• Requires transmission of a joint memorial urging the federal government to prohibit the sale of tobacco and vapor products to people under twenty-one years old, upon passage of Senate Bill 5057.

Background: Retailers may currently not sell or give tobacco or vapor products to anyone under the age of eighteen years old. The Health & Long Term Care Committee heard Senate Bill 5057, which would prohibit the sale of tobacco and vapor products to anyone under the age of twenty-one years old. The committee adopted an amendment to the bill stating if passed, a joint memorial would be transmitted to the federal government upon passage of Senate Bill 5057 and signature by the Governor.

Summary of Joint Memorial: Upon passage of Senate Bill 5057, and signature by the Governor, a joint memorial must be transmitted to the President of the United States, the President of the United States Senate, and the Speaker of the House of Representatives,
