AN ACT Relating to the capital budget; making appropriations and 1 2 authorizing expenditures for capital improvements; amending RCW 3 43.19.501, 28B.15.210, 28B.15.310, 28B.20.725, 28B.30.750, 28B.77.070, 39.35D.030, 4 28B.35.370, 28B.50.360, 43.63A.750, 43.88D.010, and 43.185.050; amending 2019 c 413 ss 1004, 1007, 1010, 5 1012, 1014, 1032, 1058, 1060, 1074, 1079, 1066, 1097, 6 1098, 1108, 7 1109, 2034, 2088, 2089, 3020, 3091, 3217, 3235, 3278, 3301, 4002, 8 4004, 5011, 5020, and 5047, and 2020 c 356 ss 6002, 1003, 1006, 1011, 9 1013, 1009, 1022, 1027, 3025, 5002, and 5011 (uncodified); reenacting 10 and amending RCW 43.155.050 and 90.94.090; creating new sections; 11 repealing 2019 c 413 ss 1059 and 1107 (uncodified); making 12 appropriations; and declaring an emergency.

13 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

14 NEW SECTION. Sec. 1. (1) A capital budget is hereby adopted and, subject to the provisions set forth in this act, the several 15 16 dollar amounts hereinafter specified, or so much thereof as shall be 17 sufficient to accomplish the designated, purposes are hereby 18 appropriated and authorized to be incurred for capital projects 19 during the period beginning with the effective date of this act and 20 ending June 30, 2023, out of the several funds specified in this act.

(2) The definitions in this subsection apply throughout this act
 unless the context clearly requires otherwise.

3 (a) "Fiscal year 2022" or "FY 2022" means the period beginning
4 July 1, 2021, and ending June 30, 2022.

5 (b) "Fiscal year 2023" or "FY 2023" means the period beginning 6 July 1, 2022, and ending June 30, 2023.

7 (c) "Lapse" or "revert" means the amount shall return to an 8 unappropriated status.

9 (d) "Provided solely" means the specified amount may be spent 10 only for the specified purpose.

(3) Unless otherwise specifically authorized in this act, any portion of an amount provided solely for a specified purpose that is not expended subject to the specified conditions and limitations to fulfill the specified purpose shall lapse.

(4) The amounts shown under the headings "Prior Biennia," "Future 15 16 Biennia," and "Total" in this act are for informational purposes only 17 and do not constitute legislative approval of these amounts. "Prior biennia" typically refers to the immediate prior biennium for 18 reappropriations, but may refer to multiple biennia in the case of 19 specific projects. A "future biennia" amount is an estimate of what 20 21 may be appropriated for the project or program in the 2023-2025 biennium and the following three biennia; an amount of zero does not 22 23 necessarily constitute legislative intent to not provide funding for the project or program in the future. 24

(5) "Reappropriations" in this act are appropriations and, unless the context clearly provides otherwise, are subject to the relevant conditions and limitations applicable to appropriations. Reappropriations shall be limited to the unexpended balances remaining on June 30, 2021, from the 2019-2021 biennial appropriations for each project.

MISCELLANEOUS PROVISIONS

Sec. 7001. RCW 43.88.031 requires the disclosure 3 NEW SECTION. of the estimated debt service costs associated with new capital bond 4 5 appropriations. 1 (5) Department of social and health services: Enter into a financing contract for up to \$110,637,000 plus costs and financing 2 3 expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a nursing facility on the fircrest residential habilitation 4 center campus. The department may contract to lease develop or lease 5 6 purchase the facility. Before entering into a contract, the department must consult with the office of financial management and 7 the office of the state treasurer. Should the department of social 8 and health services choose to use a financing contract that does not 9 10 provide for the issuance of certificates of participation, the 11 financing contract shall be subject to approval by the state finance 12 committee as required by RCW 39.94.010. In approving a financing contract not providing for the use of certificates of participation, 13 the state finance committee should be reasonably certain that the 14 15 contract is excluded from the computation of indebtedness, 16 particularly that the contract is not backed by the full faith and 17 credit of the state and the legislature is expressly not obligated to 18 appropriate funds to make payments. For purposes of this subsection, 19 "financing contract" includes but is not limited to a certificate of participation and tax exempt financing similar to that authorized in 20 21 RCW 47.79.140.

22

(6) Community and technical colleges:

(a) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Grays Harbor
 College for up to \$3,200,000 plus financing expenses and required
 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct a student
 services and instructional building.

(b) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Shoreline Community College for up to \$3,128,000 plus financing expenses and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to construct an allied health, science, and manufacturing replacement building.

31 (c) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of South Puget 32 Sound Community College for up to \$5,000,000 plus financing expenses 33 and required reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to renovate a 34 health education building.

35 (d) Enter into a financing contract on behalf of Bates Technical 36 College for up to \$1,350,000 plus financing expenses and required 37 reserves pursuant to chapter 39.94 RCW to purchase land and 38 facilities.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7003. (1) To ensure that major construction projects are carried out in accordance with legislative and executive intent, agencies must complete a predesign for state construction projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$5,000,000, or \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions. "Total anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the predesign, design, and construction phases of the project.

