving notice from a registered person pursuant to
2 RCW 9A.44.130 that the person will be attending a school enrolling

4 higher education, or will be employed with an institution of higher
5 education, the sheriff must promptly notify the designated recipient
6 of the school (~~((district and the school principal))~~) or

25 information received only to personnel who, in the judgment of the

29 school district, the designated recipient must disclose the
30 information to the principal of the school that the registered person
31 will be attending, whether the school is a common school as defined

34 disclose the information as provided in subsection (2) of this
35 section.

2 leave or release, or before transfer to a community residential
3 facility, the secretary shall send written notice of the discharge,
4 parole, authorized leave or release, or transfer of a juvenile found
5 to have committed a violent offense, a sex offense, or stalking, to
6 the following:

7 (i) The chief of police of the city, if any, in which the
8 juvenile will reside; and

9 (ii) The sheriff of the county in which the juvenile will
10 reside (~~and~~

12 board of directors of the district in which the juvenile intends to

4 (A) The superintendent of the school district, or his or her
5 designee, of a common school as defined in RCW 28A.150.020 or a
6 school that is the subject of a state-tribal education compact under
7 chapter 28A.715 RCW; (B) the administrator of a charter public school
8 governed by chapter 28A.710 RCW; or (C) the administrator of a
9 private school approved under chapter 28A.195 RCW.

16 (ii) Any witnesses who testified against the juvenile in any
17 court proceedings involving the offense; and

18 (iii) Any person specified in writing by the prosecuting
19 attorney.

20 Information regarding victims, next of kin, or witnesses requesting
21 the notice, information regarding any other person specified in
22 writing by the prosecuting attorney to receive the notice, and the
23 notice are confidential and shall not be available to the juvenile.
24 The notice to the chief of police or the sheriff shall include the
25 identity of the juvenile, the residence where the juvenile will
26 reside, the identity of the person, if any, responsible for
27 supervising the juvenile, and the time period of any authorized
28 leave.

29 (d) The thirty-day notice requirements contained in this
30 subsection shall not apply to emergency medical furloughs.

31 (e) The existence of the notice requirements in this subsection
32 will not require any extension of the release date in the event the
33 release plan changes after notification.

34 (2)(a) If a juvenile found to have committed a violent offense, a
35 sex offense, or stalking escapes from a facility of the department,
36 the secretary shall immediately notify, by the most reasonable and
37 expedient means available, the chief of police of the city and the
38 sheriff of the county in which the juvenile resided immediately
39 before the juvenile's arrest. If previously requested, the secretary
40 shall also notify the witnesses and the victim of the offense which

1 the juvenile was found to have committed or the victim's next of kin
2 if the crime was a homicide. If the juvenile is recaptured, the
3 secretary shall send notice to the persons designated in this
4 subsection as soon as possible but in no event later than two working
5 days after the department learns of such recapture.

6 (b) The secretary may authorize a leave, for a juvenile found to
7 have committed a violent offense, a sex offense, or stalking, which
8 shall not exceed forty-eight hours plus travel time, to meet an
9 emergency situation such as a death or critical illness of a member
10 of the juvenile's family. The secretary may authorize a leave, which
11 shall not exceed the time medically necessary, to obtain medical care
12 not available in a juvenile facility maintained by the department.
13 Prior to the commencement of an emergency or medical leave, the
14 secretary shall give notice of the leave to the appropriate law
15 enforcement agency in the jurisdiction in which the juvenile will be
16 during the leave period. The notice shall include the identity of the
17 juvenile, the time period of the leave, the residence of the juvenile
18 during the leave, and the identity of the person responsible for
19 supervising the juvenile during the leave. If previously requested,
20 the department shall also notify the witnesses and victim of the
21 offense which the juvenile was found to have committed or the
22 victim's next of kin if the offense was a homicide.

23 In case of an emergency or medical leave the secretary may waive
24 all or any portion of the requirements for leaves pursuant to RCW
25 13.40.205 (2)(a), (3), (4), and (5).

26 (3) If the victim, the victim's next of kin, or any witness is
27 under the age of sixteen, the notice required by this section shall
28 be sent to the parents or legal guardian of the child.

29 (4) The secretary shall send the notices required by this chapter
30 to the last address provided to the department by the requesting
31 party. The requesting party shall furnish the department with a
32 current address.

