4 Paso, Texas, and went on to graduate from Stanford Law School in  
5 1952; and

6 WHEREAS, Sandra Day O'Connor made history by becoming the first  
7 woman to serve as a Justice on the Supreme Court of the United  
8 States, nominated by President Ronald Reagan and confirmed by the  
9 Senate in 1981; and

10 WHEREAS, Justice O'Connor's distinguished career on the Supreme  
11 Court spanned from 1981 to 2006, during which she played a crucial  
12 role in shaping important legal decisions; and

13 WHEREAS, Justice O'Connor was known for her thoughtful and