8 (2) Appropriations for design may not be expended or encumbered 9 until the office of financial management has reviewed and approved 10 the agency's predesign.

11 (3) The predesign must explore at least three project 12 alternatives. These alternatives must be both distinctly different and viable solutions to the issue being addressed. The chosen 13 alternative should be the most reasonable and cost-effective 14 solution. The predesign document must include, but not be limited to, 15 16 program, site, and cost analysis, and an analysis of the life-cycle 17 costs of the alternatives explored, in accordance with the predesign 18 manual adopted by the office of financial management.

19 (4) The office of financial management may make an exception to 20 the predesign requirements in this section after notifying the 21 legislative fiscal committees and waiting ten days for comment by the 22 legislature regarding the proposed exception.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7004. (1) The legislature finds that use of 23 24 life-cycle cost analysis will aid public entities, architects, 25 engineers, and contractors in making design and construction decisions that positively impact both the initial construction cost 26 27 and the ongoing operating and maintenance cost of a project. To 28 ensure that the total cost of a project is accounted for and the most reasonable and cost efficient design is used, agencies shall develop 29 30 life-cycle costs for any construction project over \$10,000,000. The 31 life-cycle costs must represent the present value sum of capital costs, installation costs, operating costs, and maintenance costs 32 over the life expectancy of the project. The legislature further 33 finds the most effective approach to the life-cycle cost analysis is 34 35 to integrate it into the early part of the design process.

36 (2) Agencies must develop a minimum of three project alternatives 37 for use in the life-cycle cost analysis. These alternatives must be 38 both distinctly different and viable solutions to the issue being 39 addressed. Agencies must choose the most reasonable and cost-

effective solution, as supported by the life-cycle cost analysis. A brief description of each project alternative and why it was chosen must be included in the life-cycle cost analysis section of the predesign.

5 (3) The office of financial management shall: (a) Make available 6 a life-cycle cost model to be used for analysis; (b) in consultation 7 with the department of enterprise services, provide assistance in 8 using the life-cycle cost model; and (c) update the life-cycle cost 9 model annually including assumptions for inflation rates, discount 10 rates, and energy rates.

(4) Agencies shall consider architectural and engineering firms' and general contractors' experience using life-cycle costs, operating costs, and energy efficiency measures when selecting an architectural and engineering firm, or when selecting contractors using alternative contracting methods.

Sec. 7005. Agencies administering construction 16 NEW SECTION. projects with a total anticipated cost in excess of \$5,000,000, or 17 18 \$10,000,000 for higher education institutions, must submit progress reports to the office of financial management and to the fiscal 19 20 committees of the house of representatives and senate. "Total anticipated cost" means the sum of the anticipated cost of the 21 predesign, design, and construction phases of the project. Reports 22 must be submitted on July 1st and December 31st of each year in a 23 24 format determined by the office of financial management. After the 25 project is completed, agencies must also submit a closeout report identifies the total project cost 26 that and any unspent 27 appropriations.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7006. (1) Allotments for appropriations in this act shall be provided in accordance with the capital project review requirements adopted by the office of financial management and in compliance with RCW 43.88.110. Projects that will be employing alternative public works construction procedures under chapter 39.10 RCW are subject to the allotment procedures defined in this section and RCW 43.88.110.

35 (2) Each project is defined as proposed in the legislative budget 36 notes or in the governor's budget document.

1 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7007. (1) The office of financial management may authorize a transfer of appropriation authority provided for a 2 capital project that is in excess of the amount required for the 3 completion of such project to another capital project for which the 4 appropriation is insufficient. No such transfer may be used to expand 5 6 the capacity of any facility beyond that intended in making the appropriation. Such transfers may be effected only between capital 7 appropriations to a specific department, commission, agency, or 8 institution of higher education and only between capital projects 9 that are funded from the same fund or account. No transfers may occur 10 11 between projects to local government agencies except where the grants 12 are provided within a single omnibus appropriation and where such transfers are specifically authorized by the implementing statutes 13 14 that govern the grants.

(2) The office of financial management may find that an amount is 15 16 in excess of the amount required for the completion of a project only 17 if: (a) The project as defined in the notes to the budget document is substantially complete and there are funds remaining; or (b) bids 18 have been let on a project and it appears to a substantial certainty 19 that the project as defined in the notes to the budget document can 20 be completed within the biennium for 21 less than the amount 22 appropriated in this act.

(3) For the purposes of this section, the intent is that each project be defined as proposed to the legislature in the governor's budget document, unless it clearly appears from the legislative history that the legislature intended to define the scope of a project in a different way.

(4) A report of any transfer effected under this section, except emergency projects or any transfer under \$250,000, shall be filed with the legislative fiscal committees of the senate and house of representatives by the office of financial management at least thirty days before the date the transfer is effected. The office of financial management shall report all emergency or smaller transfers within thirty days from the date of transfer.

