9	(a) The membership of the work group shall emphasize individuals
10	with actual, practical experience dealing with the behavioral health
11	system and shall include:
12	(i) Individuals who have received behavioral health services in a
13	variety of settings and circumstances throughout the behavioral
14	health system;
15	(ii) Family members of individuals who have received behavioral
16	health services;
17	(iii) Behavioral health treatment providers with experience
18	providing behavioral health services in various settings, including
19	crisis behavioral health services. Providers serving on the work
20	group may not represent, or be employed by, any organizations or
21	interest groups representing the interests of health care providers
22	or behavioral health stakeholders;
23	(iv) Tribal representatives with experience providing or
24	receiving behavioral health services from tribal health departments;
25	(v) Members of the clergy;
26	(vi) Law enforcement officers with training and experience in
27	responding to individuals with behavioral health conditions or who
28	are undergoing behavioral health crises;
29	(vii) Behavioral health advocates; and
30	(viii) Any other individuals with experience in the behavioral
31	health system, as deemed appropriate by the department.
32	(b) The work group shall, at a minimum, discuss:

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1	(i) Factors leading to increased demand for behavioral health
2	services in Washington;
3	(ii) Barriers to addressing unmet needs and any gaps in the
4	behavioral health system;
5	(iii) The effectiveness of the state's integrated care initiative
6	regarding access for the seriously mentally ill, reductions in
7	hospitalization and institutionalization, improvements in community-
8	based care, and support for an effective network of community-based
9	care providers for the seriously mentally ill; and
10	(iv) Suggestions for improving the behavioral health system,
11	including methods to address behavioral health workforce shortages.
12	(c) The work group shall submit to the governor and the
13	appropriate committees of the legislature a progress report by
14	December 15, 2022, and its findings and recommendations by June 30,
15	<u>2023.</u> "
