1 On page 10, after line 14 insert the following:

2 "Sec. 11. RCW 28A.150.265 and 2017 3rd sp.s. c 13 s 409 are each  
3 amended to read as follows:

4 (1) To the extent that career and technical education funding  
5 allocations under RCW 28A.150.260 (4)(c) and (9) exceed general  
6 education funding allocations under RCW 28A.150.260, school districts  
7 (~~may~~) must use the difference only for the career and technical  
8 education purposes, defined as follows:

9 (a) Staff salaries and benefits (~~for~~) associated with direct  
10 career and technical education (~~program delivery~~) extended learning  
11 activities to meet career and technical education standards  
12 established by the office of the superintendent of public instruction  
13 under RCW 28A.700.010;

14 (b) Materials, supplies, and operating costs;

15 (c) Smaller class sizes;

16 (d) Work-based learning programs such as internships and  
17 preapprenticeship programs, including coordination tied to career and  
18 technical education coursework;

19 (e) Establishing new (~~high quality~~) career and technical  
20 education (~~and expanded learning~~) programs (~~development in high-~~  
21 demand fields) that meet career and technical education program  
22 standards;

23 (f) Certificated work-based learning coordinators and career  
24 guidance advisors and certificated career and technical education  
25 administrators;

26 (g) School expenses associated with career and technical  
27 education community partnerships with a career discovery focus  
28 including research or evidence-based mentoring programs and expanded  
29 learning opportunities in school, before or after school, and during  
30 the summer, and career-focused education programs with private and  
31 public K-12 schools and colleges, community-based organizations and

1 nonprofit organizations, industry partners, tribal governments, and  
2 workforce development entities;

3 (h) Student fees for national and state industry-recognized  
4 certifications; and

5 (i) Course equivalency development to integrate core learning  
6 standards into career and technical education courses.

7 (2) A school district's maximum allowable indirect cost charges  
8 for approved career and technical education programs funded by the  
9 state may not exceed the lower of five percent or the cap established  
10 in federal law for federal career and technical education funding  
11 provided to school districts, as the federal law existed on September  
12 1, 2017.

13 (3) For the purposes of this section, "extended learning" means  
14 learning activities that extend beyond the scheduled school day and  
15 school year."

16 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any  
17 internal references accordingly.

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18 On page 1, line 2 of the title, after "28C.18.060" insert "and  
19 28A.150.265"

EFFECT: Directs that dedicated funds for the enhancement of  
career and technical education be used for expenditures specific to  
the implementation of career and technical education above and beyond  
general education requirements and allocations.

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