35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7008. (1) It is expected that projects be 36 ready to proceed in a timely manner depending on the type or phase of 37 the project or program that is the subject of the appropriation in 38 this act. Except for major projects that customarily may take more 39 than two biennia to complete from predesign to the end of 1 construction, or large infrastructure grant or loan programs 2 supporting projects that often take more than two biennia to 3 complete, the legislature generally does not intend to reappropriate 4 funds more than once, particularly for smaller grant programs, local/ 5 community projects, and minor works.

13 (3) To the extent feasible, agencies are directed to accelerate 14 expenditure rates at their current level of permanent employees and 15 shall use contracted design and construction services wherever 16 necessary to meet the goals of this section.

17 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7009. (1) Any building project that receives 18 over \$10,000,000 in funding from the capital budget must be built to sustainable standards. "Sustainable building" means a building that 19 20 integrates and optimizes all major high-performance building attributes, including energy efficiency, durability, life-cycle 21 22 performance, and occupant productivity, and minimizes greenhouse gas emissions. The following design and construction attributes must be 23 24 integrated into the building project:

25 (a) Employ integrated design principles: Use a collaborative, integrated planning and design process that initiates and maintains 26 27 an integrated project team in all stages of a project's planning and 28 delivery. Establish performance goals for siting, energy, water, materials, and indoor environmental quality along with other 29 30 comprehensive design goals and ensures incorporation of these goals 31 throughout the design and life-cycle of the building. Consider all stages of the building's life-cycle, including deconstruction. 32

33 (b) Commissioning: Employ commissioning practices tailored to the 34 size and complexity of the building and its system components in 35 order to verify performance of building components and systems and 36 help ensure that design requirements are met. This should include an 37 experienced commissioning provider, inclusion of commissioning 38 requirements in construction documents, a commissioning plan,

verification of the installation and performance of systems to be
 commissioned, and a commissioning report.

3 (c) Optimize energy performance: Establish a whole building 4 performance target that takes into account the intended use, 5 occupancy, operations, plug loads, other energy demands, and design 6 to earn the ENERGY STAR targets for new construction and major 7 renovation where applicable. For new construction target low energy 8 use index. For major renovations, target reducing energy use by fifty 9 percent below prerenovations baseline.

10 (d) On-site renewable energy: Implement renewable energy 11 generation projects on agency property for agency use, when life-12 cycle cost effective.

(e) High-efficiency electric equipment: Use only high-efficiency
 electric equipment for water and space heating needs not met through
 on-site renewable energy, when life-cycle cost effective.

16 (f) Measurement and verification: For buildings over 50,000 17 square feet, install building level electricity meters in new major 18 construction and renovation projects to track and continuously 19 optimize performance. Include equivalent meters for natural gas and 20 steam, where natural gas and steam are used. Where appropriate, 21 install dashboards inside buildings to display and incentivize 22 occupants on energy use.

(g) Benchmarking: Compare performance data from the first year of operation with the energy design target. Verify that the building performance meets or exceeds the design target. For other building and space types, use an equivalent benchmarking tool.

27 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7010. State agencies, including institutions 28 of higher education, shall allot and report full-time equivalent 29 staff for capital projects in a manner comparable to staff reporting 30 for operating expenditures.

Sec. 7011. Executive Order No. 05-05, 31 NEW SECTION. archaeological and cultural resources, was issued effective November 32 10, 2005. Agencies shall comply with the requirements set forth in 33 this executive order and must consult with the department 34 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes on the 35 potential effects of projects on cultural resources and historic 36 37 properties proposed in state-funded construction or acquisition projects, including grant or pass-through funding that culminates in 38

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1 construction or land acquisitions. Consultation with the department 2 of archaeology and historic preservation and affected tribes must be 3 initiated early in the project planning process, prior to 4 construction or taking title.

5 Sec. 7012. RCW 43.19.501 and 2020 c 356 s 7005 are each amended 6 to read as follows:

7 The Thurston county capital facilities account is created in the 8 state treasury. The account is subject to the appropriation and 9 allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW. Moneys in the account 10 may be expended for capital projects in facilities owned and managed 11 by the department in Thurston county.

During the 2019-2021 <u>and 2021-2023</u> fiscal ((biennium)) <u>biennia</u>, the Thurston county capital facilities account may be appropriated for costs associated with staffing to support capital budget and project activities and lease and facility oversight activities.

16 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7013. FOR THE ARTS COMMISSION—ART WORK 17 ALLOWANCE. (1) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this 18 act for original construction of school plant facilities is provided 19 solely for the purposes of RCW 28A.335.210.

20 (2) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act 21 for original construction or any major renovation or remodel work 22 exceeding \$200,000 by colleges or universities is provided solely for 23 the purposes of RCW 28B.10.027.

(3) One-half of one percent of moneys appropriated in this act
for original construction of any public building by a state agency
identified in RCW 43.17.200 is provided solely for the purposes of
RCW 43.17.200.