33 (5) Upon discharge, parole, transfer to a community residential
34 facility, or other authorized leave or release, a convicted juvenile
35 sex offender shall not attend a public or approved private
36 elementary, middle, or high school that is attended by a victim or a
37 sibling of a victim of the sex offender. The parents or legal
38 guardians of the convicted juvenile sex offender shall be responsible
39 for transportation or other costs associated with or required by the

12 (6) For purposes of this section the following terms have the
13 following meanings:

14 (a) "Violent offense" means a violent offense under RCW
15 9.94A.030;

16 (b) "Sex offense" means a sex offense under RCW 9.94A.030;

17 (c) "Stalking" means the crime of stalking as defined in RCW
18 9A.46.110;

19 (d) "Next of kin" means a person's spouse, parents, siblings, and
20 children.

21 **Sec. 8.** RCW 28A.225.330 and 2013 c 182 s 10 are each amended to
22 read as follows:

23 (1) When enrolling a student who has attended school in another
24 school district, the school enrolling the student may request the
25 parent and the student to briefly indicate in writing whether or not
26 the student has:

27 (a) Any history of placement in special educational programs;

28 (b) Any past, current, or pending disciplinary action;

29 (c) Any history of violent behavior, or behavior listed in RCW
30 13.04.155;

31 (d) Any unpaid fines or fees imposed by other schools; and

32 (e) Any health conditions affecting the student's educational
33 needs.

34 (2) The school enrolling the student shall request (~~the school~~
35 ~~the student previously attended to send~~) the student's permanent
36 record including records of disciplinary action, history of violent
37 behavior or behavior listed in RCW 13.04.155, attendance,
38 immunization records, and academic performance from the school the
39 student previously attended. If the student has not paid a fine or

1 fee under RCW 28A.635.060, or tuition, fees, or fines at approved
2 private schools the school may withhold the student's official
3 transcript, but shall transmit information about the student's
4 academic performance, special placement, immunization records,
5 records of disciplinary action, and history of violent behavior or
6 behavior listed in RCW 13.04.155. If the official transcript is not
7 sent due to unpaid tuition, fees, or fines, the enrolling school
8 shall notify both the student and parent or guardian that the
9 official transcript will not be sent until the obligation is met, and
10 failure to have an official transcript may result in exclusion from
11 extracurricular activities or failure to graduate.

12 (3) Upon request, school districts shall furnish a set of
13 unofficial educational records to a parent or guardian of a student
14 who is transferring out of state and who meets the definition of a
15 child of a military family in transition under Article II of RCW
16 28A.705.010. School districts may charge the parent or guardian the
17 actual cost of providing the copies of the records.

18 (4) If information is requested under subsection (2) of this
19 section, the information shall be transmitted within two school days
20 after receiving the request and the records shall be sent as soon as
21 possible. The records of a student who meets the definition of a
22 child of a military family in transition under Article II of RCW
23 28A.705.010 shall be sent within ten days after receiving the
24 request. Any school district or district employee who releases the
25 information in compliance with this section is immune from civil
26 liability for damages unless it is shown that the school district
27 employee acted with gross negligence or in bad faith. The
28 professional educator standards board shall provide by rule for the
29 discipline under chapter 28A.410 RCW of a school principal or other
30 chief administrator of a public school building who fails to make a
31 good faith effort to assure compliance with this subsection.

32 (5) Any school district or district employee who releases the
33 information in compliance with federal and state law is immune from
34 civil liability for damages unless it is shown that the school
35 district or district employee acted with gross negligence or in bad
36 faith.

37 (6) ~~((When a school receives information under this section or
38 RCW 13.40.215 that a student has a history of disciplinary actions,
39 eriminal or violent behavior, or other behavior that indicates the
40 student could be a threat to the safety of educational staff or other~~

1 ~~students, the school shall provide this information to the student's~~
2 ~~teachers and security personnel.~~

3 ~~(7))~~) A school may not prevent a student who is dependent
4 pursuant to chapter 13.34 RCW from enrolling if there is incomplete
5 information as enumerated in subsection (1) of this section during
6 the ten business days that the department of social and health
7 services has to obtain that information under RCW 74.13.631. In
8 addition, upon enrollment of a student who is dependent pursuant to
9 chapter 13.34 RCW, the school district must make reasonable efforts
10 to obtain and assess that child's educational history in order to
11 meet the child's unique needs within two business days.

9 governed by chapter 28A.710 RCW; or (c) the administrator of a
