AN ACT Relating to creating the Washington dream act service incentive program; adding a new chapter to Title 28B RCW; and creating a new section.

4 BE IT ENACTED BY THE LEGISLATURE OF THE STATE OF WASHINGTON:

5 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 1. The definitions in this section apply 6 throughout this chapter unless the context clearly requires 7 otherwise.

8 (1) "Eligible student" means a student who meets the necessary 9 program requirements under section 3 of this act.

10 (2) "Institution of higher education" has the same meaning as in 11 RCW 28B.92.030.

12 (3) "Office" means the office of student financial assistance 13 created in RCW 28B.76.090.

(4) "Approved institution or organization" means an institution
of higher education, nonprofit organization, for-profit business
entity, or a governmental entity approved for participation in the
Washington dream act service incentive grant program by the office
under section 4 of this act.

19 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 2. (1) The Washington dream act service 20 incentive grant program is established in accordance with this act

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1 for the purpose of awarding grants to eligible students for community 2 or volunteer service. The office shall develop and administer the 3 service incentive grant program and may create and enter into 4 agreements with employers and institutions of higher education to 5 implement this chapter.

6 (2) Beginning in the 2025-26 academic year, the office shall 7 disperse grant awards to approved institutions for the awarding of 8 grants to eligible students for the completion of hours of service 9 for an approved institution or organization.

10 (3)(a) Grant awards shall be based on an eligible student's 11 financial need as determined by the office through the Washington 12 application for state financial aid. Student eligibility for the 13 grant program shall be determined by the office of student financial 14 aid of the institution of higher education in which the student is 15 enrolled or in which they have indicated that they will attend.

16 (b)(i) In calculating the awarding of grants and final grant 17 award amounts, the institution of higher education must take into 18 consideration other grants or financial aid that an eligible student 19 has been awarded.

(ii) Once a student is identified as eligible and an award is calculated, the institution of higher education shall submit anticipated awards and payment requests to the office using a process established by the office.

(iii) Grant awards per term shall be calculated by multiplying the number of hours of service to be performed per week by the number of weeks in the academic term by the adjusted minimum wage rate calculated by the department of labor and industries under RCW 49.46.020(2)(b), with consideration of other awarded financial aid under (b)(i) of this subsection.

30 (c) Grant awards shall be disbursed by the institution of higher 31 education at the beginning of the academic term.

32 (4) The community or volunteer service performed by the 33 participating student:

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(a) May not exceed 19 hours per week; and

35 (b) May not be advocacy of a political or religious nature.

36 (5)(a) The office shall establish a standardized method of 37 verification of completed service for participating students. Upon 38 verification of performed service by the institution of higher 39 education, the office of student financial aid of the institution of 40 higher education shall approve the grant for the subsequent academic

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1 term unless the student is otherwise no longer eligible to 2 participate in the program.

3 (b) If a participating student does not provide the documentation 4 required under (a) of this subsection, the institution of higher 5 education shall lease the estimated award in a nondisbursing status.

6 (6) Preference for participation in the program must be given to 7 eligible students who are not eligible for participation in the state 8 work-study program under chapter 28B.12 RCW.

9 (7) A grant awarded under the program shall not offset or replace 10 any other source of grant aid including, but not limited to, 11 institutional aid and scholarships.

12 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 3. (1) In order to be eligible to participate 13 in the Washington dream act service incentive grant program, a 14 student must meet the following requirements:

15 (a) The student must be a resident student as defined in RCW 16 28B.96.010;

17 (b) The student has completed the Washington application for 18 state financial aid;

19 (c) The student has indicated that they will attend an 20 institution of higher education or is enrolled for at least six 21 quarter credits or the equivalent semester credits and is making 22 satisfactory progress in a program, as defined in rule by the office, 23 at an institution of higher education;

24 (d) The student has demonstrated financial need as defined in RCW25 28B.92.030; and

26 (e) The student must not qualify for federally funded student 27 financial aid because of their immigration status.

(2) Determination of a student's eligibility for the Washington dream act service incentive grant program under this chapter shall be made by the office of student financial aid of the institution of higher education in which the student is enrolled or in which they have indicated that they will attend.

33 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 4. (1) In order for community or volunteer 34 service performed by a participating student to be eligible for this 35 program, the organization or institution must:

- 36 (a) Register with the office; and
- 37 (b) Be one of the following:
- 38 (i) A federal, state, or local governmental entity;

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(ii) An institution of higher education located in the state of
 Washington;

3 (iii) An organization exempt from federal income tax under 4 section 501(c)(3) of the federal internal revenue code;

5 (iv) A private sector for-profit business entity producing a good 6 or providing a service for sale or resale to others, which can and 7 agrees to provide hours of service for eligible students of a 8 demonstratable benefit related to the student's postsecondary 9 educational pursuits and which conducts business within the state of 10 Washington; or

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(v) Any other entity approved by the office.

12 (2) The following types of institutions, organizations, or13 entities are not eligible to participate:

(a) Any institution, organization, or entity directing students
to perform service in positions that directly involve religious
worship, exercise, or instruction;

(b) Any institution, organization, or entity directing students to perform service in positions that directly involve political activity, including partisan and nonpartisan political activity;

20 (c) Any institution, organization, or entity which does not 21 comply with appropriate federal, state, and civil rights laws; and

(d) Any institution, organization, or entity in which a participating student is an owner, part owner, board member, or executive.

(3) An approved institution, organization, or entity must report the service hours of the participating students according to the process established by the office.

28 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 5. The office may adopt rules necessary for 29 the effective and efficient implementation of this act.

30 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 6. Sections 1 through 5 of this act 31 constitute a new chapter in Title 28B RCW.

32 <u>NEW SECTION.</u> Sec. 7. If specific funding for the purposes of 33 this act, referencing this act by bill or chapter number, is not 34 provided by June 30, 2025, in the omnibus appropriations act, this 35 act is null and void.

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