28 (4) At least eighty percent of the moneys spent by the Washington 29 state arts commission during the 2021-2023 biennium for the purposes 30 of RCW 28A.335.210, 28B.10.027, and 43.17.200 must be expended solely for direct acquisition of works of art. Except for art allocations 31 made under K-3 class size reduction grants under section 5023 of this 32 act, art allocations not expended within the ensuing two biennia will 33 34 lapse. The commission may use up to \$200,000 of this amount to 35 conserve or maintain existing pieces in the state art collection.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7014. To carry out the provisions of this

If any federal moneys appropriated by 4 5 this act for capital projects are not received by the state, the department or agency to which the moneys were appropriated may 6 replace the federal moneys with funds available from private or local 7 sources. No replacement may occur under this section without the 8 prior approval of the director of financial management 9 in 10 consultation with the senate ways and means committee and the house of representatives capital budget committee. 11

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7016. (1) Unless otherwise stated, for all 13 appropriations under this act that require a match of nonstate money 14 or in-kind contributions, the following requirement, consistent with 15 RCW 43.88.150, shall apply: Expenditures of state money shall be 16 timed so that the state share of project expenditures never exceeds 17 the intended state share of total project costs.

18 (2) Provision of the full amount of required matching funds is 19 not required to permit the expenditure of capital budget 20 appropriations for phased projects if a proportional amount of the 21 required matching funds is provided for each distinct, identifiable 22 phase of the project.

23 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7017. NONTAXABLE AND TAXABLE BOND PROCEEDS. Portions of the appropriation authority granted by this act from the 24 25 state building construction account, or any other account receiving 26 bond proceeds, may be transferred to the state taxable building construction account as deemed necessary by the state finance 27 28 committee to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules and regulations pertaining to the use of nontaxable bond proceeds. 29 30 Portions of the general obligation bond proceeds authorized by chapter . . ., Laws of 2021, (Z-0106/21 (State General Bonds and 31 32 General Accounts)) for deposit into the state taxable building 33 construction account that are in excess of amounts required to comply with the federal internal revenue service rules and regulations shall 34 be deposited into the state building construction account. The state 35 36 treasurer shall submit written notification to the director of 37 financial management if it is determined that a shift of

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appropriation authority between the state building construction account, or any other account receiving bond proceeds, and the state taxable building construction account is necessary, or that a shift of appropriation authority from the state taxable building construction account to the state building construction account may be made.

7 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7018. (1) Minor works project lists are single line appropriations that include multiple projects of a 8 similar nature and that are valued between \$25,000 and \$1,000,000 9 each, with the exception of higher education minor works projects 10 11 that may be valued up to \$2,000,000. Funds appropriated in this act for minor works may not be initially allotted until agencies submit 12 project lists to the office of financial management for review and 13 14 approval.

4 (d) Minor works preservation projects may include program 5 improvements of no more than twenty-five percent of the individual 6 minor works preservation project cost.

7 (e) Improvements for accessibility in compliance with the 8 Americans with disabilities act may be included in any of the minor 9 works categories.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7019. FOR THE STATE TREASURER-TRANSFERS 10 11 (1) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer 12 to the drinking water assistance account, up to 13 \$5,500,000 for fiscal year 2022 and up to \$5,500,000 for 14 (2) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer 15 16 to the statewide broadband account, \$20,000,000 for fiscal 17 year 2022 and \$20,000,000 for fiscal year 2023. \$40,000,000 18 (3) Public Works Assistance Account: For transfer to the water pollution control revolving 19 20 account, up to \$6,000,000 for fiscal year 2022 and 21 up to \$6,000,000 for fiscal year 2023.... \$12,000,000

22 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7020. To the extent that any appropriation 23 authorizes expenditures of state funds from the state building 24 construction account, or from any other capital project account in 25 the state treasury, for a capital project or program that is specified to be funded with proceeds from the sale of bonds, the 26 27 legislature declares that any such expenditures for that project or program made prior to the issue date of the applicable bonds are 28 29 intended to be reimbursed from proceeds of those bonds in a maximum 30 amount equal to the amount of such appropriation.

31 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7021. 27 Sec. 7028. RCW 28B.35.370 and 2019 c 413 s 7027 are each amended 28 to read as follows:

Within thirty-five days from the date of collection thereof all building fees of each regional university and The Evergreen State College shall be paid into the state treasury and these together with such normal school fund revenues as provided in RCW 28B.35.751 as are received by the state treasury shall be credited as follows:

(1) On or before June 30th of each year the board of trustees of each regional university and The Evergreen State College, if issuing bonds payable out of its building fees and above described normal school fund revenues, shall certify to the state treasurer the amounts required in the ensuing twelve months to pay and secure the payment of the principal of and interest on such bonds. 4 (3) Funds available in the respective capital projects accounts
5 may also be used for certificates of participation under chapter
6 39.94 RCW.

