13 (a) May be issued in lieu of standard issue or personalized
14 license plates for vehicles required to display one and two license
15 plates unless otherwise specified;

16 (b) Must be issued under terms and conditions established by the
17 department;

18 (c) Must not be issued for vehicles registered under chapter
19 46.87 RCW; and

20 (d) Must display a symbol or artwork approved by the department.

22 (3) Applicants for initial and renewal professional firefighters
23 and paramedics special license plates must show proof of eligibility
24 by providing a certificate of current membership from the Washington
25 state council of firefighters.

26 (4) Applicants for initial volunteer firefighters special license
27 plates must (a) have been a volunteer firefighter for at least ten
28 years or be a volunteer firefighter for one or more years and (b)
29 have documentation of service from the district of the appropriate
30 fire service. If the volunteer firefighter leaves firefighting
31 service before ten years of service have been completed, the
32 volunteer firefighter shall surrender the license plates to the
33 department on the registration renewal date. If the volunteer
34 firefighter stays in service for at least ten years and then leaves,
35 the license plate may be retained by the former volunteer firefighter
36 and as long as the license plate is retained for use the person will
37 continue to pay the future registration renewals. A qualifying
38 volunteer firefighter may have no more than one set of license plates

1 per vehicle, and a maximum of two sets per applicant, for their
2 personal vehicles. If the volunteer firefighter is convicted of a
3 violation of RCW 46.61.502 or a felony, the license plates must be
4 surrendered upon conviction.

5 (5) The department shall not issue the Seattle NHL hockey special
6 license plate until the department receives signature sheets
7 satisfying the requirements identified in RCW 46.18.110(2)(f).

8 **Sec. 3.** RCW 46.68.420 and 2019 c 384 s 3 and 2019 c 177 s 3 are
9 each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

10 (1) The department shall:

11 (a) Collect special license plate fees established under RCW
12 46.17.220;

13 (b) Deduct an amount not to exceed twelve dollars for initial
14 issue and two dollars for renewal issue for administration and
15 collection expenses incurred by it; and

16 (c) Remit the remaining proceeds to the custody of the state
17 treasurer with a proper identifying detailed report.

18 (2) The state treasurer shall credit the proceeds to the motor
19 vehicle (~~(account—[fund])~~) fund until the department determines that
20 the state has been reimbursed for the cost of implementing the
21 special license plate. Upon determination by the department that the
22 state has been reimbursed, the state treasurer shall credit the
23 remaining special license plate fee amounts for each special license
24 plate to the following appropriate account as created in this section
25 in the custody of the state treasurer:

Provide funds to the NHL Seattle foundation and to support the boundless Washington program in the following manner: (a) Fifty percent to the NHL Seattle foundation, or its successor organization, to help marginalized youth succeed in life through increased access to sports and other opportunities; (b) twenty-five percent to the office of the lieutenant governor solely to administer the boundless Washington program to facilitate opportunities for young people with physical and sensory disabilities to enjoy and experience the outdoors; and (c) twenty-five percent to the NHL Seattle foundation, or its successor organization, for providing financial support to allow youth to participate in hockey

Seattle Seahawks

Washington tennis

Provide funds to cities to assist in the construction and maintenance of a public tennis facility with at least four indoor tennis courts. A city is eligible for construction funds if the city does not already have a public or private facility with at least four indoor tennis courts. Funds for construction must first be made available to the most populous eligible city, according to the most recent census, for a time period not to exceed five years after January 1, 2017. After the five-year time period, the funds for construction must be made available to the next most populous eligible city. Funds for the maintenance of a public tennis facility with at least four indoor tennis courts must first be made available to the first eligible city that utilizes funds for construction provided by chapter 16, Laws of 2016

Build awareness of Washington's national parks and support priority park programs and projects in Washington's national parks, such as enhancing visitor experience, promoting volunteerism, engaging communities, and providing educational opportunities related to Washington's national parks

(3) Except as otherwise provided in this section, only the director or the director's designee may authorize expenditures from the accounts described in subsection (2) of this section. The accounts are subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an appropriation is not required for expenditures.

(4) Except as otherwise provided in this section, funds in the special license plate accounts described in subsection (2) of this section must be disbursed subject to the conditions described in subsection (2) of this section and under contract between the department and qualified nonprofit organizations that provide the services described in subsection (2) of this section.

(5) Funds from the Seattle Seahawks account may be provided to the lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the Washington world fellows program. Of the amounts received by the lieutenant governor's office under this subsection, at least ninety percent must be provided as fellowships under the program.

(6) Beginning January 1, 2019, funds from the Seattle Mariners account may be provided to the office of lieutenant governor solely for the purpose of administering the sports mentoring program. Of the amounts received by the office of lieutenant governor, at least ninety percent must be applied towards services directly provided to youth participants.

(7) For the purposes of this section, a "qualified nonprofit organization" means a not-for-profit corporation operating in Washington that has received a determination of tax exempt status under 26 U.S.C. Sec. 501(c)(3). The qualified nonprofit organization must meet all the requirements under RCW 46.18.100(1).

NEW SECTION. **Sec. 4.** A new section is added to chapter 46.04 RCW to read as follows:

"Seattle NHL hockey special license plates" means special license plates issued under RCW 46.18.200 that display the logo of the national hockey league team based in Seattle.

1 NEW SECTION. **Sec. 5.** This act takes effect October 1, 2020."

2 On page 1, line 1 of the title, after "Relating to" strike the
3 remainder of the title and insert "certain sports-related special
4 license plates; reenacting and amending RCW 46.17.220, 46.18.200, and
5 46.68.420; adding a new section to chapter 46.04 RCW; and providing
6 an effective date."

EFFECT: (1) Lowers the Office of Lieutenant Governor Boundless Washington allocations from the Seattle NHL special license plate revenue from 50 percent to 25 percent.

(2) Directs 25 percent of the Seattle NHL special license plate revenue to youth hockey financial support and adds the Seattle NHL foundation as the coordinating entity for this activity.

(3) Adds a provision that requires the submission of 3,500 signatures of people indicating a willingness to purchase the Seattle NHL plate before Department of Licensing would be allowed to issue the plate.

(4) Expands the allowable uses of the current 75 percent distribution of the Seattle Mariner special license plate revenue to the Office of Lieutenant Governor sports mentoring programs to also include the Boundless Washington program to facilitate opportunities for young people with physical and sensory disabilities to enjoy and experience the outdoors (the other 25 percent remains for the Office of Lieutenant Governor's Washington World Fellows program).
