12 The appropriations in this section are subject to the following
13 conditions and limitations:

14 (1) The \$50,000 general fund-state appropriation in this section
15 is for the law enforcement officers' and firefighters' retirement
16 system plan 2 board to study the tax, legal, fiscal, policy, and
17 administrative issues related to allowing tribal law enforcement
18 officers to become members of the law enforcement officers' and
19 firefighters' plan 2 retirement system. This funding is in addition
20 to other expenditures in the nonappropriated law enforcement
21 officers' and firefighters' retirement system plan 2 expense
22 account. In preparing this study, the department of retirement
23 systems, the attorney general's office, and the office of the state
24 actuary shall provide the board with any information or assistance
25 the board requests. The board shall also receive stakeholder input
26 as part of its deliberation. The board shall submit a report of the
27 results of this study to the legislature by January 1, 2020.

1 (2) \$50,000 of the law enforcement officers' and firefighters'
2 plan 2 expense nonappropriated fund—state appropriation is provided
3 solely for a study of the pension benefits provided to emergency
4 medical technicians providing services in King county between
5 October 1, 1978 and January 1, 2003. The board shall examine the
6 legal and fiscal implications of extending membership in the plan
7 for these periods, including King county employers that might be
8 included, the benefits that would be paid to members on a
9 prospective and retroactive basis, and the contribution requirements
10 and plan liability that would be created for employers, employees,
11 and the state."

12 Renumber the remaining sections consecutively and correct any
13 internal references accordingly.

14 Corrects the technical portion of the title.

Firefighters' Plan 2 Retirement Board to study the implications of
extending membership to emergency medical technicians that worked in
King County between October 1, 1978 and January 1, 2003.