7 Sec. 7029. RCW 28B.50.360 and 2019 c 413 s 7028 are each amended 8 to read as follows:

9 Within thirty-five days from the date of start of each quarter 10 all collected building fees of each such community and technical 11 college shall be paid into the state treasury, and shall be credited 12 as follows:

(1) On or before June 30th of each year the college board, if 13 issuing bonds payable out of building fees, shall certify to the 14 15 state treasurer the amounts required in the ensuing twelve-month 16 period to pay and secure the payment of the principal of and interest 17 on such bonds. 16 (1) The council shall identify budget priorities and levels of 17 funding for higher education, including the two and four-year institutions of higher education and state financial aid programs. 16 Sec. 7031. RCW 43.63A.750 and 2020 c 356 s 7008 are each amended 17 to read as follows:

(1) A competitive grant program to assist nonprofit organizations
 in acquiring, constructing, or rehabilitating performing arts, art
 museums, and cultural facilities is created.

21 The department shall submit a list of recommended (2) (a) 22 performing arts, art museum projects, and cultural organization projects eligible for funding to the governor and the legislature in 23 24 the department's biennial capital budget request beginning with the 2001-2003 biennium and thereafter. The list, in priority order, shall 25 include a description of each project, the amount of recommended 26 27 state funding, and documentation of nonstate funds to be used for the project. This 34 subsection applies to major facility projects that have not entered 35 the design phase prior to July 24, 2005, and to the extent 36 appropriate LEED silver standards exist for that type of building or 37 38 facility. During the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, high-performance building certifications other than LEED silver standard are allowed 39

1 where the legislature determines that the certification is at least 2 equivalent to the LEED silver standard.

3 (2) All major facility projects of any entity other than a public 4 agency or public school district receiving any funding in a state 5 capital budget must be designed, constructed, and certified to at 6 least the LEED silver standard. This subsection applies to major 7 facility projects that have not entered the grant application process 8 prior to July 24, 2005, and to the extent appropriate LEED silver 9 standards exist for that type of building or facility.

10 (3)(a) Public agencies, under this section, shall monitor and 11 document ongoing operating savings resulting from major facility 12 projects designed, constructed, and certified as required under this 13 section.

(b) Public agencies, under this section, shall report annually tothe department on major facility projects and operating savings.

16 (4) The department shall consolidate the reports required in 17 subsection (3) of this section into one report and report to the governor and legislature by September 1st of each even-numbered year 18 19 beginning in 2006 and ending in 2016. In its report, the department shall also report on the implementation of this chapter, including 20 21 reasons why the LEED standard was not used as required by RCW 39.35D.020(5)(b). The department shall make recommendations regarding 22 23 the ongoing implementation of this chapter, including a discussion of incentives and disincentives related to implementing this chapter. 24

37 (1) By October 1st of each even-numbered year, the office of 38 financial management shall complete an objective analysis and scoring 39 of all capital budget projects proposed by the public four-year 1 institutions of higher education and submit the results of the 2 scoring process to the legislative fiscal committees and the four-3 year institutions. (c) Projects that renovate facilities to restore building life 20 21 and upgrade space to meet current program requirements. Renovation 22 projects should represent a complete renovation of a total facility 23 or an isolated wing of a facility. A reasonable renovation project should cost between sixty to eighty percent of current replacement 24 25 value and restore the renovated area to at least twenty-five years of 26 useful life. New space may be programmed for the same or a different use than the space being renovated and may include additions to 27 28 improve access and enhance the relationship of program or support 29 space;

30

(d) Major stand-alone campus infrastructure projects;

31 (e) Projects that promote economic growth and innovation through 32 expanded research activity. The acquisition and installation of 33 specialized equipment is authorized under this category; and

34 (f) Other project categories as determined by the office of 35 financial management in consultation with the legislative fiscal 36 committees.

37 (2) The office of financial management, in consultation with the 38 legislative fiscal committees, shall establish a scoring system and 39 process for each four-year project category that is based on the 40 framework used in the community and technical college system of

1 prioritization. Staff from the state board for community and 2 technical colleges and the four-year institutions shall provide 3 technical assistance on the development of a scoring system and 4 process.

5 (3) The office of financial management shall consult with the 6 legislative fiscal committees in the scoring of four-year institution 7 project proposals, and may also solicit participation by independent 8 experts.

9 (a) For each four-year project category, the scoring system must, 10 at a minimum, include an evaluation of enrollment trends, 11 reasonableness of cost, the ability of the project to enhance 12 specific strategic master plan goals, age and condition of the 13 facility if applicable, and impact on space utilization.

14 (b) Each four-year project category may include projects at the 15 predesign, design, or construction funding phase.

16 (c) To the extent possible, the objective analysis and scoring 17 system of all capital budget projects shall occur within the context 18 of any and all performance agreements between the office of financial 19 management and the governing board of a public, four-year institution 20 of higher education that aligns goals, priorities, desired outcomes, 21 flexibility, institutional mission, accountability, and levels of 22 resources.

(4) In evaluating and scoring four-year institution projects, the office of financial management shall take into consideration project schedules that result in realistic, balanced, and predictable expenditure patterns over the ensuing three biennia.

