Background: Marathon Park is a 2.25-acre waterfront park constructed in 1970. The park earned the name Marathon Park when the City of Olympia competed for, and won, the right to host the United States time trials for the first Women's Olympic Marathon, in 1984. The marathon route for the trials began and ended at the park.

The trials were run in May 1984 and won by Joan Benoit Samuelson. She went on to win the first Women's Olympic Marathon at the 1984 Summer Olympics in Los Angeles, California. Joan is a 1999 inductee into the International Women's Sports Foundation Hall of Fame and was voted into the Olympic Hall of Fame in 2008.

Summary of Concurrent Resolution: Marathon Park is renamed Joan Benoit Samuelson Marathon Park. Department of Enterprise services must properly sign the park as Joan Benoit Samuelson Marathon Park.
