HB 1303 - DIGEST

Requires the department of children, youth, and families, in consultation with the state board for community and technical colleges and the student achievement council, to revise any rules that require applicants or consumers, who are full-time community or technical college students and who are not WorkFirst participants, to work at least an average of twenty or more hours per week, or at least an average of sixteen hours or more per week in a federal or state workstudy program, as a condition of receiving working connections child care program benefits.