(5) The office of financial management shall distribute common definitions, the scoring system, and other information required for the project proposal and scoring process as part of its biennial budget instructions. The office of financial management, in consultation with the legislative fiscal committees, shall develop common definitions that four-year institutions must use in developing their project proposals and lists under this section.

34 (6) In developing any scoring system for capital projects 35 proposed by the four-year institutions, the office of financial 36 management:

(a) Shall be provided with all required information by the four year institutions as deemed necessary by the office of financial
 management;

1 (b) May utilize independent services to verify, sample, or 2 evaluate information provided to the office of financial management 3 by the four-year institutions; and

4 (c) Shall have full access to all data maintained by the joint
5 legislative audit and review committee concerning the condition of

(9) For the ((2017-2019 fiscal biennium and the)) 2019-2021 fiscal biennium and the 2021-2023 fiscal biennium, pursuant to subsection (6)(a) of this section and in lieu of the requirements of subsection (7) of this section, by August 15, ((2020)) 2022, the institutions of higher education shall prepare and submit or resubmit to the office of financial management and the legislative fiscal committees:

34 (a) Individual project proposals developed pursuant to subsection35 (1) of this section;

36 (b) Individual project proposals scored in prior biennia pursuant 37 to subsection (1) of this section; and

38 (c) A prioritized list of up to five project proposals submitted39 pursuant to (a) and (b) of this subsection.

1 2 Sec. 7034. RCW 43.155.050 and 2019 c 415 s 972 and 2019 c 413 s 7033 are each reenacted and amended to read as follows:

3 The public works assistance account is hereby established in the state treasury. Money may be placed in the public works assistance 4 account from the proceeds of bonds when authorized by the legislature 5 6 or from any other lawful source. Money in the public works assistance 7 account shall be used to make loans and grants and to give financial guarantees to local governments for public works projects. Moneys in 8 9 the account may also be appropriated or transferred to the water pollution control revolving fund and the drinking water assistance 10 11 account to provide for state match requirements under federal law. 12 Not more than twenty percent of the biennial capital budget appropriation to the public works board from this account may be 13 14 expended or obligated for preconstruction loans and grants, emergency loans and grants, or loans and grants for capital facility planning 15 16 under this chapter. 1 (1) The department must use moneys from the housing trust fund and other legislative appropriations to finance in whole or in part 2 any loans or grant projects that will provide housing for persons and 3 families with special housing needs and with incomes at or below 4 fifty percent of the median family income for the county or standard 5 6 metropolitan statistical area where the project is located. At least 7 thirty percent of these moneys used in any given funding cycle must be for the benefit of projects located in rural areas of the state as 8 defined by the department. (f) Shelters and related services for the homeless, including emergency shelters and overnight youth shelters;

30 (g) Mortgage subsidies, including temporary rental and mortgage 31 payment subsidies to prevent homelessness;

32 (h) Mortgage insurance guarantee or payments for eligible 33 projects;

34 (i) Down payment or closing cost assistance for eligible first-35 time home buyers;

36 (j) Acquisition of housing units for the purpose of preservation 37 as low-income or very low-income housing;

38 (k) Projects making housing more accessible to families with 39 members who have disabilities; and 1 (1) Remodeling and improvements as required to meet building 2 code, licensing requirements, or legal operations to residential 3 properties owned and operated by an entity eligible under RCW 4 43.185A.040, which were transferred as described in RCW 5 82.45.010(3)(t) by the parent of a child with developmental 6 disabilities.

7 (3) Preference must be given for projects that include an early8 learning facility.

(4) Legislative appropriations from capital bond proceeds may be 9 used only for the costs of projects authorized under subsection 10 11 (2) (a), (i), and (j) of this section, and not for the administrative costs of the department, except that during the 2021-2023 fiscal 12 13 biennium, the department may use up to three percent of the appropriations from capital bond proceeds for administrative costs 14 associated with application, distribution, and project development 15 16 activities of the housing assistance program.

17 (5) Moneys from repayment of loans from appropriations from 18 capital bond proceeds may be used for all activities necessary for 19 the proper functioning of the housing assistance program except for 20 activities authorized under subsection (2)(b) and (c) of this 21 section.

(6) Administrative costs associated with application, distribution, and project development activities of the department may not exceed three percent of the annual funds available for the housing assistance program. Reappropriations must not be included in the calculation of the annual funds available for determining the administrative costs.

28 (7) Administrative costs associated with compliance and 29 monitoring activities of the department may not exceed one-quarter of 30 one percent annually of the contracted amount of state investment in 31 the housing assistance program.

32 Sec. 7036. RCW 90.94.090 and 2019 c 413 s 7035 are each 33 reenacted and amended to read as follows:

(1) A joint legislative task force on water resource mitigation is established to review the treatment of surface water and groundwater appropriations as they relate to instream flows and fish habitat, to develop and recommend a mitigation sequencing process and scoring system to address such appropriations, and to review the

(3) If a member has not been designated for a position set forth
 in subsection (2) of this section, that position may not be counted

31 (4) One cochair of the task force must be a member of the 32 majority caucus of one chamber of the legislature, and one cochair 33 must be a member of the minority caucus of the other chamber of the 34 legislature, as those caucuses existed as of January 19, 2018.

35 (5) The first meeting of the task force must occur by June 30,36 2018.

37 (6) Staff support for the task force must be provided by the 38 office of program research and senate committee services. The 39 department and the department of fish and wildlife shall cooperate with the task force and provide information as the cochairs
 reasonably request.

3 (7) Within existing appropriations, the expenses of the operations of the task force, including the expenses associated with 4 the task force's meetings, must be paid jointly and in equal amounts 5 6 by the senate and the house of representatives. (b) Recommendations of the joint legislative task force must be made by a sixty percent majority of the appointed members of the task force. The representatives of the departments of fish and wildlife, ecology, and agriculture are not eligible to vote on the recommendations. Minority recommendations that achieve the support of at least five of the appointed voting members of the task force may also be submitted to the legislature.

(9) The department shall issue permit decisions for up to five 30 31 water resource mitigation pilot projects. Where avoidance and minimization are 9 (C) not reasonably attainable, compensating for impacts by providing net ecological 10 11 benefits to fish and related aquatic resources in the water resource 12 inventory area through in-kind or out-of-kind mitigation or a combination thereof, that improves the function and productivity of 13 affected fish populations and related aquatic habitat. Out-of-kind 14 mitigation may include instream or out-of-stream measures that 15 16 improve or enhance existing water quality, riparian habitat, or other instream functions and values for which minimum instream flows or 17 closures were established in that watershed. 18

(10) The department must monitor the implementation of the pilot projects, including all mitigation associated with each pilot project, approved under this section at least annually through December 31, 2028.

(11) The pilot projects eligible for processing under thissection, based on criteria as of January 19, 2018, include:

(a) A city operating a group A water system in Kitsap county and water resource inventory area 15, with a population between 13,000 and 14,000;

(b) A city operating a group A water system in Pierce county and water resource inventory area 10, with a population between 9,500 and 10,500;

31 (c) A city operating a group A water system in Thurston county 32 and water resource inventory area 11, with a population between 8,500 33 and 9,500;

(d) A nonprofit mutual water system operating a group A water
 system in Pierce county and water resource inventory area 12, with
 between 10,500 and 11,500 service connections; and

37 (e) An irrigation district located in Whatcom county and water 38 resource inventory area 1, solely for the purpose of processing 39 changes of water rights from surface water to groundwater, and 40 implementing flow augmentation to benefit instream flows. 1 (12) Water right applicants eligible to be processed under this 2 pilot project authority must elect to be included in the pilot 3 project review by notifying the department by July 1, 2018. (17) This section expires January 1, 2029.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7037. The public use general aviation airport 34 loan revolving account is created in the custody of the state 35 treasurer. All receipts from moneys directed by law to the account 36 must be deposited into the account. Expenditures from the account may 37 be used only for the purposes described in section 7038 of this act. 38 Only the community aviation revitalization board or the board's 39 designee may authorize expenditures from the account. The account is

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1 subject to allotment procedures under chapter 43.88 RCW, but an 2 appropriation is not required for expenditures.

3 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7038. (1)(a) The community aviation 4 revitalization board is established to exercise the powers granted 5 under this section.

(b) The board must consist of a representative from the 6 department of transportation's aviation division, the public works 7 board, and a nonlegislative member of the community economic 8 revitalization board. The board must also consist of the following 9 members appointed by the secretary of transportation: One port 10 11 district official, one county official, one city official, one representative of airport managers, and one representative of a 12 general aviation pilots organization within Washington that has an 13 active membership and established location, chapter, or appointed 14 15 representative within Washington. The appointive members must 16 initially be appointed to terms as follows: Two members for two-year terms, and three members for three-year terms that must include the 17 18 chair. Members of the board may be removed for malfeasance or misfeasance in office, upon specific written charges by the secretary of transportation, under chapter 34.05 RCW.

31 (e) A member appointed by the secretary of transportation may not 32 be absent from more than 50 percent of the regularly scheduled 33 meetings in any one calendar year. Any member who exceeds this 34 absence limitation has withdrawn from the board and may be replaced 35 by the secretary of transportation.

36 (f) A majority of members currently appointed constitutes a 37 quorum.

(f) Accept any gifts, grants, loans of funds, property, or
financial or other aid in any form from any other source on any terms

(g) Enter into agreements or other transactions with and accept grants and cooperation from any governmental agency in furtherance of this section;

(h) Adopt rules under chapter 34.05 RCW as necessary to carry outthe purposes of this section; and

(i) Perform all acts and things necessary or convenient to carryout the powers expressly granted or implied under this section.

36 (4)(a)(i) The community aviation revitalization board may make 37 direct loans to airport sponsors of public use airports in the state 38 for the purpose of airport improvements that primarily support 39 general aviation activities. The board may provide loans for the 40 purpose of airport improvements only if the state is receiving

1 commensurate public benefit, which must include, as a condition of 2 the loan, a commitment to provide public access to the airport for a 3 period of time equivalent to one and one-half times the term of the 4 loan.

33 (B) Clearly identify the source of funds intended to repay the 34 loan.

35 (5) The public use general aviation airport loan program, when 36 authorized by the community aviation revitalization board, is subject 37 to the following conditions:

38 (a) The moneys in the public use general aviation airport loan 39 revolving account created in section 7037 of this act must be used 40 only to fulfill commitments arising from loans authorized in this 1 section. The total outstanding amount that the board must dispense at 2 any time pursuant to this section must not exceed the moneys 3 available from the account.

(b) On contracts made for public use general aviation airport 4 loans, the board must determine the interest rate that loans must 5 6 bear. The interest rate must not exceed the amount needed to cover 7 the administrative expenses of the board and the loan program. 19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7039. The legislature intends to consider 20 predesign funding for the Washington state patrol crime laboratory 21 I-5 consolidated facility in the 2022 supplemental capital budget. By December 1, 2021, the Washington state patrol must provide data to 22 support the request for a consolidated crime lab. The agency must 23 24 provide legislative fiscal staff with operating budget financial 25 information including, but not limited to, a list of each leased facility that will be vacated when the consolidated lab is completed. 26 27 For each facility, the Washington state patrol must provide at least 28 the:

(3) Lease facility street address;

36 (6) The most current six year facilities plan;

37 (7) An estimated certificate of participation payback schedule;38 and

1 (8) A summary of how the operating costs from subsection (1) of 2 this section will offset the certification of participation costs 3 from subsection (3) of this section by state fiscal year.

<u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7040. The department of social and health 4 5 services and the department of natural resources shall enter into long-term, revenue generating opportunities for underused portions of 6 the Fircrest Residential Habilitation Center bounded by 15th Ave NE 7 and NE 150th Street to benefit the charitable, educational, penal, 8 and reformatory institutions account. Long-term, revenue generating 9 10 opportunities may include, but are not limited to, land leases, land sales, and land swaps. It is the intent of the legislature that any 11 revenue obtained from these opportunities be used for services for 12 13 those with developmental disabilities. The department of social and health services and the department of natural resources must amend 14 15 their lease if necessary to conform with this section.

16 NEW SECTION. Sec. 7041. (1) The department of natural resources shall convene a work group of trust land beneficiaries and 17 stakeholders to develop a recommended process for the way trust land 18 19 transfer proposals are developed and implemented. Consideration should be made for increasing the income value of the trusts, 20 limiting impacts to trust lands not being considered for transfer, 21 conservation value of lands that are a potential candidate for 22 23 transfer, and use of the land bank for securing repositioned land 24 that would result from any transferred projects, and any other items 25 necessary for a well-supported program. 35 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7042. (1) The department of enterprise 36 services shall convene a construction industry work group to 37 recommend how to apply successful carbon reduction strategies,

1 incorporate necessary parameters of design and construction considerations, and allow for efficient and cost effective state 2 3 construction projects. The work group must be comprised of construction industry professionals as recommended by a leading 4 association on Washington business in design, specification, 5 6 construction, and material supply and construction professionals that have successfully realized real and measurable results. 7 The work group must also include a representative from the department of 8 enterprise services, representatives from environmental groups, and 9 someone of applicable expertise from the Washington academy of 10 11 sciences.

12 (2) The work group shall identify and recommend carbon reduction 13 strategies and environmental product declaration principles to 14 successfully apply in state construction projects and:

(a) Clarify the definition of environmental product declaration to ensure that environmental product declarations (EPD) are applied properly, consistently, and as intended and provide a baseline of understanding based on accepted metrics to obtain measurable results for state construction projects;

20 (b) Suggest a pilot project or project review to apply 21 construction industry recommendations and create an education and 22 standards brief that accompanies the report required under subsection 23 (3) of this section;

(c) Outline the environmental project review data collection process in functional detail and use existing data gathering resources such as EC3; and

(d) Identify measurable outcome criteria to establish a project baseline summary for use during design from estimated project material quantities using industry average environmental product declarations.

31 (3) The work group shall provide their recommendations in a 32 report to the fiscal committees of the legislature by January 1, 33 2022.

NEW SECTION. Sec. 7043. The office of financial management must compile a list of 2021-2023 fiscal biennium capital budget grant programs managed by state agencies and the direct and indirect administrative fee percentages charged for each. For the purposes of this section, "administrative fee percentages" means rates charged by state agencies and the rates grant recipients are allowed to charge

1 for direct and/or indirect administrative costs. The office of 2 financial management must submit the list of capital budget grant 3 programs and their associated administrative fee percentages to the 4 house capital budget committee and the senate ways and means 5 committee by October 1, 2021.

6 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7044. If any provision of this act or its 7 application to any person or circumstance is held invalid, the 8 remainder of the act or the application of the provision to other 9 persons or circumstances is not affected.

10 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7045. This act is necessary for the immediate 11 preservation of the public peace, health, or safety, or support of 12 the state government and its existing public institutions, and takes 13 effect immediately.
